TUNNELL ON ELECTION DAY.

THANK YOU MR. SHIPLEY. IT IS MY UNDERSTANDING THAT  
DELAWARE'S DEMOCRATS ARE DOERS; A WORD THAT EMBODIES DRIVE,  
VITALITY, AND CREATIVE LEADERSHIP. LIKE YOUR HISTORY-MAKING  
123RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE 89<sup>th</sup> CONGRESS IS ALSO MADE UP OF  
DOERS. BOTH LEGISLATIVE BODIES HAVE PASSED A LANDSLIDE OF  
LANDMARK LEGISLATION. SINCE 1964 OUR CONGRESS HAS PASSED 87

LANDMARK BILLS PASSED BY EITHER THE 89<sup>th</sup> CONGRESS OR DELAWARE'S  
123RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY WOULD HAVE BEEN ENOUGH TO PLACE THESE  
LEGISLATIVE BODIES IN THE HISTORICAL ANNALS AS PRODUCTIVE  
LEGISLATIONS. BUT BY THE STANDARD OF PRODUCTION SET BY THE  
89<sup>th</sup> CONGRESS, EVEN THE 73RD CONGRESS OF ROOSEVELT'S 100 DAYS  
PALES. THIS TREMENDOUS LEGISLATIVE ACTION IS DUE TO DEMOCRATIC  
DOERS, BOTH IN DELAWARE AND ALL OVER THE NATION. THESE DOERS  
HAVE IMPROVED YOUR HIGHWAYS, GIVEN BETTER EDUCATION TO YOUR  
CHILDREN, IMPROVED LIVING AND MEDICAL STANDARDS OF YOUR ELDER  
CITIZENS AND SET UP PROGRAMS TO GIVE YOU CLEAN AIR AND WATER.
