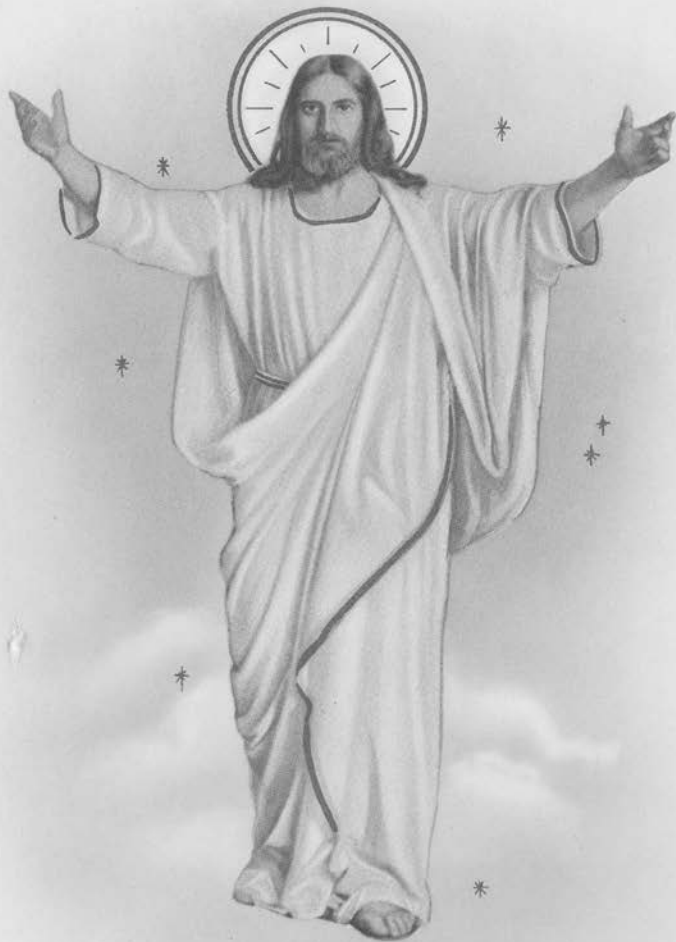

Roosevelt New deal

This was sent to Mr. Truman and my depression buster

President Roosevelt New deal came out N.R.A. The first N.R.A. to destroy part of your crop. The next year I make every one sign up. (going under dictatorships) I did not sign up going to put me on the Carpet, six month in jail, ha ha, trick hafta feed the eight there

The high Court pronounced that unconstitutional

Senator Cappers paper stated later in Missouri the average families signed up to destroy received \$64.50 they should been ashamed to send out them small checks for a family to live on all winter. Then came the bank moratorium closing all banks. paid 7 to 15 per cent on depositors money

Senator Cappers paper read the defuncted banker could take one half of the depositors money, deposit it in Federal Reserve bank draw 4 1/2% interest

No wonder Harry Hopkins said the people are to dumb to understand any way, Is it any wonder they set up relief stations they robbed the people in Missouri.

The High Courts stoped that dictatorship

But I told my friends it would come back under a New Name

I hear now the New Name is out now. The New frontier 1963
