

Sam is still at a Camp and Roger is taking care of him, so it would be too bad if the children are going to be separated, as it may be. We are all quite excited about little Timmie, for he appeared to be upset about something and Dr. Morrow said that he had some trouble with his teeth and with what he had been eating. So we have cut out everything and he is not to have anything to eat but what the doctor has prescribed. No sweets or things that would upset him. Pauline, Olga and Marjorie are getting along the same old way. Life is going on in its routine way. Your friends wonder when you are coming home and they seem glad that you are having a nice trip with such a nice companion as Marie's and Stanley's daughter evidently is with you. The same amount of work is going on at the Green House and the filling up of the lower garden near our garage as was going on when you were here. From reports of the great damage that was done to Waterbury, it may be that some of the places that you have been, have been badly damaged. I had a letter from Cousin Cliff in which he told about some of the good times we used to have together as children, and I was amazed that he had such a marvelous memory to recall so many events. We used to live within three doors of where Cousin Cliff and his Mother and Father lived. I expected George Schaust to come up and spend the morning with me on his way to Brainerd, but we have no intentions of going to Cross Lake or doing much any place else. We are going to have a real cold spell tomorrow, although today is nice. It won't be long before youwill return and we will be looking for you and anxious to learn what kind of a time you had withyour friends in New York and with Margaret and others you are planning on seeing.
