

GRAND MASTER WILLIAM A. RICHARDSON, SR. ADDRESS TO THE ONE-HUNDRETH ANNUAL COMMUNICATION OF THE PRINCE HALL GRAND LODGE, F & A.M. MINNESOTA JURISDICTION

SEPTEMBER 20, 1994

To: The R.W.D.G.M. Brother Charles E. Milliner, All Elected and Appointed Officers, Past Grand Masters, visiting Grand Masters and other Grand Lodge Officers, Worshipful Masters, Past Masters, Wardens and Brothers: GREETINGS!

In conjunction with the By - Laws and Constitution of this Prince Hal Grand Lodge, we come together again to assess this past Masonic year and prepare for the next one. I stand before each of you today with my Grand Master's address, but before proceeding further, I would ask our Grand Chaplain to come forth and ask for the blessings of our Almighty Father, GOD.

Grand Chaplain:

NECROLOGY

This fiscal year of 1993 and 1994, we as Masons lost a total of eight Masonic Brothers to that familiar face of Death under this jurisdiction. In November of last year, the Almighty Father called home my baby sister Lyjetter Hemmingson. In May of this year my older sister Mary Alice Hugg& was also called to the Heavens. In July of this year, I lost my only brother, James David Richardson Jr.

These three family members played an important role in my private life. They are truly missed by me every day.

We are taught that just as there is life, there is death. None of us are here on this earth forever. We all must pass through that black tunnel to meet the loved ones who have gone on before us. Live life to the fullest as tomorrow is not promised.

The Necrology Committee will also give their report on our deceased Brothers later.

STATE OF THE NATION

This past year has been unique regarding issues important to Americans. I was particularly pleased with the activities that took place in South Africa and especially the election result of Nelson Mandella being duly elected to the office of President.

The United States was not involved in any wars this past year and the economy appears to be getting stronger.

We all witnessed the O.J Simpson story and the problem of domestic abuse being brought to the forefront. It is unfortunate that situations like his are needed to address problems that have existed for years. I would like to point out that domestic abuse is two sided. Just as there are women being abused, so are there men.

I say to this Craft that your involvement in making this world a better place to live is part of the obligation each of us took when we took our oath to become Masons.

STATE OF THE ORDER

Back in 1993, each Lodge under this jurisdiction was directed by the Grand Cabinet to vote on the sale of the Grand East building located at 1708 Oak Park Avenue North here in Minneapolis. The approval to sell the building was received from the Lodges and in April of this year, the building was sold for \$175,000.00. This price included the outstanding balance of \$87,662.07 owed to the Mortgage Company.

You will find attached, a copy of the total financial break-down of this transaction.

The R.W. Grand Treasurer will also be going into further detail regarding the sale of the previous Grand East building.

In May of this year, the Grand Cabinet entered into a agreement with Palestine Lodge No. 7 to lease the building located at 3836 4th Avenue South. This location is now the temporary site of the Grand East for Minnesota jurisdiction Prince Hall Masons. The Grand Cabinet's financial agreement with Palestine Lodge, requires that the property taxes, insurance and utilities be paid by the Grand Cabinet. This cost is approximately \$750.00 per month. Along with paying the bills, the agreement also calls for a 35% cut to Palestine Lodge of the net monthly profits generated by the Master's Club.

The above agreement is valid for six months subject to a year to year Lease Agreement with the same guidelines.

Again, the R.W. Grand Treasurer will be discussing the financial agreement n greater detail when giving his Report.

I am happy to report to you all that the Grand Lodge's financial state is sound.

In over-viewing the Subordinate Lodges within this jurisdiction, I am concerned with the "LIP" service of the Masonic body as a whole. Additional efforts are needed by each of the Lodges for a better outlook and future. Officers of their perspective Lodges must take their roles more seriously prior to accepting their station. Each Worshipful Master and Line Officer needs to become more persistent in seeing that the Masonic work gets done. We need a increased effort to build our organization by bringing in new members and keeping them active and interested in Masonry. Remember Brothers, we are obligated to each other.

The relationship with our A.F. & A.M. Brothers is going quite well. My communication with Grand Master Rodney Larson has been good along with the intermingling of various functions within our jurisdiction.

