Whereupon the President declared that the persons named in said report had been and were duly elected Directors of the Company for the year commencing February 6th., 1917, and until their successors are elected and qualified.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the minutes of the meeting were then read and approved, and on motion, duly seconded and carried, the meeting then adjourned without date.
