C Both Senator Hubert H. Humphrey and Orville L. Freeman, DFL nominee for Governor of Minnesota, spoke at the Adrian breakfast. Also with them was Judge Douglas Hunt of Montevideo, DFL nominee for Congress from the Seventh District.

O Following the breakfast meeting the caravan entered Rock County, with meetings during the day at Magnolia, Luverne, and Hardwick, followed by Pipestone County meetings at Trosky, Edgerton, Hatfield, and Pipestone.

The day's tour reached a climax with a rally in Pipestone Thursday night.