The relationship with the Prince Hall Masons of other states is also strong. My visit to the Midwest Conference of Grand Masters confirm my belief that there is a desire to keep relationships strong among the Eleven participating jurisdictions. But I also have some concerns regarding the other jurisdictions commitment.

PERSONAL OBSERVATIONS

I attended the 69th Annual Order of the Eastern Star Grand Communication on September 23,1993. The Masonic Brothers and I were well received.

On March 17th through the 20th, I attended the Midwest Conference of Grand Masters which was held in Dayton, Ohio and was hosted by Grand Master, Steven Reece. The highlight of this conference was the decision of Grand Master, Junior L. Young of Wisconsin regarding the issue of his jurisdiction dropping the "Blood Line" for the Golden Circle and the Supreme Council in direct opposition of his decision.

After a lengthy debate, of which I urged the remaining Grand Masters to give their support, we agreed to send the Sovereign Grand Commander; Samuel Brogdon Jr. a letter with all of our signatures supporting Grand Master, Junior L. Young's decision. We have yet to receive a response.

On April 23rd of this year, a Bus load of 45 Masons and myself, traveled to Winnepeg, Canada for the Spring Conference. This trip was a great success.

estimate that the total number in attendance was approximately 70

Brothers. I was also pleased to see 10 Worshipful Masters there.

regret that I was not able to attend the Conference of Grand Masters due to the death of my sister. R.W. Deputy Grand Master, Charles E. Milliner went in my place and was given the authority to represent the jurisdiction of Minnesota.

I attended the United Supreme Council conference from May 28th thru the 31st which was held in Cleveland, Ohio. I was very disappointed at the overall Conference agenda and activities. A advertisement bought by this jurisdiction for the United Supreme Council Brochure, was not in the regular kits given out, but was passed out only at the Testimonial Banquet that Saturday night in honor of the Grand Commander, Brogdon. I was also verbally attacked by the Sovereign Grand Commander, Samuel Brogdon Jr. on the issue of supporting Past Grand Master Junior L. Young and his decision to drop the Blood Line as I discussed earlier. Beleive me Brothers, I defended myself well. Finally there appeared to be general disappointment by the other attendees regarding the reception and overall attendance at the Conference.

I attended the 69th Annual Grand Lodge Communication for the Wisconsin Jurisdiction. The hospitality given me by the Wisconsin Grand Lodge Cabinet was again second to none. Accompanying me on this trip were R.W. Deputy Grand Master, Charles E. Milliner and the R.W. Grand Senior Warden, Michael Gonzales.

`ther activities I represented the Faternity at or attended can be found in my Tresle Board which is attached.

At this time I would like to pay homage to my Cabinet members that this body elected and their overall efforts in supporting Masonry within this jurisdiction this past Masonic year.

Grand Junior Warden; Reece M. Dyer deserves special recognition on his work in setting up the operation of the Masters Club and seeing that it was up and functioning in a timely manner.

I would also like to thank Past Master Lawrence Henderson for his dedicated service in managing the past Hub Club and now the running of the Masters Club.

A well deserved thank you to Brothers Fred Scurry, Richard Davis, Virgil Brown and Bev Rowland in their ongoing efforts in assisting at the Masters Club. The remaining Brothers who have put out extra efforts this past Masonic year, I would like to thank you also at this time. By the way, you know who you are. Those of you who have not, we await your needed support.

RECOMMENDATIONS

After serious thought and conversations with the members of my abinet, please note the following recommendations for the benefit of our Fraternity:

- 1. "Look to the East" be the official Masonic Ritual for Minnesota nd its jurisdiction. This is based on the ability to get substantial number of copies and its use in other jurisdictions surrounding ours.
- 2. The Grand Lodge Audit Committee is to see that the Grand lodge Taxes are filled out and properly submitted each year as part of their duties.
- 3. That this Grand Lodge adopt the "seven year" plan regarding securing funds and the building of a new Grand East at the end of seven years based on the following:
- A. Place all payments recieved on sale of the old Grand East into the Building Fund, which will amount to \$81,136.00.
- B. At each Grand Lodge Session that the sale generated from the Brochure and Registration, net a minumum of \$3,000.00, which after seven years will reach a additional \$21,000.00.
- C. The Jurisdiction recruit a minumum of forty new members a year for the next seven years, which will create a additional \$56,000.00.
- D. Money from the per capita tax properly budgeted to save \$5000.00 per year at seven years would produce \$35,000.00.
- The total amount secured based on the above figures will amount to 193,136.00 which be enough to secure a new Grand Lodge Building. This total will be greatly enhanced if our plans for the Master's Club come through.

