reasonably and sensibly about the great problems between us.

All this didn't happen by accident. Your Government

and the party ^{responsible for} ~~from which~~ this Government is ~~drawn~~, has

strengthened America. We are the pre-eminent political,

military and economic power in the world today. No combination of powers can ~~defeat us.~~ *match us or defeat us.*

health facilities of our nation. ~~it, and we did it.~~ Remember that records

And what about foreign policy? ~~where did~~ the Peace Corps ~~come from?~~ *is the demonstration* The finest demonstration of the spirit of America.

It is a success. It is America at its best. ~~that this country has ever seen.~~

And the Disarmament agency, the first any government ever established in history. The Nuclear Test Ban Treaty--

The first step away from the ^{treacherous} grinding pathway to nuclear disaster.

The Alliance for Progress--that bold and generous effort to sweep away the cobwebs of ~~history~~ ^{our neglect and misunderstanding} on Latin America -- Remember these achievements.

Now we are working on the Johnson blueprint for progress-- outlined in the President's clear and urgent call to Congress last month. Yes, it is a blueprint of progress, and it builds solidly on what we have already done.
