- (d) This contract, and all arbitration proceedings conducted hereunder, shall be governed by and enforced under the laws of the State of New York notwithstanding the forum or jurisdiction in which an action concerning this contract may be brought. All arbitration proceedings conducted hereunder by the IEB shall be conducted according to the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the IEB which may from time to time be in effect. All arbitration proceedings conducted by the Local Union shall be conducted according to Rules adopted by the Local Union. A copy of the IEB Rules of Practice and Procedure may be obtained from the Secretary of the Federation in New York City, New York. A copy of the Rules of the Local Union may be obtained from the Secretary of the Local Union. All rulings and awards made by the IEB in arbitration hereunder shall be final and binding upon the Purchaser and participating musician(s).
- (e) Except awards of the IEB made on appeal as provided in (f) below, a Purchaser or participating musician, or the agent of any participating musician, may bring an action to confirm or to reduce to judgment an arbitration award of the IEB only in the courts of the State of New York; and the Purchaser and participating musician(s) agree to submit to the jurisdiction of the appropriate courts of the State of New York for that purpose. Should a court of competent jurisdiction in New York confirm or enter judgment upon an award of the IEB, the Purchaser and participating musician(s) expressly agree that the prevailing party in the arbitration award shall be additionally entitled to judgment for reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in enforcing the award in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the award plus court costs therefor. A judgment confirming an IEB arbitration award, for attorneys' fees, and for costs may be enforced in the courts of any jurisdiction in which a party to this contract either resides or maintains an office or place of business.
- (f) All rulings and awards made by the Local Union in arbitration hereunder may be appealed to the IEB by any party who was a participant therein. Appeals from such proceedings shall be perfected in the manner provided in the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the IEB. All rulings and awards made by the Local Union in arbitration which are not appealed to the IEB shall be final and binding upon the Purchaser and participating musician(s). Any party to an arbitration proceeding before the Local

Union or to an arbitration appeal to the IEB may bring an action to confirm or enforce a final determination and award of the Local Union or, if appealed, of the IEB in the courts of the jurisdiction in which the office of the Local Union is located; and the Purchaser and participating musician(s) agree to submit to the jurisdiction of such court or courts for that purpose. Should a court of competent jurisdiction of the jurisdiction in which the office of the Local Union is located confirm or enter judgment upon an award of the Local Union, or of the IEB made on appeal, the Purchaser and participating musician(s) expressly agree that the prevailing party in the arbitration award shall be additionally entitled to judgment for reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in enforcing the award in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the award plus court costs therefor.

(g) Notices, materials, papers or process which may be required to notify a Purchaser or participating musician(s) of the pendency of a claim or dispute or to initiate a court action to confirm, enter judgment upon, or enforce an arbitration award rendered by the IEB or the Local Union Executive Board, shall be served on the Purchaser and/or participating musician(s) by certified mail, return receipt requested, without necessity of personal service or other form of notice. All other notices, materials, papers or process which may be required to conduct arbitration proceedings under this contract may be served by regular first class mail.

THIS RIDER IS HEREWITH ATTACHED TO AND MADE PART OF THE CONTRACT

DATED Sept 30 1982 BY AND BETWEEN BONDAGE PRODUCTIONS F/S/O

BONNIE HAYES with THE WILD COMBO, (HEREIN REFERRED TO AS "ARTIST")

AND Stephen Mc Cleboan (HEREIN REFERRED TO

AS "PURCHASER").

The following requirements must be fulfilled by the PURCHASER at no cost to the ARTIST. This is to insure the best show possible.

This rider is divided into five sections: (1)BILLING AND PROMOTION (2)PAYMENT (3) TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS (4)CATERING (5)LEGAL REQUIREMENTS (6) STAGE DIAGRAM. PLEASE READ CAREFULLY.

(1) BILLING AND PROMOTION

- (a) The billing for ARTIST shall be as follows:
 - (i). 100% Top "BONNIE HAYES with THE WILD COMBO" (when Headlining)
 - (ii). 75% Special Guest Star (When other than Headlining)
- (b) PURCHASER agrees that he will not sell any products identified with ARTIST at the place of performance or any adjacent place under his control, nor will he license third parties to do so or permit such sale by any third parties without the express agreement of the ARTIST.

