- Artist shall receive 100% star billing in any and all publicity 1. released and paid advertisements, including but not limited to program, fliers, signs and marquees.
- The correct billing for Artist applicable in all promotional 2. materials is: Lydia Lunch
- 3. In the event that compensation payable to Artist hereunder is measured in whole or part by a percentage of receipts, Artist shall have the right to set a limit to the number of free admissions authorized by Employer. If the Employer is unable to accurately determine the number of persons admitted free, the Employer agrees to accept as binding a reasonable estimate made by the Artist's representative. Further, employer agrees that at no time will the number of free admissions, i.e. house quests, employee quests, press and quests of the band to be in excess of
- Employer agrees to provide at his sole cost and expense a professional concert-quality sound system with minimum requirements as follows: (a) 4 professional quality microphones with full stands and direct input box (2 vocal mics with straight stands and round bottom); (b) first class monitor speaker systems (200 watts); (c) a first class P.A. system; (d) a minimum 16 channel input and 2 channel output mixing console with individual EQ.
  (e) a cassette player to the PA
  It is agreed that Employer shall provide a stage lighting system.

- 6. Artist must have approval of any support acts that the employer engages.
- 7. Employer agrees to provide a comfortable and private dressing room adequate for use by persons during the Artist's entire This room shall be clean, dry, well lit, heated or air conditioned, shall have mirrors and contain at least 6 chairs or comfortable seating for persons and shall be within easy access to clean lavatories. Employer shall be solely responsible

for the security of items in the dressing area and shall keep all unauthorized persons from entering said area.

Employer will provide lamps for the dressing room instead of flourescent lights.

8. Employer will provide the Artist (including all sidepeople) with

a hot meal for two people, fruit and cheese platter in the dressing room, two bottles of champagne, beer, juices and mineral water before the set.

Employer further agrees that there will be on hand a minimum of clean towels.

- 9. Artist has full control of his performance.
- 10. There will be absolutely no tape recordings, video recording, radio broadcasts during the performance unless prior written permission is granted by Artist or his Representative. All cassette recorders or other unauthorized taping equipment will be confiscated by Employer and held until completion of performance.
- 11. There will be no flash photography of Artist without prior written permission from Artist or his Representative during the musical performance.
- 12. ALL MONIES DUE AND PAYABLE TO ARTIST SHALL BE PAID IN CASH TO:
- 13. Employer must be at the concert hall or club <u>2</u> hour(s) before the door opens and remain until all requirements of the Contract and Rider are fulfilled.
- 14. Time shall be provided for a Soundcheck at the request of the Artist.
- In case of any conflict of terms, the terms contained in this
