### **BY-LAWS**

OF

### The Duluth and Iron Range Rail Road Company

#### ARTICLE I

STOCKHOLDERS

The annual meeting of the stockholders, for the election of directors and the transaction of such other business as may lawfully come before it, shall be held at the office of the Company, in the City of Duluth, in the State of Minnesota, at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon, or at such other hour as may be designated in the notice, on the first Monday after the first Wednesday in June of each year. The said meeting may adjourn from time to time, and from place to place, until all business is completed.

Notice of the time and place of said annual meeting may be given by the Secretary by a four week's notice in a newspaper printed in the said City of Duluth. The first publication of said notice shall be at least thirty days prior to the time fixed for such meeting.

Special meetings of the stockholders may be called by the Board of Directors or by the President, to be held at any time and place. The said special meetings may adjourn from time to time and from place to place, until all business is completed.

Notice of the time and place of said annual or special meetings shall be mailed, postage paid, to each stockholder of record at his post office address, as the same appears on the books of the Company, at least seven days prior to the time fixed for such meetings; and the mailing thereof

shall constitute sufficient notice, and the failure of any stockholder to receive notice shall not interfere with the right to hold the meeting. Any such meeting may be held without notice if all the stockholders are present in person or by proxy or in writing waive the giving of the notice herein required.

At all meetings of stockholders, every stockholder of record shall be entitled to vote upon all matters which may come before the meeting, one vote, in person or by proxy, for each and every share of stock held by him, but no stock shall be voted on at any election within twenty days after its transfer on the books of the corporation.

The stock transfer books may be closed for at least ten days prior to the annual meeting or any special meeting.

The directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of the stockholders; but, if for any reason the election is not held at that time, such election may be held at any time thereafter.

At all stockholders' meetings a majority of the whole outstanding capital stock of the Company shall constitute a quorum, provided, however, that if a majority of such stock is not represented at any such meeting then those present may adjourn the meeting to a later date fixed by them.

#### ARTICLE II

#### OFFICERS

The officers of the Company shall consist of a President, one or more Vice Presidents, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer and an Auditor. The President and one of the Vice Presidents shall be chosen from the members of the Board of Directors. The other officers need not be members of the Board of Directors.

Any two or more of the offices of Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer may be held by the same person.

Each and every officer shall hold office only during the pleasure of a majority of the Board of Directors, and may be removed from his office at any time, with or without cause, by a vote of a majority of the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE III

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors shall consist of seven stock-holders.

There shall be a meeting of the Board of Directors immediately after the adjournment of the annual meeting of the stockholders, at which meeting the newly elected Board of Directors, if a quorum be present, shall elect by ballot from their own number a President and one Vice President. At such meeting the Board of Directors shall also elect a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer and an Auditor, which officers may or may not be members of the Board of Directors, and shall hold their respective offices during the pleasure of the Board.

The Board shall also appoint or elect such additional officers and agents as they may deem advisable, and remove the same, or any officer of the Company, at their pleasure.

In the absence of both the President and the Vice President, the Board may appoint a President pro tempore. During a prolonged absence or disability of the President, or any other officer, the Board may appoint substitutes pro tempore; or, on the death, removal or resignation of any officer, the Board shall fill the vacancy.

Every Director shall be a holder of at least one share of the capital stock of the Company. If having been duly elected any Director ceases to be a holder of at least one share of stock, he shall by reason thereof cease to be a Director. Each Director shall serve until the next annual election, or until his successor shall have been duly chosen and qualified, provided, that each and every director, however elected, shall hold office only during the pleasure of a majority in amount of the stockholders of said Company, and may be removed from his office at any time, with or without cause, by a vote of a majority in amount of stockholders of said Company, and in the event of any such removal or of a vacancy in the Board of Directors resulting from any other cause, the stockholders, at any annual or special meeting, may elect a successor to the director whose place shall be vacant.

In case of any vacancy in the Board of Directors through death, resignation, disqualification or other cause, and which may not have been filled by the stockholders, the remaining directors, by affirmative vote of a majority thereof, may elect a successor to hold office for the unexpired portion of the term of the director whose place shall be vacant, or until the election of his successor.

Four directors shall be required to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; but less than a quorum may adjourn from time to time, and from place to place.

By this Board of Directors, elected as provided, the whole affairs of the Company shall be managed and directed.

The order of business at all meetings of the Board of Directors shall be as follows:

First: Reading of minutes of last meeting. Second: Reports of officers of the Company.

Third: Reports of Committees. Fourth: Unfinished business.

Fifth: Original resolutions and new business.

