I wish to acknowledge receipt of report of loss of various articles totalling \$23.10, and I am sorry about same.

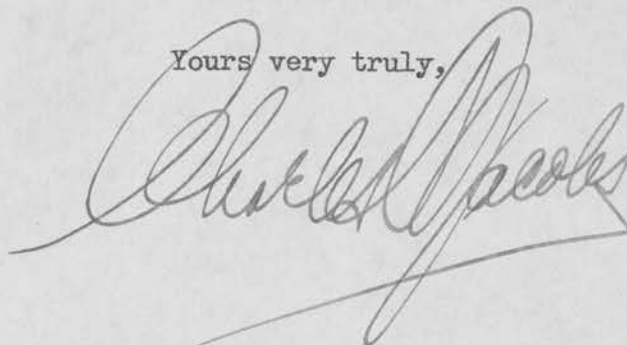
