THE STERLING CLUB, INC. 1919 – 1994 A HISTORICAL REVIEW

In November of 1918, a group of "Negro" men gathered to organize a Corporation. They elected as officers the following:

Joseph E. Johnson, President
Fredrick D. McCracken, Vice President
Bismark C. Archer, Secretary
O. D. Howard, Treasurer

A nine-member Board of Directors conducted the affairs of the Corporation during its first existing year. Those Directors were:

Orrington D. Hall Hammond Turner Richard A. Anderson Clarence W. Wigington Howard F. McIntyre Dwight T. Reed W. E. Alexander Walter R. Dyer William B. Tandy

The following year, the group sought incorporation by making an application to the State of Minnesota. According to the original Articles of Incorporation presented, under Article I:

"Section 1. The name of this Corporation shall be The Sterling Club."

"Section 2. The general purpose and plan of operation shall be to own, lease, in whole or in part, acquire, operate, use, mortgage, pledge, sell, assign, transfer or otherwise dispose of real estate and buildings necessary, expedient or proper to maintain a clubhouse; to promote and encourage all manly sports and physical culture, and to conduct a Club for the purpose of providing refreshment, entertainment, exercise and social diversions of its members."

"Section 3. The place of location shall be the City of St. Paul, in the County of Ramsey and the State of Minnesota."

The Sterling Club, incorporated on August 28, 1919, was the beginning of The Sterling Club as we know it today.

Due to abject discrimination, there were few places "blacks" could go for entertainment and socializing. The membership, reflecting an occupational diversity which included railroad men, white collar workers and professionals, met at the Odd Fellows Hall, which later became known as Hallie Q. Brown Community Center.

In 1926, seven years after its incorporation, and despite objections of many local residents who attempted to block construction, thinking it would become "just another joint," The Sterling Club had a clubhouse built on a site near the intersection of Dale and Rondo (Concordia) Streets. The land on which the clubhouse was built was deeded to the Club on December 31, 1924 by Elmer Morris, Sr., a St. Paul druggist. Clarence W. Wigington, Board Member and a leading architect for the City of St. Paul, designed the clubhouse in compliance with the existing building codes of the community. The clubhouse was constructed as a residential dwelling, complete with a kitchen and a bathroom that included a bath tub.

On April 6, 1926, a series of One-hundred fifty "Third Mortgage Gold Bond" certificates in the amount of \$40.00 were issued to members in good standing. This helped defray mortgage costs. Bond coupons were redeemable every six months at the rate of four percent per annum, payable semi-monthly. Hammond Turner, Frank B. Simpson and Clarence Roper were trustees for the Secured Third Mortgage Trust Deed and Fredrick D. McCracken was President at the time. Efforts of this kind demonstrated a determination to have a progressive and successful Club.

n The Sterling Club's initial years there were several membership classifications – life, resident, non-resident, associate and honorary. A resident member enjoyed full rights, privileges and courtesies. Conditional variations applied to the remaining membership, i.e., a non-resident member paid initiation fees and was assessed for entertainment events, but did not pay dues or have voting privileges. Membership classifications were modified in 1959 to recognize the sole classification of "regular" member.

Original members represented a stable cross-section of the "colored" community and the Club more than served the needs of its membership in civic and social affairs. The classic annual dinners, in-house parties and other social/civic functions soon fostered a perception of the Club as prestigious. Candidate "forums" for those seeking political office were sponsored by The Sterling Club, even though it was non political and had a policy of not endorsing political candidates or parties, a policy that remains in effect today. Although other social/civic groups were allowed to rent the clubhouse, those group functions were monitored closely.

During the great depression all did not fare well for The Sterling Club. Financial difficulties were encountered which caused membership to face the possibility of losing ownership. In an effort to thwart this possibility, membership qualifications and initiation fees were relaxed, thus increasing membership.

Amid its financial woes and as a possible solution, the Club considered leasing the clubhouse to other civic/social organizations but this action never matured. In May, 1933, the Club refinanced its mortgage with the Minnesota Building and Loan Association. This firm displayed exceptional leniency by accepting past due and partial payments until the mortgage was eventually amortized.

Individually, and in small groups, wives of the members of The Sterling Club, active since early 1930 and organized as the Ladies Auxiliary in mid-1930, played a pivotal role in raising additional revenue. The Auxiliary charged admission for cabaret-style Friday and Saturday nights at the clubhouse, complete with a band, food, beverages and social games. This gigantic effort also helped save the Club from mortgage foreclosure. At its regular meeting, held March 2, 1937, the President of The Sterling Club requested that the secretary write Mrs. R. F. Wilson, President of the Ladies Auxiliary, a letter of thanks for the Auxiliary's financial assistance. This was only one of many occasions that the Auxiliary was thanked for financial assistance.

During the early 1930s there also existed a Junior Sterling Club. This structured group of young men, who provided their own agenda and an avenue for future members, often made financial contributions to the Club.

