REMARKS OF HUBERT H. HUMPHREY

"In this beautiful city, whose planning bears the imprint of one of your compatriots, Major L'Enfant, this capitol of a free nation, whose freedom the beloved General LaFayette fought so valiantly to help achieve, it is appropriate, Mr. Ambassador, that I present to you today another monument to Franco-American collaboration.

"Encyclopaedia Universalis, hailed by many French critics as the most important enterprise of its kind since the great Diderot Encyclopédie, represents a joint venture of the Club Français du Livre and the Encyclopaedia Britannica.

"In the spirit of the long friendship between our two countries, I hand you these first volumes of what is destined to be the greatest modern encyclopedia in Europe."
