IT IS MY GREAT PLEASURE TO SPEAK TO THE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY OF THE HEBREW HOME OF GREATER WASHINGTON.

IT IS A PLEASURE NOT JUST TO SALUTE YOUR GOOD WORKS,

BUT TO SALUTE YOUR SPIRIT OF CARING AND ACHIEVEMENT.

YOU REPRESENT THE AMERICAN TRADITION OF CARING FOR

PEOPLE -- ESPECIALLY THOSE WHO ARE UNDERPRIVILEGED OR WITHOUT GREAT PERSONAL RESOURCES.

LAND THE HEBREW HOME IS LEADING WASHINGTON AND THE

NATION IN MEETING THE PROBLEMS OF OUR ELDERLY.

C-NO ONE IS EVER TURNED AWAY FROM YOUR DOOR BECAUSE HE

OR SHE CANNOT PAY IN FACT, YOU GIVE PRIORITY CONSIDERATION

TO THOSE WHO CANNOT PAY -- THOSE WHO ARE ALONE -- WITHOUT

FAMILY AND WITHOUT FUNDS.

--YOU ARE NOT SATISFIED WITH WHAT YOU HAVE ACHIEVED SO FAR, AND ARE PLANNING FOR GREATER FACILITIES IN THE FUTURE YOUR APPLICATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT FOR A NEW 250 UNIT SENIOR CITIZENS APARTMENT HAS GREAT MERIT -- AND IF SUCCESSFUL WILL MAKE YOUR SERVICES AVAILABLE TO EVEN MORE ELDERLY AMERICANS. BUT YOU ALONE CANNOT DO JUSTICE TO THE NEEDS OF OUR ELDERLY YOU ARE DON'G ALL YOU SAN, BUT YOU WAITING LIST OF APPLICANTS TO THE HERREW NOME. PRESENT RATE OF CHANGE-OVER I AM TOLD THAT IT WILL TAKE 7 YEARS FOR YOU TO ACCOMMODATE ALL THE REPPLE WHOSE

APPLICATIONS HAVE BEEN APPROVED.

WHAT WE NEED -- WHAT WE MUST HAVE -- IS A NATIONAL

COMMITMENT TO MEET THE PROBLEMS OF THE ELDERLY. WHAT WE

NEED IS GOVERNMENT WITH A HEART -- A GOVERNMENT THAT CARES.

AND WHAT WE MUST EXPERIENCE IS THAT THE TIME HAS COME

TO RECOGNIZE THAT THE NEEDS OF OLDER AMERICANS ARE NOT

PRIVILIGES TO BE BESTOWED BY A GENEROUS SOCIETY, BUT THAT

THEY ARE BASIC AMERICAN RIGHTS.

--IT IS WRONG THAT 5 1/2 MILLION OF OUR ELDERLY -- MORE
THAN A QUARTER OF ALL OLDER AMERICANS -- ARE LIVING IN
POVERTY.

--IT IS WRONG THAT MILLIONS OF ELDERLY AMERICANS LACK
ADEQUATE TRANSPORTATION EVEN FOR SUCH BASIC NEEDS AS VISITS
TO A DOCTOR OR TO A GROCERY STORE.

Z--IT IS WRONG THAT MILLIONS OF ELDERLY AMERICANS ARE PRICED OUT OF THE HOME BUYING MARKET AND FORCED TO LIVE IN WHAT ARE ALL TOO FREQUENTLY, CROWDED, SHABBY, AND UNHEALTHY CONDITIONS.

Z-IT IS WRONG THAT OUR SOCIETY SHORT-CHANGES THOSE WHO IN THEIR PRODUCTIVE YEARS HAVE CONTRIBUTED SO MUCH. AND THE TIME FOR CHANGE -- THE TIME FOR A FAIR CHANCE FOR OLDER AMERICANS -- IS NOW.

THIS NATION NEEDS A NEW DEAL FOR THE ELDERLY CITIZENS

OF AMERICA:

1. AS PRESIDENT, ONE OF MY FIRST ACTS WOULD BE

ESTABLISH A CABINET-LEVEL OFFICE ON AGING JUST ANOTHER ADVISORY GROUP HOLDING PERIODIC MEETINGS, BUT TO PULL TOGETHER ALL FEDERAL PROGRAMS CONCERNING THE ELDERLY, TO SET SCHEDULES FOR MEETING SPECIFIC GOALS, TO FIX RESPONSIBILITY FOR ACTION, TO MOVE OUT IN NEW DIRECTIONS. I HAVE PROPOSED AND INTRODUCED IN THE SENATE THE HUMPHREY HOME HEALTH SERVICES PLAN FOR ELDERLY AMERICANS. THIS COMPREHENSIVE PROGRAM WILL CLOSE A MAJOR GAP IN MEDICARE

AND PUT A NEW EMPHASIS ON PREVENTIVE HEALTH CARE.

