## - JUST THE JOY OF IT



most people enjoy their thrills and spills vicariously. Be it bridge, backgammon, baseball, boxing, or bartering, the kibitzers, looker-ons, sight-seers, and soft-palmed spectators are in the majority. Not infrequently they inject themselves into the game with ungallant gab-

ble, penetrating gazes, craven epithets, or even vacuous though potent pop-bottles. But on the whole they stand stolidly if not stoically on the side-lines, or they sit expectantly and hopefully anticipating the display of another's daring, cleverness, or stupidity, or they lie languidly lapping up page after page of palaver to feed their fondled imaginations. And thus they would recreate their rut-ruined ratio-cinations, stimulate their flaggy feelings into flatulent self-sufficiency, all in order to glut their desperate desire for excitement.

Hiking should be a better way of bolstering body, mind, and spirit. And it is. But an unimaginative dictionary defines it as marching laboriously. Almost everybody swears by the cloistered and fanciless lexicographer; and those who seek recreation suffer it to exist as the zero of sports. Yet once it gets under your skin and into your blood you are rivetted to its healthful hardiness, welded to its wearying wanderings, wedded to its cloying exclusiveness, and forever joyed at its limitless and unanticipated possibilities.

Not that mere walking is not as jading, wearing, and sordidly simple as pasting labels on bulging bottles filled with carminative concoctions. Not that a languid stroll is not as enervating and wearisome as listening to the sappy sermon of a theological student, or the raucous and monotonous

reverberations of a street hawker. Not that organized parading and militant marching are not as fatiguing as following the utilitarian plow or restraining the muzzled and leashed dog. For these necessary and unnecessary occupations for listless legs are as related to wholesome hiking as automobile tires are to caoutchouc.

Our hobby is hiking as yours is motoring, stamp collecting, golfing, fishing, swimming, travelling, nudism, gardening, dancing, gossiping, poetizing, speeding, sailing, card-playing, proselyting, money-making, or what have you? Trudging along a steep trail, nearing the shelter for the night, we often wonder that these choice bypaths within easy reach of millions of leg-equipped humans are as isolated as a pent-house's promenade. And if we believed that our enthusiasm for the old and abandoned wagon roads, the new and alluring mountain trails, the crude and unspoiled natural phenomena, the coarse and simple manner of living in the open — if we suspected that by telling about our hobby and heartsease it would be interfered with by the unkind conversion of thousands to our way of doing, we would guard our secret joy with the silence of a mummy.

Lest you feel the lure of following us up jagged precipices or down unending slopes through scented paths covered with soft and sere pine-needles, may we urge you to reflect over and over again before you make our experience your very own.