(2) PAYMENT

- (a) ARTIST'S fee shall be made payable to BONDAGE PRODUCTIONS in CASH or CERTIFIED CHECK ONLY.
- (b) GUARANTEED PAYMENT shall be made prior to commencement of performance.
- (c) With respect to performances where the ARTIST'S fee is based on a percentage; the following provisions shall be in effect:
 - (i). PURCHASER shall furnish to the ARTIST or their appointed agents no later than ten days before the scheduled performace date, a ticket manifest setting forth the number of tickets to be sold in each category, and all tickets shall be sold accordingly with the prices as stated.
 - (ii). Purchaser shall pay the ARTIST its percentage for every seat occupied within the place of performance except for ten (10) free tickets.

- (iii). A representative of the ARTIST shall have the right to be present in the box office prior to, during and following the performance.
 - (iv). Percentage payments provided for hereunder shall be accompanied by a written statement from the PURCHASER.
 - (v). If tickets are on sale prior to date of performance then a representative of the ARTIST shall have the right to check and agree those sales before the box office opens on the night of the performance. All unsold tickets and ticket stubs to be presented to said representative before doors open. If there are any discrepancies then PURCHASER is liable for payment to the ARTIST in full.

(3) TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

- (a) PURCHASER shall make hall available to ARTIST'S crew not less than five (5) hours prior to opening the house.
- (b) ARTIST will need two (2) hours for set up followed by one (1) hour for Sound Check. Times for the load-in and sound check will be determined by ARTIST'S tour manager. Sound Check will normally be one (1) hour between 5 PM and 6 PM
- (c) ARTIST'S crew includes the following people at all times: sound mixer/engineer, stage technicians, and light console operator. Under no circumstances shall any of the above mentioned people be substituted by the purchaser or any of his/her employees.
- (d) PURCHASER to have a crew of two (2) loaders and two (2) stage hands available at load-in and load-out. To
- (e) PURCHASER to provide adequate parking for two (2) 12 vans and two (2) passenger vehicles. To Downtown
- (f) In the event of a support act being employed, the ARTIST shall have the first right to set up all instruments and equipment to be used in the show and these shall not be move or tampered with in any way by anyone other than the ARTIST'S road crew. The ARTIST shall have the first call on any time available for sound tests and shall be allowed to continue said sound test for up to 15 minutes before the doors open time. The support act does not have any automatic right to a sound test however, every effort shall be made to accomodate a sound test for this act. The decision on the support acts sound test shall rest solely on the ARTIST'S Tour Manager. No opening act soundchecks shall delay the opening of the house. Doors are to be opened only when approved by the Tour Manager.

- (g) The ARTIST reserves the right of approval of any other person to appear in conjunction with this performance and the right to determine the length and nature of their performance. A violation of this clause shall entitle the ARTIST to refuse to furnish the performance described herein but PURCHASER shall remain oblibed to make payments.
- (h) PURCHASER shall guarantee property security at all times, to ensure the safety of the ARTIST, auxiliary personnel, instruments and all equipment, costumes and personal property during and after all the performances. Particular security must be provided in the areas of the dressing rooms, stage, remote mixing console, and all exits and entrances to the auditorium. Security protection to commence upon arrival of ARTIST and ARTIST'S equipment on the premises Any loss or damage to ARTIST'S equipment or personal possessions will be PURCHASER'S responsibility.
- (i) PASSES AND COMPLIMENTRY TICKETS— Upon ARTIST'S arrival, PURCHASER shall present to Tour Manager fifteen (15) backstage passes, and twenty (20) seating tickets, both of the highest priority, with the tickets being at no additional cost to ARTIST.
- (j) DRESSING ROOMS The PURCHASER agrees to provide two (2) properly maintained dressing rooms for the sole use of the ARTIST. The dressing rooms must be lockable and must be equiped with 2 mirrors and 6 chairs. There must also be a 15 AMP outlet in each room and adequate heating. Washing facilities are essential within close proximity to said dressing rooms. Ten (10) clean towels are to be placed in dressing rooms prior to show time.
- (k) No one except working personnel, performers and authorized guests are permitted backstage or in the dressing rooms, before, during or after the performance.
- (1) During the performance on stage, only persons actually employed by the ARTIST are allowed on stage. No unauthorized persons, including spectators, are allowed on the stage and/or the stage area. The stage and its general area will be cleared no less than twenty (20) minutes prior to the beginning of the ARTIST'S performance and immediately after the show to allow the ARTIST and their personnel to exit and clear the stage area of their equipment.
- (n) STAGE The ARTIST requires the stage size to be a minimum of 25 ft. x 15 ft., a minimum of 3 ft. from the ground with room to take a P.A. on either side, of the following dimension of the wide x 6 ft high x 4 ft. deep. Should it not be possible to meet the above requirements, PURCHASER must provide the information of the available sizes to Monterey Peninsula Artists Agency for their prior written approval, prior to any advertising or promotion of a concert or show featuring the name of the ARTIST. It is to be understood