From the office of the Most Worshipful Grand Master

Thank everyone for electing me back to the office and giving me my cabinet back.

I am granting dispensation to all lodges in the jursidiction for the making of more than five masons at a time and more than one degree at a time. Effective this date until September 1994, with these instructions to the Worshipful Masters and District Deputy's. That all masons rasied must go thru the middle chamber before they are rasied to master masons.

After elections the Past masters degree will be given on December 11th, the second saturday of the month. It will be held at the Grand East 1708 Oak Park. In the outline areas the Past Masters, District Deputy's are to form a group to give the past masters degree.

The last meeting in the month of December for each lodge should be used to install the elected officers. This should be done by the District Deputy or in the outline lodges by a past master.

December 26th, 1993 is St. Johns the Evangelist day. The host lodge will be Theta Libertus #17. You will be contacted by the host lodge as to when and where the service will be held. In the outline lodges the District Deputy's will arrange for services at a local place.

Jethro lodge # 8 will host the district one and two visitation on saturday, January 22nd, 1994. The time is 1:00pm.

Worshipful master, wardens and brothers, We are in need of four sets of regaila for Grand lodge. Two District Deputy's and two Deputy Grand Lecturer's. Therefore we are asking if you will make a contribution toward the purchase of this regaila. Either as an individual or as a lodge. We need a response by no later than December 1st, 1993. Please contribute generously!

Just a reminder, starting January 1994 per capita tax will be \$9.00 a quarter in American currency.

Worshipful Masters, Wardens and Brothers:

As of now I am sure that you know that there is a great possibility Grand East will be sold under the following terms;

Grand East will be sold for \$175,000 with \$25,000 down with the buyers to assume current mortgage of \$88,700 and pay a contract for deed for 7 years. \$61,208 plus 8% per annum interest. Monthly payments will start April 5th 1994 at \$954.

Brothers, this leaves us in a position that we must look for office space for our archives and especially space for the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer. Therefore, we are asking you for permission to look into the possibility of purchasing low cost housing from HUD or whatever is available to rent or own as inexpensively as we can possibly find. However, the monthly cost should be no greater than if we have to just rent space in an office building.

During the contract for deed period as we build up funds we will be looking for a building that we can afford and that will handle our meeting and event needs, which will generate the funds to support itself.

We need to hear from your Lodges no later than December 25th 1993.

We have to take care of business. Therefore through our actions we have to become financially responsible to the faternal order.

Brothers, we have been receiving bad checks from some of the Lodges. It is time to address this subject. All NSF checks received will have a \$30 penalty and late tax returns will be enforced at the already approved \$25 penalty.

Once again, I would like to wish you and yours a Happy Holiday and a prosperous healthy New Year.



THE COMMITTEE HELD FIVE MEETINGS, FOUR WAS FACT FINDING AND ONE WAS TO EVALUATE THE INFORMATION GATHERED.

THE BROTHERS INTERVIEWED WAS AS FOLLOWS: ROBERT JACKSON, CHARLES COOK, GEORGE LEONARD, MORRIS MILLER, JAMES ASH, CHARLES SNARGRASS, AND WILLIAM RICHARDSON.

AFTER EVALUATION OF THE INFORMATION THE COMMITTEE WAS CONCERNED AND RECOMMENDED THAT THE BEST WAY TO RSOLVE THIS PROBLEM WAS FOR THE CABINET TO MEET FACE TO FACE WITH PAST GRAND MASTER MILLER AND GET YOUR DIRECT RESPONSE TO THE QUESTIONS RAISED BY THEIR REPORT.

LASTLY, THEY RECOMMEND THAT THEIR REPORT AND YOUR SPECIFIC RESPONSE TO THE FOLLOWING QUESTION BE PRESENTED AT THE 100TH ANNUAL COMMUNICATION WERE AS THE BODY WILL DECIDE HOW TO RESOLVE THESE CONCERNS.

