New York, N.Y., October 10 -- Speaking at a Wall Street Rally, Vice President Humphrey said today that the nation's objectives of unity at home, economic and social growth, and peace can be achieved within the context of our free enterprise system.

"I say they can be done, not through the oppressive hand of big government, but through all of us here in America working together -- all of us working where we are through the free institutions we represent."

And I am here among some of the greatest revolutionaries the world has ever known -- the people who have built an incentive system in this country that has brought more benefits to more people than any other social or economic system in the history of the earth.

Now this country faces decisions -- decisions about our future...about where we are going...and what this country will make of itself.

Senator Ed Muskie and I are two of the people involved in those decisions.

The others are Dick Nixon, Curtis LeMay, George Wallace, and Spiro Agnew.

The American people have to ask: which of these men are worthy of their trust?

Which of these men can bring this country forward...can build on the economic and social growth which you have helped build?

Peace in the world.

Unity in our country.

And the steady economic growth that are necessary to both.

These are the things the next President and Vice President of this country will have to achieve.

Right here on Wall Street, the Huron druggist's son tells you that he has a vision about these things. And he tells you that they can be done within the context of our free enterprise system.?

I say they can be done not through the oppressive hand of big government, but through all of us here in America working together -- all of us, working where we are through the free institutions we represent.

Neither you nor I want profits...or economic growth...or dividends for their own sake.

We want these things because of what they do.

REMARKS OF VICE PRESIDENT HUBERT H. HUMPHREY
AT WALL STREET RALLY - October 10, 1968

VICE PRESIDENT HUMPHREY: - - - Now, ladies and gentlemen, I think it is just about time that I should tell you that this is the kind of country in which both Dick Nixon and I are living examples - - -

(Shouts of "Boo" and applause)

- - - you know, somebody told me that Nixon might have some votes on Wall Street.

But I want to let you know something here today. Both of us have the same experience. It is the kind of country that you live in where any poor boy can grow up to be Vice President. It is just one of the chances that you fellows will have to take, living in America.

I am here today amongst some of the greatest revolutionaries that the world has ever known -- the people who have helped build an incentive system in this country that has brought more benefits to more people than any other social or economic system in the history of the world.

I am here to talk to people who, whether they know it or not, have changed the face of this world and have changed it for the better.

Now, I realize that my opponent in this election, Mr. Nixon, in all of his current speeches, says that inflation and taxes have eaten up the increased income of Americans in the past four years.

But you know something? Just yesterday Mr. Nixon and myself had to publish the facts of our true net worth. And in the past four years, under these oppressive Democratic rules and regulations, and under this incredibly difficult Democratic Administration, Mr. Nixon's net worth has risen from \$48,000 to \$515,000.

(Applause)

And may I say that is not bad. That is not a bad investment.

And I might add that according to my trustees, my net worth has not done badly, either. They say that it has doubled.

I think what the country needs for all of us is a little more Democratic prosperity.

And look at how good you look out there today.

Well, I love that good-humored booing. That is the kind I really like.

Now, let's just talk sense to each other for a few moments.

This country, your country, my country, faces grave decisions -- decisions about our future, about where we are going and what this country will make of itself. And no one has a greater stake in it than the people that are here.

Senator Ed Muskie and I are two of the people that are involved in these decisions. The others are Dick Nixon, Curtis LeMay, George Wallace and Spiro Agnew.

Now, the American people have the right to ask which of these men are worthy of their trust -- which of these men -- did I hear you say Agnew? Did I hear you say LeMay?

I think I heard you right. Thank you very much.

And the American people have a right to ask, and they are asking, which of these men can bring this country forward, can build the economic and social growth which you have helped to create, and which is the living fact of our time.

There is no place in the world where a man ought to be able to talk about the miracles of this economy better than here in this place at Wall Street, and there is no group of people in the world that ought to have a greater appreciation of 91 months of consecutive prosperity than this group that I talk to here on Wall Street.

And there is no group -- and there is no group in the world that ought to be more concerned about eight years of a Republican administration that brought three recessions and brought unemployment and trouble to the American people. Because this group -- because this

group represents men and women who have been trained and educated in the knowledge of our economy.

So we are here to talk about what can be done -- not what has been done, but what can be done.

And the first priority of the next President of the United States, whoever he will be, is to bring peace in this world, to settle a war in Vietnam, and to be able to bring a halt to the dangerous arms race.