that the ARTIST has the right to concel the engagement if this procedure is not carried out. Also, should the ARTIST arrive and find the stage dimensions not as per this agreement and no written approval for the alternative size, the ARTIST has the right to cancel the engagement.

In addition, PURCHASER shall provide a proper secure drum riser for the ARTIST'S sole usage.

- (o) SOUND PURCHASER to supply and pay for ARTIST'S sole usage a complete P.A. system including:
 - A mixer with a minimum of sixteen (16) mixing channels. Mixer to be of professional quality e.g. Yamaha PM 1000 or Kelsey.

A minimum of twelve (12) microphones and mic stands including at least one RE20 and SM57 and 58's. (ii).

(iii). Two (2) direct boxes.

Two monitor mixes on stage. (iv). Six (6) monitors on stage. (v).

(4) CATERING

- (a) PURCHASER agrees to supply and pay for refreshments to be place in the dressing room at the soundcheck time on the day of the performance comprising of:
 - (i). FOOD One Deli Tray for twelve (12) people (NO PACKAGED One Vegetable tray for twelve (12) MEATS)
 Assorted breads Assorted breads Condiments for above (Mustard, mayo, ketchup, plates, napkins, forks, knives, etc.)

BEVERAGES - One case of beer - bottles only. Four quarts of assorted fruit juices Four quarts of mineral water One gallon spring ...

Six (6) Mixed drinks or drink tickets for ARTIST on stage during show

(10) terry cloth

(iii). TOWELS - PURCHASER to provide ten (10) terry cloth towels for ARTIST'S exclusive use.

(5) LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

NO PORTION OF THE PERFORMANCE RENDERED HEREUNDER MAY BE RECORDED, FILMED, TAPED, BROADCAST OR EMBODIED IN ANY FORM FOR THE PURPOSE OF REPRODUCTION OF SUCH PERFORMANCE, AND THE PURCHASER AGREES THAT IT WILL PREVENT ANY SUCH RECORDING BEING MADE, UNLESS IT HAS EXPRESS WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION OF BONDAGE PRODUCTIONS AND SLASH RECORDS. A violation of this clause shall .

furnish absolute grounds for the ARTIST'S refusal to to perform thereofter and in this event all costs, including the ARTIST'S guaranteed fee and any percentages over-ride due to the ARTIST based on box office sales, shall be born by the PURCHASER.

- (b) In the event of illness, incapacity, appropriate labor restrictions or strikes, or any other event beyond the control of the ARTIST they shall not be required to perform the scheduled enoagement (s) and in that event the ARTIST shall not be liable in any way for the loss of whatsoever kind or nature suffered by the PURCHASER. In the event of riots or civil disorder which could result in the injury to the life or property of any member of the entertainment unit, ARTIST in its judgement shall have the right to concel this contract without liability.
- (c) PLRCHASER understands and agreees that the failure to fulfill any of the provisions of this rider may result in the concellation of one or more performances hereunder at any time without penalty whatsoever to the ARTIST, and without prejudice to all other rights which the ARTIST may have by virtue of such failure.
- (d) In the event that the purchaser claims that the ARI ISI has breached this Agreement (excluding cases of "force majeure"), the limit of any liability for damages chargeable to the ARIISI, individually and collectively, shall be the minimum guaranteed payment, if any, provided for in respect of the performance concerned.
- (e) No alteration of any of the clauses or terms contained herein has any legal standing and serves no constructive purpose unless first agreed by the ARTIST'S representatives. Any such alteration then made must be initialled by both the PURCHASER and the ARTIST.

