I come today to Evansville -- the hometown of my good friend Senator Vance Hartke -- to ask your support for the re-election of my good friend Congressman Winfield Denton.

Times are good in America. And they are good right here in your own community.

You don't need to be reminded of what things were like here in the early 1950's when industry left town, when jobs were lost, when the unemployment rate was up to 12 per cent.

We have made our commitment to the dignity and security of our parents.

Today Medicare is no longer something to be debated -- it is the law of the land. We have strengthened Social Security benefits across-the-board. And in the past three years, we have more than doubled our federal investments in health.

We have made our commitment to the American farm family.

The age of surpluses is behind us. We are entering a new era of opportunity for the good men and women who have done so much to provide high-quality food and fiber to the world. And we are determined that the American farmer shall receive a still better return on his investment, his time, and his labor than he does today.

We intend to put to use the lessons we've learned until every American citizen -- no matter what his last name, his religion, or the color of his face -- can earn a decent living at a decent job.

We have made our commitment to better and safer cities... to better housing... to cleaner air and water... to a country that is an open country -- a country where every American, because he is an American, can stand on his own two feet and make his way in life.
