Truly, the "hand that rocks the cradle is the hand that rules the world." The mothers of our free land are one of the most priceless assets of our country.

In contrast, in Communist dictatorship,

and affection. We reject dictatorship, we reject
"Big Brother" or "Big Mother" -- an all-powerful