- 6. No performance on the engagement shall be recorded, reproduced or transmitted from the place of performance, in any manner or by any means whatsoever, in the absence of a specific written agreement with the Federation relating to and permitting such recording, reproduction or transmission. This prohibition shall not be subject to the arbitration provisions set forth in 7 below and the Federation may enforce this prohibition in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 7. Breach of Contract Arbitration of Claims:
 - (a) It is expressly understood by the Purchaser and the musician(s) who are parties to this contract that neither the Federation nor the Local Union are parties to this contract in any capacity except as expressly provided in 6 above and, therefore, that neither the Federation nor the Local Union shall be liable for the performance or breach of any provision hereof.
 - (b) This contract, and the terms and conditions contained herein, may be enforced by the Purchaser and by each musician who is a party to this contract or whose name appears on the contract or who has, in fact, performed the engagement contracted for (herein called "participating musician(s)"), and by the agent or agent(s) of each participating musician, including the Local Union.
 - (c) All claims and disputes which may arise between the Purchaser and the participating musician(s) regarding the application or interpretation of any of the terms or conditions of this contract, including any disputes between the parties as to their respective obligations and responsibilities hereunder, shall be referred exclusively to binding arbitration. If a claim or dispute involves participating musician(s) who are all members of the Local Union, then such claim or dispute shall be referred to the Executive Board of the Local Union. All other claims or disputes arising under this contract between the Purchaser and participating musician(s) shall be referred to the International Executive Board (herein called "IEB") of the Federation for arbitration and determination in New York, New York. The IEB shall decide any question of whether it or the Local Union Executive Board has jurisdiction over a particular claim or dispute.

- (d) This contract, and all arbitration proceedings conducted hereunder, shall be governed by and enforced under the laws of the State of New York notwithstanding the forum or jurisdiction in which an action concerning this contract may be brought. All arbitration proceedings conducted hereunder by the IEB shall be conducted according to the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the IEB which may from time to time be in effect. All arbitration proceedings conducted by the Local Union shall be conducted according to Rules adopted by the Local Union. A copy of the IEB Rules of Practice and Procedure may be obtained from the Secretary-Treasurer of the Federation in New York City, New York. A copy of the Rules of the Local Union may be obtained from the Secretary of the Local Union. All rulings and awards made by the IEB in arbitration hereunder shall be final and binding upon the Purchaser and participating musician(s).
- (e) Except awards of the IEB made on appeal as provided in (f) below, a Purchaser or participating musician, or the agent of any participating musician, may bring an action to confirm or to reduce to judgment an arbitration award of the IEB only in the courts of the State of New York; and the Purchaser and participating musician(s) agree to submit to the jurisdiction of the appropriate courts of the State of New York for that purpose. Should a court of competent jurisdiction in New York confirm or enter judgment upon an award of the IEB, the Purchaser and participating musician(s) expressly agree that the prevailing party in the arbitration award shall be additionally entitled to judgment for reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in enforcing the award in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the award plus court costs therefor. A judgment confirming an IEB arbitration award, for attorneys' fees, and for costs may be enforced in the courts of any jurisdiction in which a party to this contract either resides or maintains an office or place of business.
- (f) All rulings and awards made by the Local Union in arbitration hereunder may be appealed to the IEB by any party who was a participant therein. Appeals from such proceedings shall be perfected in the manner provided in the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the IEB. All rulings and awards made by the Local Union in arbitration which are not appealed to the IEB shall be final and binding upon the Purchaser and participating musician(s). Any party to an arbitration proceeding before the Local

Union or to an arbitration appeal to the IEB may bring an action to confirm or enforce a final determination and award of the Local Union or, if appealed, of the IEB in the courts of the jurisdiction in which the office of the Local Union is located; and the Purchaser and participating musician(s) agree to submit to the jurisdiction of such court or courts for that purpose. Should a court of competent jurisdiction of the jurisdiction in which the office of the Local Union is located confirm or enter judgment upon an award of the Local Union, or of the IEB made on appeal, the Purchaser and participating musician(s) expressly agree that the prevailing party in the arbitration award shall be additionally entitled to judgment for reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in enforcing the award in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the award plus court costs therefor.

