I do hope you received my letter written 2 days ago. It was sent Air Mail but with the heavy snow La Guardia Field may not have functioned.

Have not heard whether Al & Baba arrived - I worried a good deal about him and Jody Wied he was probably frozen en route or starved - but I had Mr Ettinger with the Express Co. He said not to worry for they had to give any animal perfect care and I wrote directions attached to the truck to keep water & milk when he could get it Chicago and also had a jar filled with salmon - Another with milk & egg beaten up - I fed him at 4 P.M. Saturday - We are certainly through with the Shyloos for if she had wanted me to hold him a few days more she could have answered my wire which I sent ~~Sat~~ Friday A.M. but she said my wire was to vague & understood. I have it and is right to the point - I didn't say what time he would arrive but I sent another that night before I sent it telling them - Probably due to the snow the express didn't take him out Sunday - If so they fed him so that's that - You surely did

all anyone could do for the cat while you had him. I really think you did more than they did for him. You can write a marvellous short story about the cat.

Poor Alice is having an awful time with her ankle - she had an XRay yesterday but no bones are broken. Dr. Faint has had her wrap it up in an elastic bandage. I imagine it is very like yours was at Carnegie Hall. Am going up to Mr. Aunt Ida - she is looking & feeling better - they have taken the long bar her foot were strapped to off so she can wiggle her toes -

This is a cold dreary day - I have listened to your notes and how I do miss my Lottie and hearing the Victrola - Am eager to hear whether you met Lotifka Sunday - and how she says - Several have wanted your address - Betty Berg was very disappointed not to see you but she said she didn't realize you were leaving so soon -

Your Mamma loves you so and how very sorry I am that I made you feel so upset. Daddy says it's the time of year - we are under frightful pressure for the world is turning so fast right now or some thing to that effect - The Vitamins Dr. Faint has given me in liquid form has made me feel so much better - So when I lie down I keep saying "My precious Lottie How I do love her" & in the night too - you will never know what you have to your own babies how much I adore you - How I wish I could go

to you right this minute — but if I sleep
or fall that would be the last of me — but if

Florida or let me go — We will be together then —

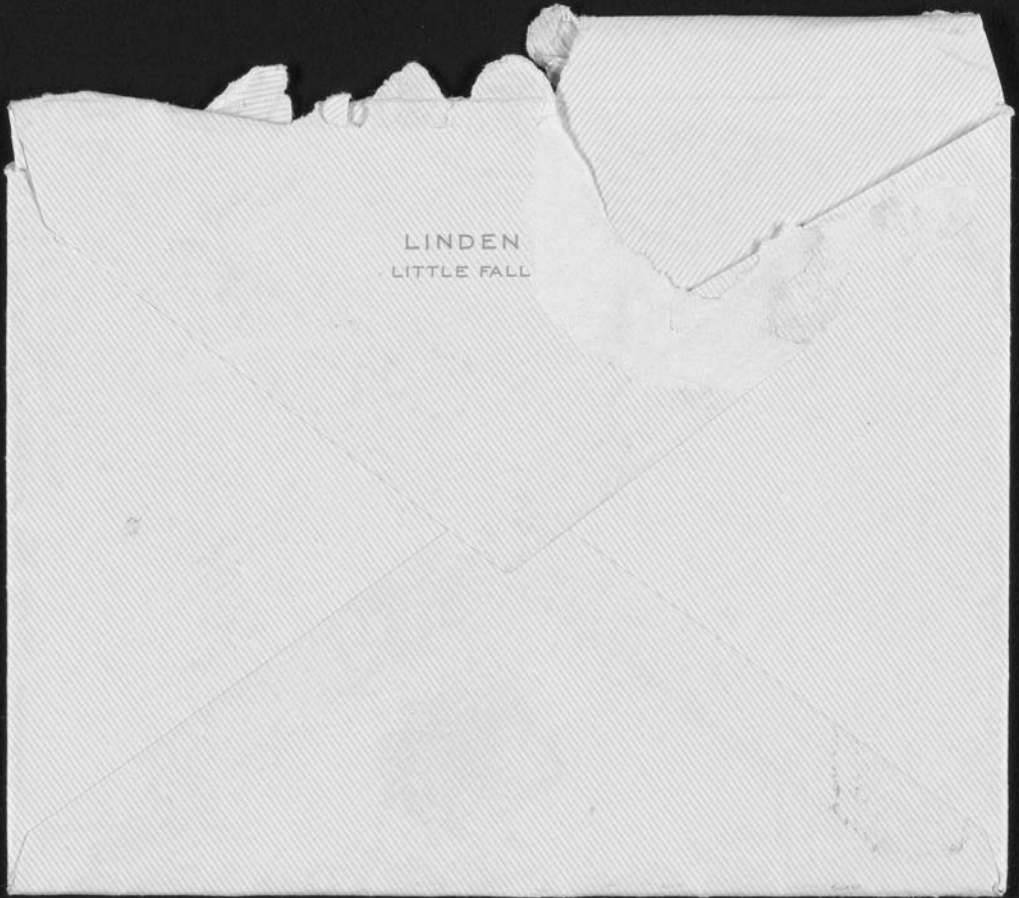
