MOST EXCITING AND FASCINATING COMMUNICATIONS MEDIUM IN AMERICA TODAY. LI'VE WATCHED IT GROW FROM A SIMPLE ANTENNA PLACED HIGH ON A HILL TO PROVIDE IMPROVED TV RECEPTION INTO A MAJOR MEDIUM IN ITS OWN RIGHT -- ORIGINATING PROGRAMMING, COVERING LOCAL NEWS AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS AND OPENING UP NEW COMMUNICATIONS CHANNELS FOR THEPUBLIC TO USE.

GOMMUNICATIONS USES OF CABLE TV -- SUCH
AS MEDICAL SERVICES, SHOPPING AND BANKING
FROM HOME AND FIRE AND BURGLAR ALARM
SYSTEMS. IN JUST A FEW YEARS, DOMESTIC
SATELLITES WILL BE IN PLACE, EXPANDING

EVEN MORE THE CAPABILITIES OF CABLE FOR

SERVING SPECIALIZED AUDIENCES WITH

SPECIALIZED PROGRAMMING. I'VE ALSO HEARD

ABOUT PAY-TV ON CABLE WHERE THE VIEWER

CAN PAY A PREMIUM TO WATCH MOVIES OR SPORTS

ATTRACTIONS WITHOUT THE INTERRUPTION OF

COMMERCIALS.

ONE AREA OF CABLE TV IS OF PARTICULAR
INTEREST TO ME -- THAT IS POLITICAL CABLE CASTING. A CALEBOAR FOREPUBLIC OF CABLE OFFERS AN ATTRACTIVE ALTERNATIVE TO EXPENSIVE OVER THE AIR BROADGAST TIME. AS YOU WIRE MORE AND MORE HOMES, AND GROW WELL BEYOND YOUR PRESENT TEN PERCENT SHARE OF TV HOMES, I BELIEVE MORE AND MORE CANDIDATES WILL BE LOOKING TOWARD CABLE TV AS THEIR PRIMARY VISUAL MEDIUM FOR CAMPAIGN MESSAGES.

INDEED, THE POTENTIAL FOR SERVICE TO THE PUBLIC VIA CABLE IS FANTASTIC --THE LIMITATIONS, AS I UNDERSTAND THEM, ARE THE LIMITATIONS OF HUMAN IMAGINATION. THIS IS WHAT MAKES CABLE UNIQUE IN THE FIELD OF COMMUNICATIONS, LTHIS IS ALSO WHAT MAKES CABLE PROBABLY THE LAST HOPE OF DEVELOPING A SANE AND RATIONAL COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM FOR THIS COUNTRY, WHICH WILL NOT ONLY SERVE THE COMMUNICATIONS NEEDS OF THE PUBLIC BUT ALSO WILL ALLOW THE PUBLIC TO PARTICIPATE AS NO OTHER MEDIUM CAN OR HAS UNTIL NOW.

POTENTIAL SERVICES AND FANTASTIC

POSSIBILITIES ARE ONE THING -- DELIVERING

ON THAT POTENTIAL IS ANOTHER. FROM WHAT

I HAVE SEEN, THE CABLE TELEVISION INDUSTRY

IS MADE UP, ON THE MOST PART, OF INNOVATIVE

WHO TOOK AN IDEA, PUT IT TO USE AND MADE IT PAY OFF. AND, I BELIEVE YOU CAN DO THE SAME THING WITH ALL THESE NEW SERVICES. WHEN YOU OFFER A VIABLE ALTERNATIVE TO TODAY'S TELEVISION FARE, THE VIEWING PUBLIC WILL BEAT A STEADY PATH TO YOUR CABLE. I URGE YOU TO OFFER THE PUBLIC THAT CHOICE. I'M SURE YOU WILL NOT BE DISAPPOINTED IN THE RESPONSE.

WE HERE IN WASHINGTON LOOK TO YOU AS BUSINESSMEN TO RECOGNIZE THE VALUE OF DEVELOPING SUCH SERVICES. WITHOUT THAT DEVELOPMENT, CABLE TV WILL REMAIN.

ESSENTIALLY A RECEPTION SERVICE AND WILL FIND IT VERY DIFFICULT TO EXPAND INTO THE MAJOR MARKETS, YOU WILL FIND IT VERY

as I see it,

CABLE TELEVISION SYSTEMS ARE MORE THAN AN ORDINARY UTILITY. THEY ARE A VITAL PUBLIC SERVICE.

BELIEVE YOU WILL HAVE TO BRING TO BEAR ALL OF YOUR

INNOVATIVE AND CREATIVE TALENTS IN OPERATING AND EXPAND-

ING YOUR SYSTEMS IN ORDER THAT THE PUBLIC IS FULLY

SERVED. IN THE ABSENCE OF THAT THERE WILL BE A

TEMPTATION ON THE PART OF MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT TO

OWN AND OPERATE CABLE TELEVISION.

IN THIS CONNECTION, I MUST CAUTION MY FRIENDS

IN MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT THAT CABLE TELEVISION IS

DEFINITELY NOT JUST ANOTHER UTILITY.

INTRODUCING GOVERNMENT OWNERSHIP OF A COMMUNICATIONS MEDIA IS A VERY SERIOUS MATTER BECAUSE IT IS
FRAUGHT WITH PROBLEMS FOREMOST OF WHICH ARE FREEDOM
OF SPEECH AND CENSORSHIP.

BE SUCCESSFUL UNLESS YOU FILE A NEED,
SUPPLY A SERVICE THAT IS IN DEMAND.

