L "LESS THAN ONE PERCENT OF THE BUDGET GOES TO COMBAT THE CRITICAL PROBLEM OF CRIME, INCLUDING DRUG AGUSE.

"LESS THAN ONE HALF OF ONE PERCENT OF THE BUDGET GOES FOR MASS TRANSIT -- THE KEY TO TRAFFIC CONGESTION AND AIR AND NOISE POLLUTION.

"THESE ARE FOUR AREAS THAT TYPIFY THE PROBLEMS WORKING FAMILIES WANT GOVERNMENT TO *to do something about* ~~HUMPHREY OBSERVED~~ "yes" LESS THAN FIVE PERCENT OF THE PRESIDENT'S BUDGET IS ALLOCATED TO ALL OF THEM COMBINED. *HB*

"WORKING PEOPLE KNOW THAT THE REPUBLICAN PARTY HAS TRADITIONALLY OPPOSED MEDICARE, AID TO EDUCATION, AND LOWER INTEREST RATES TO HOME-BUYERS. THIS BUDGET IS JUST MORE OF THE SAME."

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~~HUMPHREY MAINTAINED THAT~~ THE PRESIDENT'S ATTEMPT TO POSE
AS A FRIEND OF THE WORKER, WHILE ENACTING POLICIES AGAINST
WORKERS' INTERESTS, AMOUNTED TO DECEPTION.

"THE PRESIDENT DOES NOT LEVEL WITH YOU," HE TOLD THE
CONFERENCE. "HE TELLS YOU THAT HE IS CUTTING SPENDING, BECAUSE
IT IS THE ONLY WAY TO CONTROL INFLATION. BUT HE IS NOT CONTROLLING
INFLATION.

"GROCERY COSTS ARE HIGHER. MEDICAL COSTS ARE HIGHER,
RENTS ARE HIGHER, GASOLINE IS HIGHER. ONLY PROGRAMS FOR
PEOPLE -- AND THE RATE OF WAGE INCREASES ARE LOWER.

"THE PRESIDENT TELLS YOU HE IS RETURNING 'POWER TO THE PEOPLE.' BUT THE PRESIDENT'S POLICY, AS REVEALED IN HIS BUDGET, IS NOT TO RETURN POWER TO THE PEOPLE. IT IS TO RETURN PROBLEMS OF NATIONAL SCOPE BACK TO STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS WHICH HAVE INADEQUATE RESOURCES TO SOLVE THEM.

L "THE PRESIDENT TELLS YOU THAT HE IS DETERMINED NOT TO HAVE A TAX INCREASE AT THE FEDERAL LEVEL. SO HE SHOVS PROBLEMS BACK TO STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT WHERE THEY'RE EITHER TO BE IGNORED OR YOUR PROPERTY TAXES WILL HAVE TO BE RAISED TO PAY THE BILLS."

~~HUMPHREY ASSERTED THAT THE PRESIDENT, IN CUTTING BACK PROGRAMS, IS ACTING "TRUE TO REPUBLICAN FORM -- LIKE A CORPORATION PRESIDENT WHO CUTS BACK WAGES AND BENEFITS BECAUSE HIS OWN MISMANAGEMENTS THREATEN TO CUT INTO HIS PROFITS.~~

"THE ADMINISTRATION HAS MISMANAGED THE ECONOMY FOR FOUR YEARS, TO THE TUNE OF \$100 BILLION IN DEFICITS, SO IT DECIDES THAT PROGRAMS WHICH BENEFIT PEOPLE MUST BE CUT BACK," HE SAID.

"THE ADMINISTRATION IMPOUNDS FUNDS. IT TERMINATES PROGRAMS. ITS ADVISERS HIDE FROM THE CONGRESS BEHIND EXECUTIVE PRIVILEGE. ITS BUDGET IS DEVELOPED BEHIND CLOSED DOORS.

THE ADMINISTRATION'S BIG-BUSINESS MENTALITY ALSO SHAPES THE WAY IN WHICH THE BUDGET IS PUT TOGETHER, AS WELL AS ITS SUBSTANCE.

~~THE FORMER VICE PRESIDENT CHARGED THAT~~ ALL OF THESE
ACTIONS RESULT FROM THE ADMINISTRATION'S DISTRUST OF THE
ABILITY OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE, REPRESENTED BY CONGRESS, TO