- 1) THE COMMITTEE DISCOVERED THE FOLLOWING CHECKS MADE OUT TO YOU BY BROTHER GEORGE LEONARD FROM THE H U B LOUNGE CHECKING ACCOUNT #7710865; #1754 DATED 4/18/90 FOR \$210.00;#1840 DATED 7/7/90 FOR \$91.00; AND #1864 DATED 7/26/90 FOR \$120.00. DO YOU REMEBER RECEIVING THESE CHECKS AND FOR WHAT PURPOSE WAS THE MONEY USED AND WAS THIS A PROPER PROCEDURE FOR DISPENSING FUNDS FOR GRAND LODGE BUSNIESS?
- 2) THE H U B LOUNGE RESERVE SAVINGS ACCOUNT EXISTED FROM 12//12/88 THRU 12/12/92. IT WAS CLOSED BY ORDER OF MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER WILLIAM RICHARDSON ON 12/12/92. THE BALANCE OF \$31.58 WAS DEPOSITED INTO THE GENNERAL FUND ACCOUNT. \$25,718.98 WENT THRU THIS ACCOUNT DURING THE FOUR YEAR PERIOD. WHY WAS THIS ACCOUNT SET UP? UNDER WHO'S AUTHORITY WAS MONEY TAKEN OUT OF THE ACCOUNT AND FOR WHAT PURPOSES WAS THE MONEY USED?

- THE COMMITTEE CAME TO THE FOLLOWING CONCLUSIONS; A. THAT THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE RESERVE ACCOUNT TO BYPASS THE OFFICE OF THE TREASURER WAS A VIOLATION OF ARTICLE V, SECTION 1 AND ARTICLE VI, SECTION 1 OF THE BYLAWS OF THE MOST WORSHIPFUL PRINCE HALL GRAND LODGE OF MINNESOTA. THAT THE REQUIREMENT OF ONLY ONE SIGNATURE, THE GRAND SECRETARY CHARLES SNARDGRASS WAS MOST IRREGULAR AND INADVISABLE. THIS ALSO, INCLUDES THE FACT THAT THERE WAS NO VOUCHERS OR WRITTEN DOCUMENTATION INDICATING THE PURPOSE OF THE WITHDRAWALS. THE GRAND SECRETARY SNARGRASS ADVISED THAT THE WITHDRAWALS WAS MADE BY ORDER OF THE PAST GRAND MASTER MILLER.
 - B.) THE COMMITTE FEELS THIS ACCOUNT EXISTED WITHOUT GRAND LODGE AUTHORITY. THE EXISTENCE OF THE ACCOUNT WAS NEVER REPORTED TO THE GRAND LODGE AND AT THE 97TH ANNUAL COMMUNICATION, THE GRAND LODGE AUDITING COMMITTEE WAS DENIED ACCESS TO THE INFORMATION REGARDING THIS ACCOUNT, ALTHOUGH THEY REQUESTED THE INFORMATION. THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS WITHOUT VOUCHERS VIOLATED ARTICLE III OF THE BYLAWS OF THE MOST WORSHIPFUL PRINCE HALL GRAND LODGE OF MINNESOTA. YOUR COMMENTS AND OR REBUTTALS TO THE CONCLUSIONS REACH BY THE COMMITTEE WILL NOW BE APPRECIATED.



It is recommended by the Prince Hall Grand Lodge Cabinet that we follow the recommendations of paragraph three of the Investigating committee's recommedations. We are therefore submitting this matter to the 100th Annual communication, for its action.

The following is a summary of the answers we received from the Past Grand Master Morris Miller to the questions in our May 6th memo to P.G. M. Morris Miller. A copy of that memo is attached.

Question #1. The answer received was an ackowledgement that funds was received by check from George Leonard the Past Masters Council manager of the HUB Lounge. The details are not clear in his mind. However, those fund was used for travel expenses. He had situations where he could not get in contact with his treasurer to procure funds for travel. He would than get these funds on an emergency basis from the manager of the HUB Lounge. The P.G..M. realized this was not the proper procedure to draw funds, but because of his enablity to make contact with the treasurer when he needed the money for travel, he drew on those funds.