BELIEVE THE NEED IS THERE AND THE DEMAND

FOR YOUR SERVICES WILL BE TREMENDOUS.

ONCE YOU SUPPLY THEM:

WE ALL LOOK FORWARD TO THE DAY WHEN ALL THE MAJOR MARKETS HAVE CABLE SERVICE. THAT HAS BEEN THE CONTEXT OF THIS DISCUSSION UP TO THIS POINT. BUT THERE IS ANOTHER LARGE SEGMENT OF AMERICAN SOCIETY THAT NO LESS DESERVES THE OPPORTUNITY TO JOIN IN THE MAINSTREAM OF COMMUNICATIONS SERVICE. IT IS A SEGMENT OF SOCIETY THAT I'M AFRAID WE OFTENTIMES IGNORE -- THE RURAL AMERICAN.

-7- 001562 As america moves from an industrial SOCIETY TOWARD A MORE SERVICE-ORIENTED SOCIETY, COMMUNICATIONS IS BEING RECOGNIZED AS PERHAPS THE MOST CRITICAL FACTOR -WITHOUT A BASIC COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM THAT SERVES ALL OF SOCIETY, MANY PEOPLE WILL BE LEFT OUT OF THE ACTION THEIR LOT WILL BE INFERIOR SERVICES IN THE AREAS OF HEALTH, EDUCATION, ENTERTAINMENT, BUSINESS OPPORTUNITIES AND EMPLOYMENT. ZRURAL AMERICANS WILL BE LIMITED IN WHAT THEY CAN AGGOMPLISH -- THEY WILL BE DENIED EQUAL ACCESS TO AND EQUITY OF GOVERNMENT SERVICES.

LIN BOTH THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE, BILLS HAVE BEEN INTRODUCED TO PROVIDE FOR LOW COST LOANS TO CABLE SYSTEMS TO ALLOW THEM TO PROFITABLY WIRE THE RURAL AREAS OF THIS NATION, SENATOR GRAVEL'S BILL

AND CONGRESSMAN TIERNAN'S WOULD AMEND THE COMMUNICATIONS ACT OF 1934 TO PROVIDE AN INCENTIVE TO A CABLE OPERATOR TO EXTEND HIS CABLE LINES INTO SPARSELY POPULATED AREAS WITH A LOW DENSITY OF HOMES PER MILE THESE ARE FINE AS FAR AS THEY GO, BUT THEY ARE LIMITED TO CABLE. WHAT I AM WORKING TOWARD IS A LARGER SCALE EFFORT, IN WHICH CABLE PLAYS AN IMPORTANT PART, BUT AN EFFORT THAT IS BROADER IN SCOPE.

WE AS A NATION HAVE TO RECOGNIZE THE NEED FOR A MORE BALANCED NATIONAL GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT THAT ISOLATES NO ONE SEGMENT OF SOCIETY IN FAVOR OF ANOTHER.

I AM NOW CIRCULATING FOR COMMENT A DRAFT entitled the Bolonced Notional Growth and Development of A BILL THAT WOULD PROVIDE FOR NEW ACT

PLANNED GROWTH IN AMERICA. THIS IS A GOAL OF CONGRESS -- TO ENSURE THAT EVERYONE HAS A PIECE OF THE ACTION, THAT EVERYONE HAS EQUAL ACCESS TO GOVERNMENT SERVICES AND EQUAL TREATMENT BEFORE THE FEDERAL AGENCIES.

THE PROPOSED BALANCED NATIONAL GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1973 WAS GENERATED AS A RESULT OF DISAPPOINTMENTS WITH THE PERFORMANCE OF THIS ADMINISTRATION NOW IN OFFICE. APPROPRIATION REQUESTS FOR EURDING GRANTS AND LOANS FOR RUBAL DEVELOPMENT WERE DISGRACEFULLY LOW, AND THE NEED FOR BURAL DEVELOPMENT IS CRITICALLY HIGH.

AN EXTREMELY IMPORTANT PART OF RURAL

DEVELOPMENT IS EXPANSION AND GROWTH OF

CHANNELS OF COMMUNICATION. MY BILL WOULD

PROVIDE FOR -- AMONG OTHER THINGS -- A
BROADBAND COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK THAT
WOULD INCLUDE BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO CABLE
TELEVISION AS WE KNOW IT TODAY.

SUCH A NETWORK, USING COMPUTERS

AND TWO-WAY VOICE AND VIDEO COMMUNICATIONS,

CAN MEAN IMMEDIATE MEDICAL SERVICES IN

TOWNS THAT NOW HAVE NO DOCTOR -- IT CAN

MEAN ACCESS TO COMPUTER TIME FOR A SMALL

TOWN BUSINESSMAN -- AND IT CAN PROVIDE A

LOCAL TELEVISION STUDIO FOR RESIDENTS WHO

MAY NOT HAVE HAD TV RECEPTION, LET ALONE

A STUDIO UP TO NOW.

YOUR INDUSTRY HAS PLAYED AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN DEVELOPING THESE CONCEPTS AND SERVICES. YOU CAN ALSO PLAY AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN THE FUTURE BY BRINGING EQUAL COMMUNICATIONS OPPORTUNITIES TO ALL

AMERICANS. WORKING TOGETHER WE CAN REALIZE
THE LARGER GOAL OF OPENING THE MAINSTREAM
OF SOCIETY TO ALL AMERICANS BY WORKING AT
THE SMALLER GOALS ONE DAY AT A TIME.
REMEMBER, TODAY IS THE FIRST DAY OF THE
REST OF YOUR LIFE. DON'T WASTE IT.