(g) Notices, materials, papers or process which may be required to notify a Purchaser or participating musician(s) of the pendency of a claim or dispute or to initiate a court action to confirm, enter judgment upon, or enforce an arbitration award rendered by the IEB or the Local Union Executive Board, shall be served on the Purchaser and/or participating musician(s) by certified mail, return receipt requested, without necessity of personal service or other form of notice. All other notices, materials, papers or process which may be required to conduct arbitration proceedings under this contract may be served by regular first class mail.

DATED Sept 30/982 BY AND BETWEEN BONDAGE PRODUCTIONS F/S/O

BONNIE HAYES with THE WILD COMBO, (HEREIN REFERRED TO AS "ARTIST")

AND Stephen McClolan (HEREIN REFERRED TO

AS "PURCHASER").

The following requirements must be fulfilled by the PURCHASER at no cost to the ARTIST. This is to insure the best show possible.

This rider is divided into five sections: (1)BILLING AND PROMOTION (2)PAYMENT (3)TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS (4)CATERING (5)LEGAL REQUIREMENTS (6) STAGE DIAGRAM. PLEASE READ CAREFULLY.

(1) BILLING AND PROMOTION

- (a) The billing for ARTIST shall be as follows:
 - (i). 100% Top "BONNIE HAYES with THE WILD COMBO" (when Headlining)
 - (ii). 75% Special Guest Star (When other than Headlining)
- (b) PURCHASER agrees that he will not sell any products identified with ARTIST at the place of performance or any adjacent place under his control, nor will he license third parties to do so or permit such sale by any third parties without the express agreement of the ARTIST.

(2) PAYMENT

- (a) ARTIST'S fee shall be made payable to BONDAGE PRODUCTIONS in CASH or CERTIFIED CHECK ONLY.
- (b) GUARANTEED PAYMENT shall be made prior to commencement of performance.
- (c) With respect to performances where the ARTIST'S fee is based on a percentage; the following provisions shall be in effect:
 - (i). PURCHASER shall furnish to the ARTIST or their appointed agents no later than ten days before the scheduled performace date, a ticket manifest setting forth the number of tickets to be sold in each category, and all tickets shall be sold accordingly with the prices as stated.
 - (ii). Purchaser shall pay the ARTIST its percentage for every seat occupied within the place of performance except for ten (10) free tickets.

- (iii). A representative of the ARTIST shall have the right to be present in the box office prior to, during and following the performance.
 - (iv). Percentage payments provided for hereunder shall be accompanied by a written statement from the PURCHASER.
 - (v). If tickets are on sale prior to date of performance then a representative of the ARTIST shall have the right to check and agree those sales before the box office opens on the night of the performance. All unsold tickets and ticket stubs to be presented to said representative before doors open. If there are any discrepancies then PURCHASER is liable for payment to the ARTIST in full.

(3) TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

- (a) PURCHASER shall make hall available to ARTIST'S crew not less than five (5) hours prior to opening the house.
- (b) ARTIST will need two (2) hours for set up followed by one (1) hour for Sound Check. Times for the load-in and sound check will be determined by ARTIST'S tour manager. Sound Check will normally be one (1) hour between 5 PM and 6 PM
- (c) ARTIST'S crew includes the following people at all times: sound mixer/engineer, stage technicians, and light console operator. Under no circumstances shall any of the above mentioned people be substituted by the purchaser or any of his/her employees.
- (d) PURCHASER to have a crew of two (2) loaders and two (2) stage hands available at load-in and load-out.
- (e) PURCHASER to provide adequate parking for two (2) 12' vans and two (2) passenger vehicles.
- (f) In the event of a support act being employed, the ARTISI shall have the first right to set up all instruments and equipment to be used in the show and these shall not be move or tampered with in any way by anyone other than the ARTIST'S road crew. The ARTIST shall have the first call on any time available for sound tests and shall be allowed to continue said sound test for up to 15 minutes before the doors open time. The support act does not have any automatic right to a sound test however, every effort shall be made to accomodate a sound test for this act. The desision on the support acts sound test shall rest solely on the ARTIST'S Tour Manager. No opening act soundchecks shall delay the opening of the house. Doors are to be opened only when approved by the Tour Manager.

