HUMPHREY ATTACKS 'BOONDOGGLE'

OF PROPOSED UNDERGROUND RADIO

ANTENNA NETWORK IN WISCONSIN

MADISON, Wisconsin - Senator Hubert Humphrey charged today that a vast, underground radio antenna network proposed by the US Navy in Northern Wisconsin is "a half-baked boondoggle" which could threaten the state with severe ecological damage.

Project Sanguine, said Humphrey, is a Navy plan to "lay down a 6,400 acre antenna grid through Wisconsin's virgin forests to communicate with our submarines at sea." The project would cost taxpayers possibly billions of dollars -- would probably not work, and would certainly disturb environmental life in the area, Humphrey said.

Speaking to a group of Wisconsin conservationists in Madison, Humphrey stated that the Navy has so far failed to provide the people of Wisconsin with required documents to certify that Project Sanguine can be completed without causing serious environmental damage feared by conservationists.

"However," said Humphrey, "this has not deterred the Navy from requesting from the Congress millions of dollars to launch the project. "I believe
that this lack of concern for the people of Wisconsin by the Navy Department
is a violation of the spirit, if not the letter of the Environment Policy
Act."

Humphrey also stated that "there is evidence to suggest that Project Sanguine is ill-conceived from an operational point of view." He said that scientific studies have indicated that an Extremely Low Frequency system

as utilized in Project Sanguine would be inadequate for the purpose of communicating with submarines thousands of miles distant at sea.

"The more we read about Project Sanguine," said Humphrey, the worse it gets--and the more unprepared the Government is to defend it."

He said that the project would require as much power as is required to light the city of Madison-energy that is in scarce supply throughout the United States.

Humphrey said that independent research has shown that electrical emissions from the underground antenna system could "gravely disturb" both invertabrate and vertabrate animal systems and thus unbalance the environmental life in the Northern Wisconsin area.

Furthermore, said Humphrey, "hundreds of miles of trenches dug out for Project Sanguine would leave the beautiful Wisconsin countryside scarred forever. And that must not happen."

The Democratic Presidential candidate called upon the Navy Department to comply with the law and provide an honest and complete environmental statement and to release it as soon as possible.

Humphrey stated: "I promise you that this whole misadventure, this grand escapade beyond the limits of reason will be immediately halted if I am elected your President."

Saturday, March 25

You will be speaking before a highly ecology-aware group. We have prepared the speech as a major statement on the environment.

A very hot topic at the meeting, and the news lead of your speech, is the controversy over Project Sanguine.

This is a Navy proposal to build a 6,400 square mile antenna grid under Northern Wisconsin to communicate with our submarines. Technical experts say it won't work, and the environmental effect wat be disastrous -- the Administration has not yet submitted either the legally required environment impact statement or a technical feasibility study.

Last September, you voted for Senator Nelson's two amendments to delete funds for the project. The first amendment, the stronger one, was narrowly defeated. Muskie was not present, nor did he announce.

Before your speech there will be a report to the Conference specifically on Project Sanguine. Therefore, your audience will know all the details on the status of the project.

So far, no other candidate has spoken out in the campaign against Project Sanguine.

Jackson, Lindsay, and Muskie are scheduled to speak earlier in the day.

HUMPHREY PROTESTS NIXON ADMINISTRATION VETO OF GREAT LAKES CLEAN-UP PROPOSALS

Pebruary 23-Senator Hubert H. Humphrey issued the following statement today:

I call upon President Nixon immediately to reverse
the decision of the Office of Management and Budget about would
veto a crash program to combat pollution of the Great Lakes.

The Great Lakes clean-up program was recommended by the Environmental Protection Agency but the Office of Management and Budget rejected the proposed expenditure of \$141 million to begin the program.

It is inconceivable to me that a nation with a \$246 billion national budget cannot afford to spend \$141 million dollars on badly needed pollution control for the largest body of fresh water in the world, so vital to the health of millions of Americans.

This veto action clearly shows that the Administration is in retreat on its promise to guarantee clean air and clean water as "part of the birthright of every American."

The pollution of the Great Lakes affects the lives of almost thirty million people and, the consequences of the pollution in this area are disastrous. -- there are extensive damages to fisheries, recreation is greatly hampered, and the water supply for the whole region is endangered.

Yet, the Administration refuses to commit the minimal dollars necessary to take the first step toward restoring the Great Lakes to health.

It fails to back up its rhetolil with programs.

It fails to fulfill President Nixon's own call to action of his February 7, 1972 Environmental Message in which he said "we must act, and act decisively. It is literally now or never."

Apparently, as the actions of the Nixon Administration indicate, where the Great Lakes are concerned, the time is "never."

The President should reverse this Office of Management and Sudget decision.

And, as a more positive sollution, we should begin a campaign of pollution prevention. I invite the Administration to get behind a bill I recently introduced that would create River Basin Waste Treatment Authorities so that we may begin a comprehensive effort to clean entire river and lake basins.

You will be speaking before a highly ecology-aware group. We have prepared the speech as a major statement on the environment.

A very hot topic at the meeting, and the news lead of your speech, is the controversy over Project Sanguine.

This is a Navy proposal to build a 6,400 square mile antenna grid under Northern Wisconsin to communicate with our submarines. Technical experts say it won't work, and the environmental effect will be disastrous -- the Administration has not yet submitted either the legally required environment impact statement or a technical feasibility study.

Last September, you voted for Senator Nelson's two amendments to delete funds for the project. The first amendment, the stronger one, was narrowly defeated. Muskie was not present, nor did he announce.

Before your speech there will be a report to the Conference specifically on Project Sanguine. Therefore, your audience will know all the details on the status of the project.

So far, no other candidate has spoken out in the campaign against Project Sanguine.

Jackson, Lindsay, and Muskie are scheduled to speak earlier in the day.
