



Constitution Revised

PAST MASTER'S COUNCIL

WE, THE PAST MASTER'S OF THE MOST WORSHIPFUL PRINCE HALL GRAND LODGE FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS, MINNESOTA JURISDICTION, IN ORDER TO PROMOTE GOOD WORKING RELATIONSHIPS WITHIN OUR FRATERNITY, ALSO TO BE OF ASSISTANCE TO THE MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTERS, AT HIS REQUEST, CONSIDERING ALL OF THESE, WE HEREBY ESTABLISH THIS CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS:

ARTICLE I - NAME

THIS ORGANIZATION SHALL BE STYLED AND KNOWN AS THE PAST MASTER'S COUNCIL; ESTABLISHED UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE M.W.P.H.G.L.F. & A.M., MINNESOTA JURISDICTION.

ARTICLE II - OFFICERS

Sec. 1.

The elected officers shall be: President, Vice President, Treasurer.

Sec. 2.

The appointed officers shall be: Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Chaplain and Tyler.

Sec. 3.

The election of officers shall be in the month of January, 3rd Sunday of the month.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Sec. 1. Eligibility

That membership in the P.M. Council be limited to W.M. who have actually served their lodges as W.M. for at least one year.

Sec. 2. Annual Membership Dues

The annual dues paid for membership in the Council of Past Masters shall be those voted upon and passed at the first annual meeting in January.

Sec. 3. Exemptions

The President, Treasurer and Secretary shall be exempt from dues for faithful performance of their duties.

ARTICLE IV - COMMITTEES

Sec. 1. Standing Committees

The standing committees shall be Program, Budget & Finance, Legislation, and Audit.

Sec. 2. Committee on Budget & Finance

The President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and three members appointed by the President shall be the Committee on Budget & Finance.

Sec. 3. Program Committee

The Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Chaplain and Tyler shall be the Committee on Programs.

ARTICLE V - PASSING THE CHAIR

The fee for conferring the Past Master's Degree upon newly elected Worshipful Master's shall be payable to the Council Secretary.

ARTICLE VI - MEETINGS

Sec. 1. Quorum

Seven members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Sec. 2. Regular Meetings

This Council shall meet once each quarter, the months being, January, April, July and October.

Sec. 3. Special Meetings

The President shall have power to call special meetings.

Sec. 4. August Meeting

The President shall call a special meeting in August of each year, in order that the Council's work may be updated and all reports and resolutions submitted by the Committee on Legislation be properly prepared for the Grand Communication.

Sec. 5. Time and Place

Committees after being set to work, may meet at any time and place, designated by the Committee Chairman.

Sec. 6. Notification by Mail

Council members shall be notified by mail of all meetings by the Secretary at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

PRESIDENT

It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings; to appoint all committees and chairmen. He shall give a written report of Council activities at the Annual Grand Lodge Communication.

VICE PRESIDENT

It shall be the duty of the Vice President to preside in the absence of the President; to serve as a member of the Budget and Finance committee; to assist the President in overseeing the work of committees.

SECRETARY:

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep accurate and permanent records of proceedings of all meetings; to keep accurate account of all monies received and to furnish such upon request of the President; to serve as a member of the Budget & Finance committee; to notify members of meeting dates by mail and have custory of the (P.M.C.) seal, and give an annual report, preceding the election of officers.

TREASURER:

He shall receive all monies belonging to the Council from the Secretary and issue receipts thereof and keep in suitable books, for this Council, and accurate record of its funds. He keeps all monies of the Council in some good and reliable bank, in the same name and to the credit of this Council. He pays all bills from the funds of the Council, on vouchers that have been signed by the Secretary and countersigned by the President. He reports at each meeting the condition of the Council's funds. He shall give a detailed itemized report, preceeding the election of officers.

ARTICLE VIII - MASONIC WORK

Sec. 1. Degree Work

The Past Master's Council shall have charge of conferring the Past Master's degree upon all newly elected Worshipful Masters. Those receiving this degree shall receive a Certificate of Proof. The GRAND MASTER may, at his descretion, designate a PAST MASTER to confer this degree outside the Twin Cities area; and give notice to the Council of such appointment, for their records.

