Dear Rotsie" (Little Fallon MMM) I have never been in your fair town but you would be surprized at what I know about it. at the present time wittle Italls has less than a fifth of the population of Morrison County which has, according to 1930 census, 25,442. Little Halls has 5014 people. It is the County Seat of Morrison Happelal County. It had a population of 5500 in 1920. It is 97 miles northwest of menneapolis on the mississippi rue. It is 94 miles by express from the same place. It is 33 miles from St. Cloud and 140 miles from Duluth. Rittle Falls has two Hospitals, one of which I believe is Catholic: It Sabriel's Hospital and Dr Halls Hospital. Citte Talls has a post office, a Western Union Telegraph office, a Railroway Express office, and an airport. It is considered a Bonking town. as to transportation it is served by the Morthern Pacific Railroad and U.S rout 10N which is paved south of town and gravel north. It was settled in 1850 and chartered as a city in 1889. Colonel Charles a. Rindbergh was born there and graduated from Higheschool there in 1918. your town has a hydro-electric plant, creameries, flour mills, other industries and grante avarries near by but no florish as far as I could find out What else is interesting about the town besides the fact that it has a couple of movies?


