The regulation proposed for amendment, may be found in the Constitution and General Laws, page 32, Article IV, Subjects OTHER OFFICERS AND DIVAN. At the end of the copy of the proposed amendment, in the last paragraph, you will find the certification, whereby each Temple is to record their action taken on the proposed amendment. This proposed amendment was sent, by our current Imperial Legal Advisor, James Jackson, Sr., to all Imperial Council Elected and Appointed Officers, all Temple Illustrious Potentates, and and Appointed Officers, all Temple Illustrious Potentates, and many Past Potentates, FOR THEIR INFORMATION, several weeks prior to the opening date of the recent 1963 Pittsburgh Imperial Council Session. On Friday, August 23, 1963, Noble James Jackson, Sr. of Marracci Temple #13, formally presented this proposed amendment to the assembled 62nd Annual Imperial Council Session, by reading the proposal in its entirety; explaining the necessity for such a regulation and offered a motion, which was duly seconded, that it be mimeographed and sent to all Temples for their action thereon, by approval or disapproval, by the membership of the Temple, taken at a regular meeting, after due notice had been given. - 1 -

### TIME LIMIT

In order that the office of Imperial Recorder not be rushed in preparing a report on this subject for the next Imperial Council Session, at the time when other Imperial Council business, reports and etcetera are being formulated and prepared, (from May 1st to August 10th, 1964), I am requesting that all Illustrious Potentates read this proposed amendment at the meuting of their Temple in the months of either January or February. Send notices immediately thereafter to the entire Temple membership, that they will be given an opportunity to vote on the same, either in the months of February or March (must be definite).

Immediately thereafter, that portion of the proposal, specified for the actions of the Temple, must be executed and returned to the office of the Imperial Recorder

PLEASE HAVE THE ACTION TAKEN BY THE TEMPLE IN THE OFFICE OF THE IMPERIAL RECORDER IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE MARCH MEETING OF THE TEMPLE.

In the past, on subjects of this nature, there have always been 15 or 20 Temples who never send the actions taken by the Temple and 15 or 20 others, who delay their actions until May or June, thereby not filing their reports until July and even August. DO NOT PERMIT YOUR TEMPIE TO BE IN ANY OF THESE CLASSIFICATIONS.

Remember the time for filing this report.

Dear Sir and Nobles:

These proposed amendments are submitted with the hope that you will immediately approve them and return the copy with your approval certified thereon to the Imperial Recorder. The last Imperial Council year demonstrated to us the weakness in our rules for management of the Imperial Council between Imperial Council Sessions, and these amendments are intended to correct this situation. If these amendments are adopted, it will assure the following things:

- Deputies, Program and Project Directors will be appointed within Ten (10) days after the Annual Imperial Council Sessions and their duties outlined to them.
- Temples and all Imperial Council Officers will receive, at least, Three (3) reports each year, of the activities of the Imperial Council between sessions.
- 3. The power to call Conference Divan Meetings will not rest solely upon the will of the Imperial Potentate and the whole domain will recieve the benefit of the unified efforts of its top officers.
- The business and fiscal affairs of the Imperial Council will be reviewed at least four times each year.

Article 1, Page 3, of the Constitution places the Government of the Mystic Shrine in the hands of the Imperial Council and we, as members of the Imperial Council, have a sacred duty to make certain that the work of the Imperial Council will be carried on between Imperial Council Sessions. I ask your serious consideration of these amendments,