- (g) The ARTIST reserves the right of approval of any other person to appear in conjunction with this performance and the right to determine the length and nature of their performance. A violation of this clause shall entitle the ARTIST to refuse to furnish the performance described herein but PURCHASER shall remain oblibed to make payments.
- (h) PURCHASER shall guarantee property security at all times, to ensure the safety of the ARTIST, auxiliary personnel, instruments and all equipment, costumes and personal property during and after all the performances. Particular security must be provided in the areas of the dressing rooms, stage, remote mixing console, and all exits and entrances to the auditorium. Security protection to commence upon arrival of ARTIST and ARTIST'S equipment on the premises Any loss or damage to ARTIST'S equipment or personal possessions will be PURCHASER'S responsibility.
- (i) PASSES AND COMPLIMENTRY TICKETS— Upon ARTIST'S arrival, PURCHASER shall present to Tour Manager fifteen (15) backstage passes, and twenty (20) seating tickets, both of the highest priority, with the tickets being at no additional cost to ARTIST.
- (j) DRESSING ROOMS The PURCHASER agrees to provide two (2) properly maintained dressing rooms for the sole use of the ARTIST. The dressing rooms must be lockable and must be equiped with 2 mirrors and 6 chairs. There must also be a 15 AMP outlet in each room and adequate heating. Washing facilities are essential within close proximity to said dressing rooms. Ten (10) clean towels are to be placed in dressing rooms prior to show time.
- (k) No one except working personnel, performers and authorized guests are permitted backstage or in the dressing rooms, before, during or after the performance.
- (1) During the performance on stage, only persons actually employed by the ARTIST are allowed on stage. No unauthorized persons, including spectators, are allowed on the stage and/or the stage area. The stage and its general area will be cleared no less than twenty (20) minutes prior to the beginning of the ARTIST'S performance and immediately after the show to allow the ARTIST and their personnel to exit and clear the stage area of their equipment
- (n) STAGE The ARTIST requires the stage size to be a minimum of 25 ft. x 15 ft., a miminum of 3 ft. from the ground with room to take a P.A. on either side, of the following dimension of the wide x 6 ft high x 4 ft. deep. Should it not be possible to meet the above requirements, PURCHASER must provide the information of the available sizes to Monterey Peninsula Artists Agency for their prior written approval, prior to any advertising or promotion of a concert or show featuring the name of the ARTIST. - (b) In the event of illness, incapacity, appropriate labor restrictions or strikes, or any other event beyond the control of the ARTIST they shall not be required to perform the scheduled encagement (s) and in that event the ARTIST shall not be liable in any way for the loss of whatsoever kind or nature suffered by the PURCHASER. In the event of riots or civil disorder which could result in the injury to the life or property of any member of the entertainment unit, ARTIST in its judgement shall have the right to concel this contract without liability.
- (c) PURC-ASER understands and agrees that the failure to fulfill any of the provisions of this rider may result in the cancellation of one or more performances hereunder at any time without penalty whatscever to the ARTIST, and without prejudice to all other rights which the ARTIST may have by virtue of such failure.
- (d) In the event that the purchaser claims that the ARIISI has breached this Agreement (excluding cases of "force majeure"), the limit of any liability for damages chargeable to the ARIIST, individually and collectively, shall be the minimum guaranteed payment, if any, provided for in respect of the performance concerned.
- (e) No alteration of any of the clauses or terms contained herein has any legal standing and serves no constructive purpose unless first agreed by the ARTIST'S representatives. Any such alteration then made must be initialled by both the PURCHASER and the ARTIST.


