To the Most Worshipful Grand master, Officers and Members of the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons, Minnesota And its Jurisdiction.

Greetings on our 99th session:

Masonry is a speculative art founded on the operative principles of masonry. It teaches us to act as men, and meet on the square, working together to build that building not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

This is a lesson I learned in the last year, while working with the Grand Lodge cabinet. I believe this cabinet reflects the Grand Master in regards to the brotherhood and unity that we displayed as we worked together as a team. Each supporting each other. We as a team realized we had to focus on the business of running this organization as a business. We realized times had changed. That by being elected by the craft, we are accountable for our actions.

In the performance of my duties I attended most of the cabinet meetings. I performed the duties assigned to me by the Grand Master. Some of these was the successful over-view of Hub Club and filing in when needed as secretary at the cabinet meetings.

Some of us are not chosen, but called. This is the fabric that has bonded my activities as a Grand Lodge Officer. I attended the 98th session as a Past Master from Palestine Lodge #7. My goal was to observe the craft and to audit the books of this august body. As events would have

it, this organization saw fit to bestow upon me the opportunity to serve them as Grand Junior Warden. This has created a fertile field in which I have personally grown through great leadership that taught me the virtue of Strength (hearing), Wisdom (seeing), and Beauty (feeling). At this 99th session I stand before you as your Grand Junior Warden, I thank you for your trust and say to you as a body tcb (take care of business).
