LeMay -- a very great patriot -- a devoted American -- an intrepid airman -- to whom our country owes a great debt for his years of dedicated military service. General LeMay has been, and is, an outstanding example of professional competence. He

has an unflagging dedication to his profession and is universally recognized for his deep-rooted integrity. His

35 years of military service are full of great achievements -
of new aircraft -- new boosters -- new missiles -- new management concepts -- of progress and daring.

The citation for the Robert J. Collier Trophy reads as follows:

"For the greatest achievement in aeronautics or astronautics in America, or with respect to improving the performance, efficiency or safety of air vehicles the value of which has been thoroughly demonstrated by actual use during the preceding year."

For years it has been universally accepted as one of the most prized of all aeronautical honors in the United States, if not the world.

It is with personal pleasure that I present the Collier Trophy to General LeMay -- we are indeed proud of him.
