To The President and Board of Directors,

The Duluth and Iron Range Rail Road Company.

Gentlemen: -

In submitting the foregoing report of the Land Department of The Duluth and Iron Range Rail Road Company for the year 1909, I would submit a few words of explanation.

First the selection of lands for filling the land grant is now nearly completed. The unpatented lands deeded to the Rail Road Company amounts to 2,120.54 and will probably be released to the State and lieu selections made in the place of them. Certain acreages unpatented and not deeded will undoubtedly be released and new selections made. It is probable that these selection rights can be sold at about \$15.00 per acre. The unpatented acres under contract for sale, all sold subject to perfecting title, have practically all been cleared up since January 1st, 1910 and deeds issued to the various purchasers.

The Land Department is now in a position to check up with the State the entire acreage of the land grant and will then make the selections necessary to completely fill the grant.

The acreage sales for the year are low, but can be increased materially as soon as a definite policy for inducing settlers to come into this country is adopted.

Timber sales were made at prices well up toward the prices of three years ago and at prices in anticipation of better times.

Town lot sales will be materially increased as soon as proper form of contract for sale of lots is prepared for the Department.

Our settlers now upon the lands are doing well and a movement for Northern Minnesota lands promises a considerable increase in sales.

Of the expenses for roads and special improvements considerable benefit will be derived in the future as the roads are opening up new territory preparatory to sale. The various townsite and truck garden surveys now made will all bring returns in 1910-11.

It is the desire of the Department to bring item in the Assets, "Land Contracts, Principal", up to such a point that the interest thereon will pay all expenses.

I would recommend the adoption of a policy in selling to actual settlers similar to that used by progressive colonization companies of this State and when such a policy is once adopted I believe that a large increase will be made in sales to a much better class of settlers.