Question # 2. The answer. The only account he was aware of was the the one set up by the Past Masters Council. He was not aware of any other account and never gave his approval to set up any other reserve saving account. Any monies taken out was used to defry the expense of Grand Lodge. These monies was only drawn on an emergency basis.

Grand Master William Richardson, asked specificly why was there only one signiture requirement on the reserve saving account. P.G.M. Morris Miller once again advised he did not know that there was only a one signiture reguirement. He than restated he did not know that this particular account existed. The only one he had any knowledge about was the one established by the Past Masters Council. He than stated it was not his fault that Grand Lodge Officers did not perform their duties properly.

Question # 3.P.G.M. Morris Miller, catagorically denied all claims made in that question.

AFTER EVALUATION OF THE INFORMATION THE COMMITTEE WAS CONCERNED AND RECOMMENDED THAT THE BEST WAY TO RSOLVE THIS PROBLEM WAS FOR THE CABINET TO MEET FACE TO FACE WITH PAST GRAND MASTER MILLER AND GET YOUR DIRECT RESPONSE TO THE QUESTIONS RAISED BY THEIR REPORT.

LASTLY, THEY RECOMMEND THAT THEIR REPORT AND YOUR SPECIFIC RESPONSE TO THE FOLLOWING QUESTION BE PRESENTED AT THE 100TH ANNUAL COMMUNICATION WERE AS THE BODY WILL DECIDE HOW TO RESOLVE THESE CONCERNS.

- 1) THE COMMITTEE DISCOVERED THE FOLLOWING CHECKS MADE OUT TO YOU BY BROTHER GEORGE LEONARD FROM THE H U'B LOUNGE CHECKING ACCOUNT #7710865; #1754 DATED 4/18/90 FOR \$210.00; #1840 DATED 7/7/90 FOR \$91.00; AND #1864 DATED 7/26/90 FOR \$120.00. DO YOU REMEBER RECEIVING THESE CHECKS AND FOR WHAT PURPOSE WAS THE MONEY USED AND WAS THIS A PROPER PROCEDURE FOR DISPENSING FUNDS FOR GRAND LODGE BUSNIESS?
- 2) THE H U B LOUNGE RESERVE SAVINGS ACCOUNT EXISTED FROM 12//12/88 THRU 12/12/92. IT WAS CLOSED BY ORDER OF MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER WILLIAM RICHARDSON ON 12/12/92. THE BALANCE OF \$31.58 WAS DEPOSITED INTO THE GENNERAL FUND ACCOUNT. \$25,718.98 WENT THRU THIS ACCOUNT DURING THE FOUR YEAR PERIOD. WHY WAS THIS ACCOUNT SET UP? UNDER WHO'S AUTHORITY WAS MONEY TAKEN OUT OF THE ACCOUNT AND FOR WHAT PURPOSES WAS THE MONEY USED?

- THE COMMITTEE CAME TO THE FOLLOWING CONCLUSIONS; A. THAT
 THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE RESERVE ACCOUNT TO BYPASS THE
 OFFICE OF THE TREASURER WAS A VIOLATION OF ARTICLE V,
 SECTION 1 AND ARTICLE VI, SECTION 1 OF THE BYLAWS OF
 THE MOST WORSHIPFUL PRINCE HALL GRAND LODGE OF
 MINNESOTA. THAT THE REQUIREMENT OF ONLY ONE SIGNATURE,
 THE GRAND SECRETARY CHARLES SNARDGRASS WAS MOST

We feel that this matter should be resolved prior to the 100th Annual Communication if possible. One method of resolution would be to have a face to face meeting with Past Grand Master Miller. At this time he will be advised of the concerns and submit to him a written statement about the Grand Lodge's concerns with specific questions that have be raised in this report. Then afford him an opportunity to respond to each question in a specific and concise manner. This may clarify the matter satisfactorily and then the full report, including the committees activities could be submitted to the 100th Annual Communication for its decision.

Another way of attempting to resolve the matter would be a Masonic trial of Past Grand Master Miller, since he was the Chief Executive at the time these events occurred and is accountable. Arthough there was enough wrong to go around, it would be difficult or there was enough wrong to go around. perhaps not possible to file charges against any of the other person involved. Should charge be filed against Past Grand Master Miller, one should be aware that adverse information of Masonry may be spread outside of the Masonic family and to other Masonic