Sec. 2. Election

The M.W.G.M., R.W.D.G.M., D.D.G.M., or a PAST GRAND MASTER may conduct the annual election of officers of this Council; in the absence of these, a Past President may do the work and install those elected and appointed.

This Constitution, formulated by the Past Master's Council, will be submitted. AT THE 100th ANNUAL COMMUNICATIONS SEPTEMBER 21 - 22 1994.

ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended in the following manner:

- A. Any member of the Council may propose, in writing, and amendment which shall be read at a regular meeting and laid over until the next regular meeting.
- B. The Secretary shall notify each Council member, in writing, that an amendment is before the Council, stating the content of the proposed amendment.
- C. When approved by at least two-thirds of the members present and voting at that next regular meeting, becomes law.



To the Most Worshipfub Prince Hall Grand Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons of the State of Minnesota and its Jurisdiction; to the Right Worshipful Deputy Grand Master, Past Grand Masters, District Deputy Grand Masters, Grand Wardens, Present and Past Grand Officers, Worshipful Masters, Wardens, Proxies and Brothers assembled at this 78th annual communication of this Grand Lodge, in the city of Grand Forks, and the State of North Dakota, with Mosaic Lodge No. 11 as the host Lodge:

GREETINGS:

Again we have assembled under our laws to counsel with one another, and legislate for the general welfare of our great fraternity. We should earnestly endeavor to keep and preserve in our deliberations, that unity which should ever characterize our intercourse as Masons. Peace and harmony should prevail among the workmen as it did at the building of King Solomon's Temple.

Today I Stand here, at the Altar, for the first time as your Grand Master, with thanks for this honor, but with humility in my heart.

I extend to each and everyone of you my sincere welcome to this, your 78th annual communication.

Please believe me when I say, that I have done my best. I am prepared to return to you the top hat, the collar, the apron, the gavel, the seal and all the paraphernalia entrusted to my care. I wish to convey my thanks to all of you for your assistance and cooperation over the last year, which enabled me to perform my duties to the best of my ability; and I shall bring to you a brief report of my activities during the past year.

Many years ago I professed faith in God - that God whom we as
Masons reverent and serve. I have since learned man should ever
remember, that when the strength and wisdom of man fails, there is
an inexhaustible supply above, yielded to us; through the power of
prayer. I am asking each Brother to rise. It is altogether fitting
and proper in all our endeavors to seek for and rely upon divine
guidance. Brothers, let us pause while the Right Worshipful Grand

be upon this communication.

Brothers, Grand Senior and Junior Deacons, arch the Worshipful Grand Chaplain, escort him to the sacred Altar, where he may make supplication to our Heavenly Father and Acknowledge our failings and plead that His mercy will ever sustain us.

As the Grand Chaplain is escorted back to his place, will you join

me in singing one verse of "Have Thine Own Way, Lord." Have thine own way, Lord. Have thine own way. Thou are the Potter. I am the clay. Mold me and make me after thine will. While I am waiting, yielded and still: Brother Grand Chaplain, in behalf of the Brothers here assembled, I wish to thank you for your prayer.

When you think back over the years of our Worshipful organization, it reveals that the predecessors, in the exaulted office of Grand Master, have laid a firm foundation on which we stand today.

One short year ago this august body bestowed upon your humble servant, the greatest honor that can ever be conferred upon a Master Mason - that of being initiated into the oriental chair of King Solomon in the Grand East - an honor that should never be given whithout objective thought or accepted with overconfidence. On that eventful day many thoughts passed through my mind, but the predominating thought was that whatever the cost, we are indebted to this assembly for the elevation to this high office; and the only way to repay the debt, was to impart to this office all the dignity, energy, knowledge, and effort at our command; and to perform any end all duties in such a manner that the Jurisdiction would have no cause for censure or refute. Thus the groundwork would be laid for greater cooperative effort in future endeavors. Due consideration should be given to the thoughts expressed herein, that we might be enabled to better ourselves and the fraternity in general.

