I'm here to ask you to vote -- and to vote for Hubert Humphrey and Ed Muskie.

Inhere's a lot we have to do together. We know the issues --- the injustices that have to be corrected ... the wrongs that have to be righted.

We are still in the early dawn between the night of oppression and the bright sunlight of human rights.

We write equality in the book of law and we still have unequality in our schools and on the job.

We give men the obligation to serve in battle and a less-than-equal chance to raise their families in decency when they get home.

We preach freedom -- and all of us, white and black, are still shackled to a tragic past.

So L Where do we go from here?

Will it be hatred and fear and more oppression?

Will we see another generation of children come up unnecessarily crippled by poverty ... crippled by ignorance ... crippled by fear and hate?

Will we continue to arm ourselves, one against another?

Will we settle for two societies, separate and unequal, and uneasy -- apartheid where America was meant to be?

There is a choice ... and the choice may well be made in Newark.

What you decide to do next Tuesday could make the difference in New Jersey ... and New Jersey could make the difference in America.

What kind of a choice is it?

L I have fought for twenty years for federal aid to education. And I watched Richard Nixon cast the tie-breaking vote against it in 1960.

I fought for Head Start ... the Neighborhood Youth Corps ... Medicare ... the dollar-sixty Minimum Wage ... Social Security increases ... and the Republicans fought them tooth and nail.

You are standing in the middle of a Model Cities project area and you are going to be living in some new housing because I and a lot of other Democrats fought for it -- while the Republicans in Congress voted 93 per cent against.

There is a Job Corps today because Democrats think every American ought to have the right to learn a skill and hold a decent job. Mr. Nixon wants the Job Corps abolished.

And you know the record when it comes to civil rights.

Strom Thurmond walked out of the Democratic convention in Philadelphia in 1948 ... and Richard Nixon let him name Spiro T. Agnew Republican Vice Presidential candidate in 1968.

Voting rights ... the Civil Rights Act of 1964 ...

Open Housing --- I have fought for them for two decades.

And today Mr. Nixon can't make up his mind whether he thinks the federal government should enforce school desegregation or not.

Yes, you have a choice.

You can work and build. You can go out and vote for that bond issue to give every child in New Jersey a chance for a decent education.

Newark knows the lesson of this country:

Divided, we can do nothing. United, we can do anything.

All of us -- black and white, English-speaking and Spanish-speaking -- must learn to live together or we shall live in a country filled with tension and hate.

I know Newark can do it.

LI know America can do it.

Not by accepting what is wrong, but by making things right.

A People can learn together best by going to school together and by working together.

That means good schools.

That means jobs for everybody.

f jobs get scarce, people fight each other for them.

And let me tell you this: If you let the Republicans get back into the White House, you will have more unemployment than you've had since the last time they were there ... when we had three recessions in eight years.

The Republicans are committed --- as a matter of policy --- to a higher rate of unemployment. They are committed to putting people out of work. They have said so.

The only question that remains is how deep the recession they would create would cut ... and how long it would last.

We need prosperity, not recession.

We need growth for all the people, not just profits for the chosen few.

I've travelled across America during the last several weeks.

I've been asking people to vote for jobs -- for everybody.

I've been asking people to vote for education -- for everybody.

I've asked them to vote for equal law protection and enforcement -- for everybody.

I've asked them to stand up and be counted ...
to stand up for one free American citizenship.

Have you heard me?

This nation has come a long way in its journey.

Are we going to turn back now?

Are we going to sacrifice what men have fought ... and died for?

Are we going to be able to trust each other?

That's the question we have to answer. You have my trust.

I ask yours.

We have a lot to do between now and election day.

We've got to get every registered voter to the polls.

Vote.

Say what is in your heart.

Say it so the whole country knows.

Say it so we can finally make America one
