I guess I had better quit before this turns into a book. Write when you

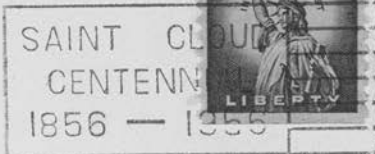

THE PARSONAGE

The parsonage is a well-built, 2½ story frame home, built in 1915, but well maintained. It has four bedrooms and bath upstairs; with a study, living room, dining room and kitchen downstairs. There is a large sun porch on the south side, plus an attic and a full basement. The home is heated by a stoker fed, hot water heating plant. Electric stove and refrigerator are furnished. There is a detached garage at the rear. The parsonage is located adjacent to the church.

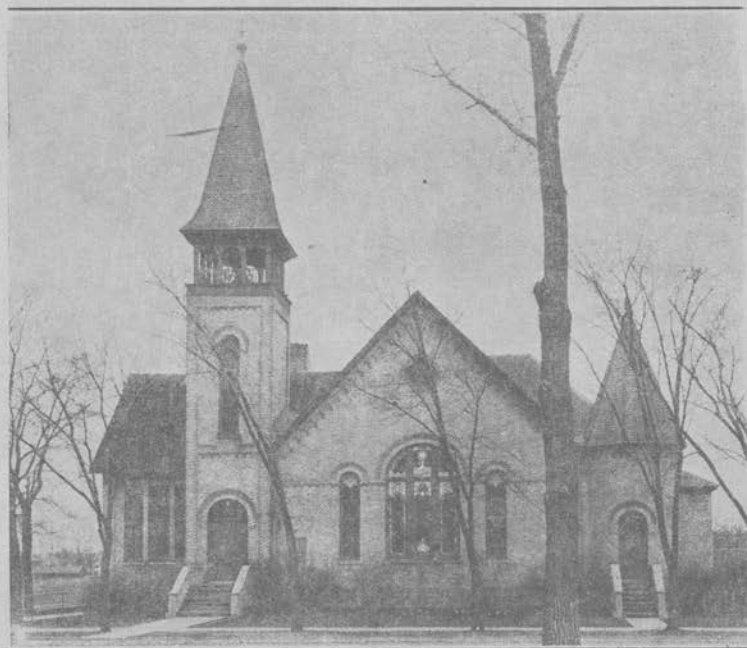
MINISTER'S COMPENSATION

Finances of this church permit paying a salary attractive to an able leader. Rather than seek a minister at a given salary level, the pastoral committee hopes first to find the man they believe can develop the potential of this church to a high degree with the wholehearted support of its members. Understanding and backing has developed, through discussion with the combined church boards, to the end that salary negotiations need not be an obstacle.

In addition to his salary, the minister will receive a car allowance of \$500.00 per year, the parsonage and garage, rent free. Heat and utilities are paid by the minister. The church at present pays 8% of the minister's annuity, but favorable consideration of a proposed increase to 11% seems to be developing here.

Vacation allowance is one month, with pay.

Little Falls, a city of 7500 people, is situated in almost the exact geographical center of the state of Minnesota. It straddles the Mississippi river at the edge of Minnesota's famed 10,000 lakes recreational area—in what the outdoor minded family would call "great country".

Little Falls has a variety of diversified, small industry, and it is a county seat and the trading center of a county which rates near the top in dairying. People who live here enjoy fine schools, an excellent hospital, and two lovely wilderness state parks. But most important, a progressive outlook makes Little Falls one of the bright spots in a state with a bright future.

The First Congregational Church of Little Falls is 98 years young. Since its founding in 1859 it has consistently been a community leader through the application of democratic ways in harmony with the American pattern.

Traditionally, ours is a busy church. It has experienced both highs and lows in total membership and in the scope of its activities. In the considered opinion of our present membership, this church stands on the threshold of a new era of growth and service.

It has all the requisites—save one. It is rich in tradition, yet unfettered by it. It has a wealth of dedicated, hard working members. There is youth to be served here. It enjoys the respect and cooperation of the community in which it stands. It is not saddled with debt. It has physical facilities, which, with proper modification, could make it the leading Protestant Christian educational center in Little Falls. It needs only a leader who can work with its people to weld these factors into a program of accomplishment.
