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h President Johnson has said on various occasions,
"I am a free man, an American, a public servant, and a
Democrat -- in that order." I agree with our President==
and I keep waiting for somebody to ask my why I chose to
be a Democrat. If they ever do, I am going to tell
them this.

I am a Democrat because we have a two-party system
in this country, and I know the difference between the
two parties. The people really do have a choice, and
it is an easy choice to make. All you have to do is

The Democratic Party knows what it stands for. We believe in finding answers -- affirmative answers. We believe in facing up to the problems and facing up to the issues.

Although I have been studying the problem very carefully for more than 25 years, I still cannot tell you what the Republicans stand for. I am not even sure what they think they stand for. When you are dealing with Republicans, it is always easier to find out what they're against than to discover what they're for.

But I have read everything that the Republican leaders in Congress have said in the past year. If there has been one constructive suggestion coming from any of them, I don't know where it is. They complain. They protest. They tell us what we are doing wrong. But when you ask them

what they would like us to do instead, the only answer they've got is "Just stop whatever it is you're doing now and maybe the problems will go away." ~~Stupor~~

L Well, the problems won't go away. And most of them won't take "No" for an answer.

~~modern~~ L Can there be anything more important to a civilized, rich, nation than the care and respect it shows for its senior citizens when their working days are past?

L Thirty years ago, the Democratic Administration was trying to give this country Social Security. And the Republicans were trying in every way they knew how, to keep the Social Security bill from even coming to a vote in the ~~house~~. And when it did come to a vote, ~~in spite of them,~~ they voted 4 to 1 against it.

~~Band~~ L Very little has changed. This year, we passed the Medicare bill to bring the benefits of modern medicine to 20 million senior citizens.

And in the House, 93 per cent of the Republicans
~~tried to kill Medicare by sending it back to committee --~~
~~just as they tried to kill Social Security 30 years ago.~~

Two years ago, I promised that, if you would help

THIS WAS THE FARMERS CONGRESS. It passed the best farm program we have ever had. It passed a new and expanded Food for Freedom Program, Farm income is up -- surpluses are down -- rural America is a better place to live.

THIS WAS THE CITIES CONGRESS. It voted to create a Cabinet Officer to serve your interests. It passed the Model Cities Bill to help you build a better place to live. It voted for rent supplements to bring you better housing and rapid urban transit to speed the time it takes you to get to work.

he voted for the final passage of one of these great

measures, ask him how he voted on re-committal.

That was the killer vote.

↳ These were the re-committal men. *and* They can not escape their record.

↳ But I did not come here to rest on the record of the past Congress. These great programs *which* we have

launched will mean little for America if they are not

renewed. They can raise only false hopes if they are not renewed next year and the year after that.

L The Republicans know this. ^{and} They know that
 they cannot win a majority this year. But they are
 hoping to get enough seats to block the progress
 we have made to slow it down!

and L The Republican Senator from Pennsylvania has
 been candid about it. He claimed that if the GOP gets
50 seats ^{in Congress} this year, it will be "enough to put the
brakes on all the President's social legislation."

L I do not believe Americans want to backslide
 or backlash against all the progress we have made.

L I believe that the choice you face this fall
 is a clear-cut one:

-- the party of progress or the party of
 re-committal;

-- The party that moves ahead or the party
 that procrastinates;

-- the party of hope or the party of fear.

L When you make your choice, judge America by the life you seek not only for yourselves but for your children and your children's children.

L Judge the problems that face America -- and judge which party is prepared to meet those problems.

L Our nation has big problems ahead -- not the petty, partisan problems the Republicans worry about.

L In the 34 years left of this century, we must make a new America -- build as many cities, as many schools and hospitals and parks and playgrounds as in all the years since the Pilgrims landed.

L Within the next decade we must double the capacity of our colleges.

L We must modernize our city hospitals and extend a nationwide network of clean and comfortable nursing homes for our elderly.

↳ We must build an urban transportation system
so that the worker gets to his job in less time than
it takes to fly to California.

↳ We must find ways to dispose of the mountains
of poisonous waste that each day pollutes the air
we breathe and the water we drink. *This is big work!*

↳ But your Federal Government needs Governors
and legislatures as working partners in building a
better America.
