## Contract and Agreement for Assignment of Territorial Selling Rights for

## Watters Gas Savers and Carbon Removers

O. D. by Express or Parcel Post, as follows:

\_\_\_\_\_ or more Gas Savers which are hereby ordered to be shipped at once upon receipt of this contract by the G. M. WATTERS MANUFACTURING WORKS at Minneapolis, Minnesota, party of the first part,

\_\_\_\_\_ or more Gas Savers to be shipped and paid for as above stated, thirty (30) days from date of first shipment.

\_\_\_\_\_ Gas savers to be shipped and paid for as above stated, \_\_\_\_\_, 191\_\_\_\_\_, and the G. M. Watters Manufacturing Works, party of the first part, agrees to promptly make all such shipments unless prevented from so doing by fire, strikes and other unforeseen emergencies and circumstances beyond their control.

The party of the second part agrees to promptly receive all said Gas Savers so shipped and protect the party of the first part from any and all loss or damage by reason of failure on his part to promptly receive the goods and meet the payments on all goods as above specified.

In consideration of which the said G. M. WATTERS MANUFACTURING WORKS, party of the first part, hereby grants unto \_\_\_\_\_ party of the second part, the exclusive selling rights of their Gas Savers and Carbon Removers covering the City or County of \_\_\_\_\_ State of \_\_\_\_\_, and nowhere else, during the period of this contract and for such further length of time as the party of the second part shall order and pay for, a minimum of at least \_\_\_\_\_ said Gas Savers, during each succeeding month after \_\_\_\_\_, 191\_\_\_\_\_. This contract is not an assignment of territory, patent right or interest therein.

PROVIDED FURTHER, and it is mutually understood and agreed that in case of failure on the part of the party of the second part to order, receive and pay for any and all goods shipped under the terms of this agreement, the party of the first part may at once terminate this agreement by written notice of said termination mailed to the last post office address of the party of the second part.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the party of the second part may reinstate this agreement by renewing the orders and payments as above provided within ten days after receipt of said notice.

THE G. M. WATTERS MANUFACTURING WORKS, party of the first part, agrees not to appoint another agency or to sell the Watters Gas Saver and Carbon Remover in the above City, County or Counties so long as these conditions are fully complied with by the party of the second part.

It is further mutually and specially agreed that no written or verbal agreement whatsoever not herein mentioned shall be binding upon either the party of the first part or party of the second part.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING  
August 27, 1918

There were present Chairman Calderwood, Mrs. Calderwood, and Messrs. Haggard, Morrow, Nelson and Wells; visiting, National Chairman Hinshaw and Clarence W. Halbert, State Chairman of the National Party.

The minutes of the meeting of June 25th were read and approved.

The financial reports for weeks ending August 17th and August 24th were read and referred to the auditors.

On invitation of the Committee Mr. Halbert presented plans for the cooperation between the State Committee of the National Party and this Committee for the publication of several issues of a campaign paper in the interest of both that party and of the State Prohibition Committee.

His first proposition was that this Committee appropriate \$3,000 out of any available funds for the purchase of advertising space in three issues of 300,000 copies each of a National Party paper.

His second proposition was that we sell the National Party space in the Patriot in which to present the claims of the state candidates of the National Party to the support of the citizens of the state.

Both these propositions were voted down.

A resolution was then adopted promising that if the Committee shall buy space in other papers during this campaign, we shall consider any offer of space in the National Party paper which shall be made by the National Party State Committee.

The time was extended.

The salary of Chairman Calderwood was fixed at \$60 per week (and outside expenses when engaged in work for this Committee) beginning June 22nd, the date of the opening of the automobile street campaign. It was understood that the Chairman in addition to his services in behalf of the Committee should be free to give considerable time to his personal campaign for the United States senatorship.

Messrs. Morrow and Nelson and Mrs. Calderwood




#2 -- Executive Committee Meeting, August 27, 1918

were made a committee to consider the matter of newspaper publicity during the campaign and to report on the same at a special meeting on Thursday noon.

Chairman Calderwood reported that in the poorest of recent weeks of the automobile street campaign 118 meetings were held, with an attendance of 5667, that 2883 hands had been raised as expressing the belief that the localities visited would be carried for the amendment, and collections amounting to \$283.52 were taken. The expenses for the time, outside of the salaries of the speakers and drivers, were \$279.05.
