and myself. What a magnificant electrony
and litting of fun and fellowship.
And you said in your State of the Union
Message, for we Americans, this is a time
of testing.

Jow know Months fort, Months we for the burdens of world leadership are not carried easily, yet they must be carried.

The burdens of world leadership are not the world and forthers among the week well as a factor to requisite the world and inspired by the dreams and the leadership of Franklin Roosevelt.

And I know you share his vision of a world of human opportunity in which people may live in dignity . . . in freedom . . . and in peace.

The last words Franklin Roosevelt ever wrote -- in another time of testing -- were these:

"The only limit to our realization of tomorrow will be our doubts of today. Let us move forward with strong and active faith."

The challenge left to us by Franklin

Roosevelt is the same challenge you gave us in
your State of the Union Message.

It is the challenge those of us who stand alongside you, and work for the people, accept, Mrs. Johnson, Speaker and Mrs.

McCormack, Chief Justice and Mrs. Warren, Members of the Cabinet and of the Congress, and honored guests -- to the President of the United States.
