I cherish my long association with the Hebrew University. has enriched Israel and has made it strong. the physical and spiritual world. and stability of a nation.

This center of learning, research and scholarship

Strength is more than armed might. It is intellectual prowess, dedication to creative thought and insight into

A great university is a vital resource for a nation. The vitality of its academic life is a measure of the health

By these standards alone Israel is strong and prospering.

But tonight it is impossible to talk about the strength and prosperity of the state of Israel without mentioning the Sinai agreement which was recently initialed by Israel and Egypt.

This agreement is a significant step towards peace. We have opened the door of reconciliation between Egypt and Israel.

I applaud the role of Secretary Kissinger in helping to bring about this Agreement. I believe that the risk of superpower confrontation has been lessened and that the prospects for further agreements have been greatly improved.

I believe that the time has come for some frank talk about this Agreement and what obligations it imposes upon the United States.

As part of the Agreement, the United States has agreed to supply a limited number of technicians to serve as peaceful observers in the Israeli and Egyptian installations in the Sinai.

There are some people who disagree with this provision of the Agreement and who say that if the technicians are sent we are on the threshold of another Vietnam.

I disagree.

Sending American civilians to the Sinai to serve in an area which is actually in the United Nations buffer zone is not another Vietnam.

These men are not being sent to fight in an insurgency. They are not being sent to train other troops or to advise military commands.

They are going to keep the peace.

They will not be in great physical danger because of their remote position within a buffer zone and beyond the range of weapons allowed in the region.

To be sure, we are taking a risk. Every American life is dear. But this is a risk for peace -- not war.

I am satisfied that these technicians are not the commencement of a commitment of American troops. Israel has never wanted American military personnel and they are not asking for them now.

I will vote to send these technicians to the Middle East and I will urge my colleagues on the Foreign Relations Committee and in the Senate to do so. I am convinced that the preservation of peace in the region is vital to peace in the world.

But I want to add that true peace between Israel and Egypt will take more than an agreement. Yes, these negotiations can restore confidence and trust. But they are no substitute for the personal contacts between peoples which are the true builder and restorers of trust and confidence.

Tonight I would like to make a proposal which I believe would take Israel and Egypt one step further towards peace.

With the official encouragement of the United States, I believe that Israel and Egypt could begin to work together on a broad range of educational and scientific projects in the Sinai and in the region for the betterment of their peoples.

- -- Israel has special capability in the fields of desalinization and land reclamation. These could be shared with Egyptian scientists.
- -- There is no reason why the Hebrew University and the University of Cairo could not begin to share information and develop exchange programs in the field of health care and medical research. I know that the Hebrew University has a research program on the dreaded Nile River parasitic disease call bilharzia. This work of Israeli scientists could be of great benefit to Egyptian scientists and to the people of the Nile River basin.
- -- The exceptional work of Hadassah Hospital could be expanded to treat patients from neighboring Arab countries in an effort to directly aid those in special need.
- -- Finally, both Moslem and Jewish scholars could expand their cooperative efforts at archaeological sites in the region, since this discipline is so important to both Israel and Egypt.

These projects could be the first step towards Israeli-Egyptian reconciliation. The way has been paved by the recent Sinai Agreement. The time has come for the people of these two countries to join their diplomats in making peace. They do not need conference tables. Nor do they need special shuttle diplomacy. All that is necessary is the will to begin, to work together in the pursuit of peaceful ends to help each other.

There is a lesson for both Israelis and Egyptians in Henry Kissinger's successes in international diplomacy. They have been founded on close personal contact with heads of state. These contacts foster trust and confidence.

This is the technique I am proposing tonight on a non-governmental scale.

Let Israeli and Egyptian doctors, scientists, archaeologists, farmers begin working together and the time will not be distant when Prime Minister Rabin and President Sadat face each other across the table.

This type of contact does not involve territory, troop placements or concession by either side. It has to do with understanding among people as the key to peace.

We have turned the corner of peace in the Middle East. The next step is to preserve the peace that we have worked so hard to create.

SRAEL HAS SPECIAL CAPABILITY IN THE FIELDS OF DESALINIZATION AND LAND RECLAMATION & THESE COULD BE SHARED WITH EGYPTIAN SCIENTISTS and technicians, /-- THERE IS NO REASON WHY THE HEBREW UNIVERSITY AND THE UNIVERSITY OF CAIRO COULD NOT BEGIN TO SHARE INFORMATION AND DEVELOP EXCHANGE PROGRAMS IN THE FIELD OF HEALTH CARE AND MEDICAL RESEARCH I KNOW THAT THE HEBREW UNIVERSITY HAS A RESEARCH PROGRAM ON THE DREADED NILE RIVER PARASITIC DISEASE THIS WORK OF ISRAELI SCIENTISTS COULD BE OF GREAT BENEFIT TO EGYPTIAN SCIENTISTS AND TO THE PEOPLE OF THE NILE RIVER BASIN.

THE EXCEPTIONAL WORK OF HADASSAH HOSPITAL COULD BE EXPANDED TO TREAT PATIENTS FROM NEIGHBORING ARAB COUNTRIES IN AN EFFORT TO DIRECTLY AID THOSE IN SPECIAL NEED.

THEY HAVE BEEN FOUNDED ON CLOSE PERSONAL CONTACT WITH HEADS

OF STATE. THESE CONTACTS FOSTER TRUST AND CONFIDENCE.

This is the technique I am proposing tonight on a

NON-GOVERNMENTAL SCALE.

LET ISRAELI AND EGYPTIAN DOCTORS, SCIENTISTS,

ARCHAEOLOGISTS, FARMERS BEGIN WORKING TOGETHER AND THE

TIME WILL NOT BE DISTANT WHEN PRIME MINISTER RABIN AND

PRESIDENT SADAT FACE EACH OTHER ACROSS THE TABLE.

THIS TYPE OF CONTACT DOES NOT INVOLVE TERRITORY,

TROOP PLACEMENTS OR CONCESSIONS BY EITHER SIDE, IT HAS

TO DO WITH UNDERSTANDING AMONG PEOPLE AS THE KEY TO PEACE.

WE HAVE TURNED THE CORNER OF PEACE IN THE MIDDLE

EAST, THE NEXT STEP IS TO PRESERVE THE PEACE THAT WE

HAVE WORKED SO HARD TO CREATE.

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
