

Dated 16 day of Feb. 19	82
Between Steve Mc Qellan / 1 st Ave.	hereinafter refferred to as the
management and MEDIUM MEDIUM as the artist.	hereinafter referred to

- 1 This rider forms an integral part of the contract thus being legal and binding to both parties. Any contract returned with the rider unattached, unsigned or altered without prior consent from the Artist will be deemed null and void. This could be considered reason for immediate cancellation.
- 2 Provision should be made for the Artistes to have one hour and a half sound-check to be arranged with the tour manager four hours before show time. The management takes to ensure that no members of the public will be admitted to any part of the venue until artist has completed his soundcheck.
- The management agrees to supply a lockable dressing room for the sole use of the artist. Such dressing rooms to have direct acces to the stage, hot and cold running water, a clean towel for each member of the tour party and a mirror. There shall also be toilet facilities backstage for the use of the artist. The key to the dressing room should be presented to the roadmanager at the arrival of the artist.
- 4 The management agrees that in the case of the artist being paid a percentage of the door takings then the artist's representative must be allowed to inspect all ticket stubs (or whatever system the management uses in determining door takings) during and after the performance.
- The management agrees to ensure that no persons other than those approved by the tour manager will at any time be allowed on stage or in the backstage area. No backstage passes may be issued without the tour manager or artist's approval.
- 6 The management agrees to provide the artist with free tickets or passes on request.
- 7 The artist to have the right of approval of all acts on show.
- 8 Management agrees that the artist shall have complete control over all in-house music between acts, before and after the show for the duration of the engagement.
- 9 The manager to ensure that no part of the artist's performance is recorded either visually or aurally without prior written consent of the artist's management.
- 10 The management agrees to supply and return with this rider a small road map or situation sketch of the Venue and how it can be reached.
- It is agreed and understood that in the event of the venue referred to in this contract being closed in consequence of any Royal Demise, epidemic, fire or act of God, no claim shall be made against the management in respect of non-fullfillment and conversely no relary will be payable in respect of ill health of the artist or any one of them.

Minimum PA requirements including lighting The manager agrees to provide at his sole expense for the use of the Artist, a professional PA system. The following is a minimum specification.

Main desk: 16 channels

Monitor: seperate monitor mix on stage

Delay: Roland chorus echo RE 501 or Roland Space Echo

Recorder: Professional quality Playback/Record cassette player with connecting leads to mixing desk. MXR Flanger/Doubler

Main system: 4 KW rig+depending on the size of the hall. care should be taken to have a more than average power handling capacity at the low end. Three-way crossover minimum.

Monitor: on stage mix

4 floor wedges 100 W each or 3 floor wedges and two sidefills.

A sufficient drum monitor stack

Mics: 3 direct injection boxes

1 AKG D12 Bass drum mike 4 shure SM50 microphones & Stands

5 other professional

Drum micro; hones

Stage dimensions: a flat complete stage of solid construction of minimum dimensions of 30' wide, 20' deep and 3' high with seperate wings for PA and a minimum overhead of 10'.

Drum riser: a carpetted drum riser with minimum dimensions of 8' x 8'.

Lights: an adequate lightning rig should be provided. The power source should be fed from a seperate phase, as to not interfere with the PA.

Minimum requirements are: 15 Spots

MEDIUM MEDIUM BIOGRAPHY

MEDIUM MEDIUM go further than funk. Their music is throbbing, oozing, searing zen funk. MEDIUM MEDIUM make dance music for the mind and body, their hearts are full of soul. From the instant they start to play, you know something is happening. Great slabs of tormented lust and starburst blasts of horns and guitars; rhythm-riveted soundscapes, all with a certain glow of passion. Wild and sensual.

MEDIUM MEDIUM are: Andy Ryder, guitar and vocals; Allan Turton, bass; Steve Harvey, drums; Graham Spink, sound, effects, magic. (While Graham does not appear on stage, he is a crucial and integral member of the band. The same holds true for Chris Carland, aka the "Zen Gangster," who handles the band's management affairs.)

MEDIUM MEDIUM are from Nottingham, England. The band formed approximately four years ago, and very soon afterwards, in November of 1978, released a single ("Them Or Me") on Apt Records of London. After touring with other bands such as the Au Pairs, U2 and ASWAD, they went on to building a large and very devoted following all across Continental Europe, particularly Belgium and Holland. In the Spring of 1979, MEDIUM MEDIUM appeared on a compilation album entitled <u>Hicks From the Sticks</u> (Rockburgh Records), and continued to steadily build up their audience through their live performances. At the close of 1980 they were signed to the successful and innovative British independent label, Cherry Red Records, and the first single recorded for Cherry Red, "Hungry So Angry," was a huge success everywhere, especially in Europe and in dance clubs all across America. (The single was a Top 50 <u>Billboard</u> Disco Chart hit for many weeks running.)

The demand for "Hungry So Angry" became so great that the record was released by New York's Cachalot Records in the summer of 1981. A few months later, MEDIUM MEDIUM's first album The Glitterhouse was released by Cherry Red in the U.K.,

Cachalot in the U.S., Intercord in Germany and Sound Product in Holland. The Glitterhouse quickly received much critical acclaim in the U.S., the U.K. and all throughout Continental Europe, where the influence of their abstract mutant sub funk is presently being felt the most, but is spreading rapidly.

MEDIUM MEDIUM completed their first and highly successful tour of the East Coast after The Clitterhouse was released, and have just returned for a major tour and to begin recording their second album in New York City. The release of a new 12" EP is imminent.

Those who haven't heard MEDIUM MEDIUM are in for something special. This is music from the soul for anyone who can move.
