DINNER FOR MARILYN YOUNG

OUTLINE REMARKS

Marilyn is running for a state legislative seat from suburban Philadelphia -- the 154th legislative district in Montgomery County.

Marilyn Young has been a Democratic Committeewoman since 1960.

She has served as chairperson of her township Democratic Committee and Vice Chairperson of the Montgomery County Democratic Committee.

In 1973, she was elected "Democrat of the Year" by her legislative district.

In 1974 she headed the Democratic Party's very successful state registration drive.

She is now the Governor's regional representative for Southeastern Pennsylvania.

I have come to help Marilyn Young tonight for two important reasons.

First, Marilyn Young is the most qualified and dedicated person the people of the 154th legislative district can send to Harrisburg in November.

Secondly, I have come to help Marilyn Young because she gave her best effort to me in 1972. When many of the leading elected officials of this state, when many of its party leaders chose to back other candidates, Marilyn Young had the courage to run my campaign in this great commonwealth. And we won. We won against tremendous odds and despite all the pundits who said we couldn't do it. I credit Marilyn Young with playing a key role in my primary victory here in 1972. Without her tireless efforts, without her dedication, I could have never carried Pennsylvania.

Now, there is no doubt that Marilyn is a superb organizer and has a great political mind. Afterall, she was the first woman to run and then win a major Presidential primary campaign.

But more important, Marilyn Young is the type of person who will represent well, all the people of this district.

She is a sensitive person and a compassionate person. And believe me, she knows the ins and outs of state government. She will go to Harrisburg committed to working on the problems of the people of suburban Philadelphia. She knows how to get a job done.

During these very difficult times it's so easy for voters to say that when we have so many great national problems, that state legislative races aren't important. I hear too many people saying that it doesn't matter what type of people are elected to serve in our state houses.

Well, these views are not only dangerous, they are wrong. There is no way we can solve the problems of the economy, the problems of urban decay and suburban blight, the problems of rising crime and increasing pollution unless they are tackled at the state level with imagination and vigor.

Yes, we can have broad national policies, but many of the practical solutions which will solve local problems have to come from the local and state governments.

This is where the people live.

This is where the issues are debated. It is sheer folly to expect that the energy crisis can be solved from Washington if we don't have help from Harrisburg.

It is nonsense to think that recession and inflation are problems only in the jurisdiction of the Federal government. Unless state government enters the battle against inflation, the battle will be lost. Unless state government makes a commitment to work against unemployment, the tolls of the jobless will increase at alarming rates. And unless state's exercise budgetary discipline, our budget cutting exercise in Washington will be futile.

There is much work to be done in Harrisburg. There is absolutely no doubt in my mind that Marilyn Young is a woman who recognizes the important role that state government plays in solving the peoples' problems. Send her to Harrisburg and you will be sending dynamo willing to roll up her sleeves and work on your problems.

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
