L I can tell you one thing: All the problems we inherited from eight do-nothing Republican years would have been six years more serious, that much longer neglected, that much more explosive.

Now, thanks to our growth --- thanks to the stronger and better America we have built --- we are moving on to finish the unfinished business of this country.
