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Permanent peace cannot abide under economic autocracy or where social injustice is tolerated. If peace, justice and good will are to dominate the lives of the American people in the future we must elect to high office men who are imbued with the spirit of the times, who will support our President in his peace program, as well as in his plans for the destruction of political autocracy. By conviction and by pledge Mr. Calderwood is committed to President Wilson's program for the solution of our peace problems and for the efficient prosecution of the war to a victorious peace. We believe that the best interests of the people of the State and of the Nation demand his election.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING August 27. 1918 There were present Chairman Calderwood. Mrs. Calderwood, and Messrs. Haggard, Morrow, Nelson and Wells; visiting, National Chairman Hinshaw and Clarence W. Halbert. State Chairman of the National Party. The minutes of the meeting of June 25th were read and approved. The financial reports for weeks ending August 17th and August 24th were read and referred to the auditors. On invitation of the Committee Mr. Halbert presented plans for the cooperation between the State Committee of the National Party and this Committee for the publication of several issues of a campaign paper in the interest of both that party and of the State Prohibition Committee. His first proposition was that this Committee appropriate \$3,000 out of any available funds for the purchase of advertising space in three issues of 300,000 copies each of a National Party paper. His second proposition was that we sell the National Party space in the Patriot in which to present the claims of the state candidates of the National Party to the support of the citizens of the state. Both these propositions were voted down. A resolution was then adopted promising that if the Committee shall buy space in other papers during this campaign, we shall consider any offer of space in the National Party paper which shall be made by the National Party State Committee. The time was extended. The salary of Chairman Calderwood was fixed at \$60 per week (and putside expenses when engaged in work for this Committee) beginning June 22nd. the date of the opening of the automobile street campaign. It was understood that the Chairman in addition to his services in behalf of the Committee should be free to give considerable time to his personal campaign for the United States senatorship. Messrs. Morrow and Nelson and Mrs. Calderwood

#2 -- Executive Committee Meeting. August 27. 1918 were made a committee to consider the matter of newspaper publicity during the campaign and to report on the same at a special meeting on Thursday noon. Chairman Calderwood reported that in the poorest of recent weeks of the automobile street campaign 118 meetings were held, with an attendance of 5667. that 2883 hands had been raised as expressing the belief that the localities visited would be carried for the amendment, and collections amounting to \$283.52 were taken. The expenses for the time, outside of the salaries of the speakers and drivers, were \$279.05. Adjourned to Thursday noon.

STATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING. At Headquarters Nov. 8th, 1918. Present: Chairman Mrs. W. G. Calderwood. Messrs. Stageberg, Dorsett, Stromme, Haggard and Wells. The financial report for October 12th to 31st inclusive was read and referred to the Auditing Committee. The Chairman made an informal statement as to the financial relations existing between this Committee and the State Dry Federation, showing that a considerable amount of money had been collected and would be collected by that organization on pledges taken by this Committee to be divided between the two organizations upon the basis heretofore agreed upon. The Chairman made a report of the Committee's activities during the campaign. See report. He also made an informal report of the status of the Amendment votes. An informal discussion followed as to the work of the Committee in case later returns should show that the Amendment had carried. Motion was adopted directing the vacating of the rooms 802-3 Sykes Block and the sale of such furniture as can be spared. After receiving statement by the Chairman of the character and amount of unpaid pledges on hand, the method of proceedure to collect the same was left to him.

Haggard, Stageberg and Wells were made a Committee to formulate resolutions regarding the charges and insinuations made against Chairman Calderwood during the recent campaign, and to name a Committee to investigate the same and report to this Committee.