THE FACT IS THAT TWO-THIRDS OF THE HEALTH CARE COSTS OF OLDER AMERICANS ARE FOR HOSPITALS AND NURSING HOMES. AND THE HARSH FACT IS THAT HEALTH CARE COSTS ARE RISING TWICE AS FAST FOR OLDER AMERICANS THAT FOR YOUNG PEOPLE --AND MEDICARE COVERS LESS THAN HALF THE COST. LAS THE AUTHOR OF THE ORIGINAL MEDICARE LEGISLATION, I TAKE GREAT PRIDE IN ITS ACCOMPLISHMENTS BUT, THE PROGRAM MUST BE REFORMED AND EXPANDED IF WE ARE TO TRULY EXTEND TO THE ELDERLY THE RIGHTS AND REWARDS TO WHICH THEY ARE ENTITLED. MY PLAN WILL END THE PRESENT MEDICARE PROVISION THAT RECIPIENTS MUST BE HOSPITALIZED FOR AT LEAST THREE DAYS BEFORE THEY ARE ELIGIBLE FOR HOME HEALTH SERVICES .-

WE NEED A MAJOR REDIRECTION OF OUR NATIONAL HEALTH

CARE SYSTEM FROM THE NARROW CONCEPT OF MEDICAL CARE IN

INSTITUTIONS DURING ACUTE ILLNESS TO ONE OF PREVENTIVE CARE,

HEALTH MAINTENANCE, AND REHABILITATION SERVICES,

WE MUST ACT NOW TO REFORM THE MEDICARE SYSTEM WHICH

SAYS TO THE ELDERLY WE WILL RECOGNIZE SOME OF YOUR NEEDS,

BUT NOT ENOUGH TO ASSURE YOU OF GOOD ACCESS TO CALLUNG James

HEALTH NEEDS.

AND WE MUST ACT NOW TO GREATLY INCREASE NATIONAL
RESEARCH EFFORTS ON THE PROBLEMS OF HEALTH CARE FOR THE
ELDERLY. WE MUST CREATE A NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF GERONTOLOGY

AS THE KEYSTONE OF A MASSIVE INVESTIGATION OF THE TREATMENT,

PREVENTION AND CURE OF THE HEALTH PROBLEMS OF OLDER

AMERICANS.

- ASSISTANCE PROGRAM TO FEDERALLY ED MINIMUM LEVELS

 OF \$165 A MONTH FOR A SINGLE INDIVIDUAL AND \$215 FOR A

 COUPLE. THESE INCREASES WILL HELP TO LIFE THE 5 1/2 MILLION

 ELDERLY AS WELL AS THE MORE THAN 1 1/2 MILLION BLIND AND

 DISABLED ABOVE THE POVERTY LINE.
- 4. I CALL FOR A 25 PERCENT INCREASE IN SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS, WITH A \$100 A MONTH MINIMUM PROVISION,

AND A COST OF LIVING ESCALATOR FOR REAL AND PERMANENT INFLATION PROTECTION.

THE TIME FOR PROMISES IS OVER. WE NEED ACTION --

- -- THE RIGHT TO AN ADEQUATE INCOME.
- -- THE RIGHT TO DECENT HOUSING.
- -- THE RIGHT TO QUALITY MEDICAL CARE.
- -- THE RIGHT, ABOVE ALL, TO HUMAN DIGNITY AND SECURITY.

I URGE PRESIDENT NIXON TO HALT OUR BOMBING OF NORTH VIETNAM. THE BOMBING OF HANOI AND HAIPHONG IS A DANGEROUS AND AN ALARMING ESCALATION OF THE WAR.

THE BOMBING OF THE NORTH IGNORES ALL WE HAVE LEARNED

IN THE LAST SEVERAL YEARS. THE BOMBING IS A GIANT STEP

BACKWARD TO BEFORE 1968 WHEN PRESIDENT JOHNSON HALTED

THE BOMBING BECAUSE IT HAD PROVEN TO BE NOT ONLY INEFFECTIVE

BUT INHUMANE.

CAN YOU BELIEVE THAT TODAY AMERICANS ARE STILL DYING IN VIETNAM, THAT AMERICAN PLANES ARE BOMBING IN THE NORTH AND THAT THE WAR IS BEING ESCALATED BY THE MAN WHO STOOD

A SECRET PLAN TO END THE WAR, AND IF ELECTED HE WOULD
WITHDRAW AMERICANS AND END OUR INVOLVEMENT IN THIS TRAGEDY?

CAN YOU BELIEVE THIS?

IT SEEMS INCREDIBLE THAT ONCE AGAIN WE ARE ON THE ROAD
TO ESCALATION OF THE WAR. AND THIS TIME THE PRESIDENT
HAS NOT EVEN TAKEN HIS CASE PUBLICLY TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE.

THE BOMBING WILL NOT BREAK THE WILL OF THE NORTH VIETNAMESE.

I CALL UPON THE PRESIDENT TO COME FORTH AND PERSONALLY EXPLAIN TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE WHY HE HAS ESCALATED THE WAR

AND WHY HE BELIEVES THAT BOMBING WILL BREAK THE WILL OF THE NORTH VIETNAMESE IN 1972 WHEN IT WAS NOT ABLE TO DO SO IN THE PAST.

MR. PRESIDENT, HOW WILL THE BOMBING BRING THE NORTH VIETNAMESE TO THE NEGOTIATING TABLE ON OUR TERMS?

MR. PRESIDENT, HOW WILL THE BOMBING HASTEN THE RETURN
OF AMERICAN POW'S?

MR. PRESIDENT, HOW WILL THE BOMBING HALT THE SLAUGHTER
OF INNOCENT CIVILIANS IN THE NORTH AND SOUTH?

MR. PRESIDENT, HOW WILL THE BOMBING BRING US ANY CLOSER
TO PEACE IN ASIA?

MR. PRESIDENT, WHY CAN'T YOU LEARN FROM THE MISTAKES

OF THE PAST?

PRESIDENT NIXON SHOULD CALL FOR AN EMERGENCY SESSION

OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL WHICH NOW INCLUDES THE PEOPLE'S

REPUBLIC OF CHINA.

WE CAN PLEDGE THAT OUR ARMED FORCES WILL BE WITHDRAWN
WITHIN A CERTAIN DATE AND THAT ALL WE ASK IN RETURN IS THE
SAFE WITHDRAWAL OF OUR TROOPS, THE RELEASE OF AMERICAN
POW'S AND THE IDENTIFICATION OF THOSE MISSING IN ACTION.