As we scan the familiar faces surrounding us at this moment, we are eternally grateful to you, for your many kindnesses bestowed and the Grand Architect of the universe, for his many blessings

and the oppotunity to serve.

It is my belief that one accepting honors or office should not be unmindful of the duties and the responsibilities which go with them. We have tried to the best of our ability and capability to fulfill the duties of the office of Grand Master with dignity and honor and to merit your trust and confidence. It is no pleasant or easy task to be judge, jury and executioner, as is sometimes required of a Grand Master. It is most difficult and lonely, when Brothers and close associates of many years are involved; but we must understand that our laws and our regulations govern all alike, from the Grand Master to the youngest Master Mason.

Whatever the degree of success obtained and the progress made toward strengthening and pushing forward the image of Prince Hall
Masonry in the state of Minnesota and its Jurisdiction during the
past year, We are happy to share with all who participated. It
could not have been accomplished without your help. It was a team
effort. Here and now, I wish to express my sincere appreciation, to
the Brothers for their efforts, their hospitality and fellowship
extended during my visits, to their areas. May you continue in your

dark days, when enemies assault you and dangers crowd around you,
press on in the cause of humanity, ever keeping your hand in God's
hand and you will hear him say to you as he said to Joshua, "As I
was with Moses, so I will be with thee. I will not fail thee nor
forsake thee."

NECROLOGY

Blessed is the memory of the just, whose lives inspire our hope and trust. Like stars they sparkle through the gloom, and shed a radiance from their tomb. We cannot escape death. The solemn sound of the gong that denotes the desolution of this earthly tabernacle has alarmed the outer doors of the Lodges of this jurisdiction.

Last Sunday afternoon we once again assembled in our Grand Lodge of Sorrow, to memoralize those of our Brothern who have passed this life and gained their reward in the Celestial Lodge above, where there is no sorrow, no more pain—for all that is experienced there is perfect bliss and love reigns supreme.

The Grand Lodge officers and members who performed the ceremony did so in a commendable manner. We give our thanks and praise to our Father who knows and does all things right - for his blessing and grace upon us daily.

To the Brothers who have been called by the Grim Reaper and to them, we say Rest in Peace; and to the friends and relatives, we extend our deepest sympathy. It is by divine providence that we who are assembled here today have been spared. Therefore, let us live our lives in such a manner, that when our immortal spirit has gone to that country from which no traveler ever returns, it shall be said, "Well done, thy good and faithful servant."

Remember - It is for us to make use of the remaining precious moments of our lives and make our contributions to life and humanity in general, worthwhile and memorable of our passing this way.

STATE OF THE ORDER

We are happy to say that our Grand Lodge is still a stable organization. I want to commend the Masters for the manner in which they supported the Grand Lodge and its programs. It takes times like our past year to make good Masters and active Lodges. Each year we are supposed to be a step shead of the past year or we find ourselves at a standstill. We have tried to govern your Grand Lodge. We have met with some obstacles but we have used tolerance and prayed and continued on. If we failed, it was not because we did not try. We will let the records and time speak for themselves.

The Conference of Grand Masters was a success. Many Brothers worked hard to make this event a success. My hat is off to those workers.

The past year has produced some advancements within the craft. The calibre of members being admitted into the several Lodges is indicative that the organization as a whole is appealing to the unitiated. You are to be congratulated on so displaying your Masonic life in public, as to influence and encourage those on the outside, to want to join our fraternal family. Continue the good work.

We are happy to report that the Grand Lodge is in a sound financial condition. In general the Lodges have continued to operate as they have in the past. There are several Lodges which require the special attention of this Grand Lodge. We will have to give these Lodges real consideration. We may not be able to resolve the difficulties which plague each of them. We will advise and counsel with the new administration as to the causes of their difficulties and propose some kind of solution for its consideration.

The Spring Conference was a success. Brother Nathaniel L. Hardy, broke his ankle during the winter, but in spite of his misfortune, he did supervise and plan a successful Spring Conference.

The Prince Hall Day celebration and Grand Lodge picnic was a success. It was a good day for a picnic, and the facilities at Como Park were Excellent.

