always through COPE, through his IUE union, through his political party to see that more people were, indeed, politically educated and activated.

I can speak of this with some feeling because I don't know of anyone who was helped more than I was. There never was a Humphrey effort in this state which did not find Ken in the forefront. I make a special point of this for one reason only. So often, when a man is elected to high public office, he takes the applause and accolades, he enjoys the glory. Too often in the cheers we forget that all of our success depends on a man like Ken who receives little recognition and less thanks.
