

Both parties will be holding their national conventions in August, and time must be provided for attendance. The Republican Convention convenes on August 5, until August 9, and the Democratic Convention on August 26, until August 30.

In 1960, when both parties held their conventions in July, the Senate recessed from July 3 to August 8.

In 1964, the Senate recessed from July 10, to July 20, for the Republican Convention which convened on July 13, and recessed again on August 1, until Monday, August 31, for the Democratic Convention which started on August 24.

Assuming the Senate is still in session, recommend that the Senate recess at the conclusion of business Friday, August 2, and reconvene on Monday August 12. Then recess at the conclusion of business Friday, August 23, and reconvene on Tuesday, September 3. Labor Day is Monday, September 2.

Hopefully, adjournment sine die can be achieved by August 2, 1968, and no recess would be necessary.
