ONLY A PRESIDENT WHO IS THOROUGHLY FAMILIAR AND COMMITTED

TO INSURING ECONOMIC JUSTICE FOR OUR NATION'S FAMILY FARMERS

CAN PULL IT OFF.

FARMERS HAD BETTER START THINKING ABOUT THESE PROBLEMS NOW.

FURTHERMORE, THEY HAD BETTER EXAMINE NOW THE FARM

CREDENTIALS AND RECORD OF ALL CANDIDATES, PRESIDENTIAL AND