The Sterling Club survived World War II and continued to flourish long after the war. Prosperity prevailed and membership increased. Competition with outside forms of entertainment and the lifting of racial discriminatory practices in some public places had little effect on The Sterling Club's vitality.

Urban renewal during the sixties and seventies displaced many in the "black" community. The Sterling Club was no exception. The last meeting was conducted in its original clubhouse on December 14, 1976. Subsequently, the structure was razed and members met at various locations for a period of two years.

An appointed Building Committee, comprised of present members Ben L. Alexander, Otto T. Burroughs, Richard M. Mann, Charles W. Bradley, former member Herman P. Bailey, and late members Anthony M. Saunders and John L. Banks, was charged with site selections, contracting, building starts and completions, while working with the St. Paul Housing and Redevelopment Authority and various City officials. This Building Committee, which completed its task in a creditable fashion, greatly facilitated the move to the present clubhouse.

On June 24, 1978, a ground-breaking ceremony was held at the new site of The Sterling Club, which was attended by many of its members. Ben L. Alexander, President, and Charles W. Bradley, Building Committee Chairman, made commentary regarding the old and new clubhouses. The Auxiliary was represented by President Jewell Alexander. A prayer was given by the Reverend Chester L.Talton, rector, St. Philips Episcopal Church.

At the new facility, located on three lots, 120' x 124', on the southeast corner of Carroll and St. Albans Streets, constructed by August Construction Company, The Sterling Club held its first meeting on December 3, 1978. Ben L. Alexander presided and Charles W. Bradley served as Chairman of the Board of Directors. As the Club settled into its new location, the established annual agenda was soon renewed. The Annual Meeting (a By-Law requirement) highlights major events. The "State of the Club" financial forecast and major plans for the coming year are reported by the President. A full financial report on past and current treasury status is made by the Treasurer. Other business is also conducted at this Annual Meeting.

Aside from the annual meeting, scheduled annual events are an Invitational golf tournament, initiated by Levi L. Brady in August, 1984, a week-end fishing trip, a bowling outing, fund raisers, dinner-dance, award presentations, and New Year's Eve and Super Bowl parties. Other events also occur during the course of the year.

The Sterling Club carries an average membership of fifty-nine, with the present classification of regular, lifetime and honorary. Candidates for membership are sponsored by a current member or members. Club familiarization, such as a prior Club visit, attendance at a Club function, or having been introduced to current members are considered criteria. The Board of Directors serves as a screening body. After a candidate for membership is approved by the Board, the General body casts secret ballots to accept or reject the candidate.

Board members are elected by the general body at the regular meeting each November. Terms for Board members are staggered. Three members are elected for three years, three members for two years and three members for one year. Thereafter, three regular members are elected annually for three-year terms.

Effective with the election in November, 1987, the term for President, Vice President, Secretary, Financial Secretary and Treasurer is two years.

The general body and the Board of Directors hold their respective meetings on a regular monthly basis. The Sterling Club By-Laws are updated periodically to reflect the changing times that affect policies and procedures. Over the past two decades, these changes averaged five years.

As part of its on-going civic involvement, The Sterling Club recognizes exceptional community achievement. Dr. Floyd Massey, former pastor of Pilgrim Baptist Church, was the club's first recipient of its "Man of the Year Award" in 1964. The Club's award presentation was suspended and then reinstated in 1987 as "St. Paul Citizen for Outstanding Service to the Community" when Ronald Wesley Pauline received the award. In six subsequent years, this award was bestowed upon six others who were distinguished for serving the community: James S. Griffin, 1988, William R. Finney, 1989, Clarence W. Wigington, posthumously, 1990, Curman L. Gaines, 1991, Beverly O. Hawkins, 1992, and Martin O. Weddington, 1993.

Another phase of civic involvement is offering the use of the Club facility to community organizations for meetings, socials and receptions.

To honor an outstanding, conscientious and dedicated member, a recreation parlor, located on the lower level of the clubhouse, was named for John L. Banks. During his membership, John served in practically every capacity, held various offices and responsibilities and was regarded by fellow members as a stalwart willing to do whatever was needed for the good of the Club. John L. Banks died March 4, 1992.

Recognition of members of The Sterling Club has also been acknowledged by the St. Paul City Council. The late Jimmy Lee, former long-term m ember and sports official, was honored, posthumously, when the former "Oxford Recreation Center" was dedicated the "Jimmy Lee Recreation Center" September 21, 1980. James L. Griffin's achievements in the sports world and as a St. Paul School Board member were recognized by dedication of the stadium at Central High School "James S. Griffin Stadium" on August 30, 1988.

Almost from its inception, The Sterling Club developed social awareness in the community and tried reaching out to people in need. On May 1, 1980, the Club proposed the establishment of The Sterling Club Charitable Fund to consolidate its benevolent endeavors and to gain Recognition of Exemption status. A Declaration of Trust was made June 1, 1980 by its newly appointed trustees, Otto T. Burroughs, Harold L. Finch and Paul L. Wood. The application for Recognition of Exemption was approved October 16, 1980.

