We have prepared selections from the text of the West Virginia COPE speech of last Saturday.

Please note that pages 2 and 7 are updated and include material on Johnstown and Pennsylvania.

The biggest local issue is unemployment -- the Johnstown rate is over 8 per cent. There is no new industry, no jobs for young people. And foreign import competition has taken away jobs.

We have been advised to caution you against speaking on the problems of blacks. The racial situation in Johnstown is touchy.
