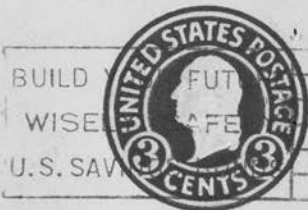

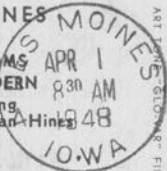

taken over so lovingly in my place & made the children
of my heart - I know she sang wonderfully in Church
especially since your darling smiling face was there
to greet her and trust she managed to clump down
those choir stairs with out falling in her eagerness to see you.

Mr. Daddy & I went to Church and had to sit in the front
row nearly - Ben Smoots wasn't there but Adelheid played
them home - Mr. and Mrs. Patience for dinner and
had a most interesting visit afterwards - I think it did
them both good to come as it did us - they were delicious!

They left about 4:30 P.M. I rested and worked on my book
Report so long I was weary - Then before we went to bed
Alice fixed our oranges for us but Miss made me sick
so that I had a wretched night - Had to wait some time

Metropolitan Opera"! I kept thinking it was last night
but you said yesterday it will be tonight - Alice kept
pondering how much your new "Bread Basket Covers" you
got into your black silk dress! Have you talked
to Vittorio yet? and when is Ossolinea?
I shall be eager to hear about Cathella and did Tiffy
sing? Mrs Herbert was so disappointed you wouldn't

be here for your Square Tomorrow 3m. How long will
the hotel let you stay this time - M. will probably leave