At the commencement of The Sterling Club Charitable Fund, its financial support was from cash donations made by individual members. It is now funded mainly by a set-aside-fund from the Club. A wide range of charitable donations are granted each year. The most frequent requests are from organizations sponsoring academic scholarships and institutions rendering funds for "at risk" youth programs. A Charitable Fund Committee processes requests and recommends selected requests for action. Most recommendations favor African-American and community-based groups.

The Sterling Club, while granting charitable gifts, has received an abundant number of benefits from members and friends. In March, 1941, a generous monetary gift was bequeathed to the Club from the estate of Mrs. Florence Brown. Over the lifetime of the Club many others have supported the Club with generous gifts of money, furnishings, works of art and other club-related memorabilia.

As in the 1930s, The Sterling Club Auxiliary remains a strong adjunct and enthusiastically supports the Club's objectives. The Auxiliary recognizes three membership classifications: Participating Auxiliary membership, Life membership and Honorary membership. Auxiliary membership is exclusively limited to the current wife of a current member of The Sterling Club, and to the widow of a deceased member, if the widow was a Participating Auxiliary Member at the time of her husband's death. Auxiliary monthly meetings coincide with the meetings of The Sterling Club. Present Participating membership totals forty-four, with three Honorary memberships.

Many able and highly motivated women have served as President of The Sterling Club Auxiliary. None have served with more dedication than present member, Mrs. Jewell Alexander. Elected to the presidency in the 1960s, Mrs. Alexander served the Auxiliary in that office over twenty years. Under her leadership the Auxiliary became strong and cohesive with an annual program that included fundraising events, charitable donations to social agencies, social events at the clubhouse that included family members as well as members of the community, an annual picnic at Cedar Lake Farms, an annual cocktail and New Year's Eve party. For many years the site of the annual St. Philips Episcopal Church Palm Sunday Tea and Musicale was the clubhouse of The Sterling Club. The Auxiliary was instrumental in securing participants and assisting church members with the refreshments.

The present Auxiliary, now known as the Women's Auxiliary, rather than the Ladies Auxiliary, has continued to embrace the type of annual programs initiated during Mrs. Alexander's presidency. Fruit baskets are now distributed to sick, shut-in and honorary members. Contributions of non-perishable food are made to area food shelves. Monetary contributions are made to women's shelters and to other Twin Cities social agencies, as well as to the American Cancer Society.

Fund-raising events include excursions to various midwest area locations and an annual raffle. Financial assistance is offered to The Sterling Club on an annual basis for re-furnishing, re-decorating and other general expenses. The annual cocktail party, an invitational affair held to thank supporters of Sterling Club events, remains the highlight of the summer season.

The Women's Auxiliary By-Laws, subject to periodic revision, now stipulate a two-consecutive-year limit on elected offices, except for special circumstances. Serving as Auxiliary President currently is Mrs. Mari Finney.

The Sterling Club Newsletter, originated by Auxiliary member, Mrs. Daisy Young in December, 1983, is presently edited by Willie P. McCoy, who keeps members apprised of Club concerns, current and future events and membership information. This monthly publication features an article by the Club's President, as well as motivational and inspirational remarks, often furnished by the editor.

Club records verify that many distinguished members have served in various capacities since its inception in 1918 and incorporation in 1919. Club managers in years past have more than fulfilled this distinction in their operation and maintenance of the clubhouse. Capably following in the footsteps of previous clubhouse managers are Ira P. Allen and Donald R. Banham, co-managers in 1994.

The uninterrupted seventy-five year existence of The Sterling Club spanned generations of family members who have participated and contributed to its success. James G.Kirk, Jr. and James S. Griffin are second generation members. As the ranks of senior members thin, they are replaced by younger members seeking the heartfelt comradeship the Club offers. The legacy of the founding fathers is steeped in the Club's rich history and is continuously rekindled by acknowledging and "honoring our founders' dream."

By its presence across the years, The Sterling Club has created a legendry that pervades the St. Paul "black" community. That presence will continue to undergird local stability. The Club's future outlook is to maintain its social character and remain committed, not only to the demands of its civic responsibilities, but also to stand dedicated in providing benevolent benefits for African-American social programs.

The Sterling Club's history dictates that it will be a viable organization for generations to come. Our founders' dream is remembered.

I wish to extend my appreciation and sincere thanks to all who willingly gave so much of their time to assist me in compiling this historical review.

As part of its on-going civic involvement, The Sterling Club recognizes exceptional community achievement. The Sterling Club has presented awards for "Man of the Year", "St. Paul Citizen for Outstanding Service to the Community" as well as others, and has created the Sterling Club Fund for

WHEREAS: The Sterling Club's commitment to civic responsibility and to providing benevolent benefits for African-American programs is greatly admired and appreciated on this, its seventy-fifth anniversary;