We as Master Masons should be willing to give praise where praise is due. We say thanks to those who have helped to clean a Lodge hall, have helped to prepare food, who have helped to move and to remodel, to those who visit the sick, to those who answer summons, to those who visit the sick in hospitals, to those who bring in petitions, to those who volunteer to help our new Brothers learn our ritual. I could go on and on thanking those who helped make our programs a success.

FRATERNAL RELATIONS

Be it known to all whom it may concern: I did sign and seal a documeent granting permission to the Most Ancient Prince Hall Grand Court Heroines of Jericho, Illinois and Jurisdiction, Prince Hall Affiliation, to set up in Minnesota and its Jurisdiction a Club to act as a U.D. court. I have been informed the Club name is "Omara."

Twin City Chapter No. 47, Order of the Golden Circle, has been granted their warrant.

Omar Chapter No. 29, Prince Hall Grand Chapter, Holy Royal Arch Masons and Alta Commandery No. 23, Prince Hall Grand Commandery, Knights
Templar have been granted their charters, also.

I can truthfully say harmony does exist between the fraternal bodies in Minnesota and its jurisdiction. The entire Masonic family is invited to visit this Grand Lodge.

I have included in my recommendations that we reactivate the Order of Pythagorans. I recommend that the chapters that we reactivate be statewide and jurisdiction-wide with a state director. We are not to be a part of a national organization.

We recognize the necessity of developing a vigorous youth program as the best assurance for the survival of our fraternity. A successful youth program can be the life blood of our fraternity.

HOUSING

I regret very much to report that District No. 1 had a housing problem during the past year, but things are looking up. Pioneer Lodge No. 1 of Saint Paul, Minnesota, has purchased a building as their lodge home. They say charity begins at home. The lodges of District No. 1 will need your help in the future. Please support them. I hope this Grand Lodge will investigate again the possibilities of a housing project.

PUBLIC RELATIONS

Public relations are important to our fraternity, but most especially to this Grand Lodge. We need good and better public relations. I place publicity and public relations very high on the list of things we need.

RECOGNITION

Recognition was one of the subjects discussed at the Conference of Grand Masters. We were indeed fortunate to have a Grand Master of the Ancient Free and Accepted Masons, State of Minnesota, who did send a personal representative to bring greetings and make remarks to the Conference of Grand Masters.

GRAND MASTER'S RECOMMENDATIONS


- That the By-Laws be changed on page 79, Article XVII. Online 5 after \$100.00 add the following admendment: for the first 5 years of membership. After which me? the burial relief be increased from \$100.00 to \$150.00 upon the certification of five years of continuous membership in the Jurisdiction of Minnesota and being current at time of death.
- We recommend that the registration fee for this Grand Lodge be raised from Mb \$5.00 to \$6.00 to help defray expenses.
 - We recommend that each member of every chartered Lodge under this jurisdiction shall pay \$1.00 annually as a building fund tax. Such sums shall be paid in quarterly installments as part of quarterly returns. Said funds shall be set aside in a special fund, earmarked for the erection, purchase or acquiring and maintaining a Masonic Temple Building as a Home for this Grand Lodge and Jurisdiction. (Article XXII of Constitution to be followed.)
- 4. We recommend that a One Thousand Dollar Reward be offered to the person or, persons giving information to the Law Athorities resulting in the apprehention and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the dastardly deed, of murdering Sister Wayne, Uptegrove.
- We recommend that a lockable trunk or cabinet be purchased to store material for our archives. This to be the responsiblity of the trusties.
 - We recommend that the Budget Committee favorable consider alloting finances to Past Grand Master M. O. Weddington to attend the 1973 Conference of Grand Masters in Conneticut.
- 7. We recommend that the Grand Lodge resume paying \$1.00 to the Order of Eastern Star for each brochure requested for registration kits.
 - We recommend that the Order of Eastern Star give favorable consideration to changing their Constitution and By-Laws, where necessary, so that they might have the option of changing the dates of their Annual Communication, whenever the Grand Lodge votes to conventits Annual Communication in a City where there is no active Chapter of the O. E. S.