#### ARTICLE IV

#### THE PRESIDENT

The President of the Company shall have power to call meetings of the Board of Directors at such time and place as he may appoint, and it shall be his duty to call a meeting of the Board whenever a majority of the Board of Directors shall request him in writing so to do, stating the object of such meeting.

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and stockholders, if present, and he shall have such power and perform such duties as may from time to time be conferred upon him, or be prescribed by the Board of Directors.

He shall exercise general supervision over the entire business of the Company, and the management of every department and of all of the property of the Company shall be under his direction, subject to the control of the Board of Directors.

He may countersign all checks, and shall execute all bonds, contracts or other instruments required to be made or executed for or on behalf of the Company, which shall also be signed by the Secretary, and he may designate some person to countersign checks in the absence of the President and Vice Presidents. He may sign certificates of stock, and is hereby authorized to sign them in blank, and leave them in sufficient numbers with the Treasurer, or such other person as the Board of Directors may designate.

#### ARTICLE V

#### THE FIRST VICE PRESIDENT

In the absence of the President or his inability to act, and in case the Board of Directors do not provide otherwise, all the duties of the President shall vest in and be performed by the First Vice President.

#### ARTICLE VI

#### THE SECOND VICE PRESIDENT

The Second Vice President shall perform such duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors.

### ARTICLE VII THE SECRETARY

The Secretary shall attend all meetings of the stock-holders and Board of Directors, whether regular or special; shall keep, in a book prepared for that purpose, a true and fair record of the proceedings of all such meetings, and shall have charge of all books, documents and papers which may properly belong to his office.

He shall have the custody of the corporate seal, and shall attach the same, with his signature, to all documents which require a seal, and which have been executed by the President or one of the Vice Presidents.

He shall also prepare a book or books of stock certificates, which after being signed by the President or one of the Vice Presidents, and Treasurer, he may fill up and deliver to the parties properly entitled to receive the same. He shall prepare new certificates upon the transfer of shares and the surrender of the old certificates.

#### ARTICLE VIII

#### THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY

The Assistant Secretary shall perform such duties as may be required by the Board of Directors, and in the absence of the Secretary or his inability to act, shall perform all the duties of the Secretary.

#### ARTICLE IX

#### THE TREASURER

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep an account of all moneys, funds and property of the Company which may come into his hands. He shall render such accounts, and present such statements to the Board of Directors as may be required of him. Disbursements shall be made by him under the orders of the President, or by resolution of the Board of Directors.

He shall sign checks for authorized disbursements, and shall give instructions to the bank to pay his checks when countersigned by the President or one of the Vice Presidents, or, in their absence, by such other person as they, or any of them, may designate.

He shall countersign all certificates of stock issued to stockholders.

He shall give such bonds for the faithful performance of his duties as the Board of Directors shall prescribe.

#### ARTICLE X

#### THE ASSISTANT TREASURER

The Assistant Treasurer may, when required by the Board of Directors, perform all the duties of Treasurer, or assist the Treasurer in his duties.

#### ARTICLE XI

#### THE AUDITOR

The Auditor shall have supervision over all the accounts and account books of the Company and see that the system of keeping the same, including the proper distribution and classification of all receipts and expenditures. is enforced and maintained. He shall direct as to forms and blanks relating to books and accounts, and the accounting procedure and distributions of receipts and expenditures, in all departments, and no change shall be made in the same without his consent, or the consent of the Board of Directors. He shall see that there is kept in the Accounting Department a set of books containing a complete record of all earnings, expenses, expenditures, and all business transactions of the Company proper to be recorded in the accounts. He shall see that proper vouchers are issued and approved for all authorized disbursements which are to be made by the Treasurer for corporate purposes of the Company. He shall verify the assets reported by the Treasurer, or his Assistant, and cause all books and accounts of officers and agents of the Company charged with the receipt and disbursement of money, materials and labor to be examined as often as practicable. He shall be responsible to the Board of Directors for carrying out all the foregoing and shall when requested, furnish the Board of Directors or President a statement covering all or any part of the matters in his charge. He shall have such additional powers and perform such additional duties as may, from time to time, be conferred upon him by the Board of Directors or the President.

#### ARTICLE XII


#### MEETINGS OUTSIDE OF STATE

The Board of Directors or managing officers of the Company may meet at any place outside of the State of Minnesota and transact business, and any special or adjourned meeting of the stockholders may be held outside of said State, at any branch office or offices that may be established by the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE XIII

#### AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be altered, amended or repealed at any meeting of the stockholders of the Company by a vote of a majority of the outstanding stock, or at any meeting of the Board of Directors by a vote of a majority of all the members of the Board.