The second priority is to be able to build a unity and understanding and a tolerance amongst the American people themselves, because without our country working together as a human family, there is no hope for any street -- Wall Street, Harlem, or wherever it may be.

And a third great challenge to whomever is your next President is the steady economic growth that is vital to the realization of any of our hopes and any of our dreams.

Now, these are the things that the next President and the next Vice-President of this country will have to achieve.

And I ask this great audience to keep in mind the kind of a dangerous world in which we live. I ask you to remember that in these past fifty years of our history, one out of every three Presidents has failed to live out his term. I ask you to keep in mind the disastrous conditions which have faced this republic in these last five years itself, where a President has been assassinated, a contender for the presidency has been assassinated, and a great leader has lost his life.

So that when you vote in this election in November, you are not only voting for one man -- you are indeed voting for the stewardship of your country as a team. I ask you to consider that team. I ask you to remember whether or not in light of the history of the last half century, where the odds are one out of every three Presidents has failed to live out his term -- I ask you to consider the possibility of a President LeMay; the possibility, if you please, of a President Agnew.

You are right -- you are absolutely right.

And the great possibility of a President Ed Muskie.

Yes, my friends -- yes, my fellow Americans -- with all the levity and with all of the partisanship of this campaign, we are talking about -- you give me a chance, young man, and we will -- we are talking about the stewardship, we are talking about the guidance and the direction of this great republic of ours. And it cannot be lightly held.

Right here on Wall Street -- right here on Wall Street, the son of a retail druggist tells you that he has a vision of the things that can yet come and that they can be done within our free enterprise system. I say they cannot be done through government alone, but through all of us working here together, working in partnership, people and their government -- working where we are through the free institutions that we represent -- we can do anything with this country, anything that we desire for good.

Now, neither you nor I want profits or economic growth or dividends simply for their own sake. I think we are better than that. We want these things because of what we believe they can do for our families, for our country, for our city, and for our community. They can help us get on with the unfinished business of America. And the story of this country is its unfinished business, -- the great resources yet to be tapped, the people yet to have a chance, the American people yet to realize their dream.

And if we work together, if we are willing to work together in confidence and trust, we can rebuild our cities and make them more livable, and we can help create an environment where our families can be safe and free, and where our children can develop their full capacities and be ready to face the world. And we can, my friends, help the people in our country who are today unemployed, unproductive and discouraged. And we can help them, as I know you want to, with

jobs and with training, and with a chance to improve themselves.

I believe that you will agree with me that every American is entitled to the same chance that you and I have had.

Yes, we can. We can help more Americans become owners and customers. We can change America for the better. We can change America from welfare and relief to jobs and self respect, from poverty and despair to enterprise and hope.

And I say to this great audience here today that has been blessed as few others have ever been blessed in the history of the world -- we can give hope to the hopeless and we can give confidence to the people who today lack faith.

We can build the kind of a country, my fellow Americans -- we can build the kind of a country that will be judged not by its automobile junk yards, or its empty beer cans, or even the quantity of its goods, but rather we can build, as I know you want to, an America that is known for its enterprise and its compassion, for its wisdom, for its schools, its hospitals, its theaters, and for the quality of its people.

We do not seek just a bigger America. We seek a better America. We do not seek even only a safer America. We seek a more just America.

And this is my message -- particularly to the young men and women that stand before me today -- that whatever we will to do, we can do it. This is my message to Wall Street today. And this is my message to America.

Might I say to this great throng of fellow Americans that there are always those -- there are always those few who feel that some way, that by expressing their displeasure, they indicate the majority of America.

Let me tell you there is a great silent majority in this country that loves their country, that is looking upon this election -- that is looking upon this election as a very critical decision for themselves.

This election will not be decided by the noisy left or the rude and radical right. This election -- this election will be decided by people who care for their country, who care for their fellow Americans, who know that this nation of ours has a great responsibility.

And I come to this great -- I come to this great historical center of America to ask you to help me to bring out the basic goodness of the American people. I ask you to help me -- I ask you to help me to appeal to the greatness of the American people. I want the world to know in this election that we can live as one united American family, that we can have our country dedicated to the cause of peace, and that we can keep this great free enterprise system of ours working to share its benefits upon more and more people throughout this land.

And if you will place your trust, now, in Ed Muskie and myself, if you will work with us, this can be our message.
