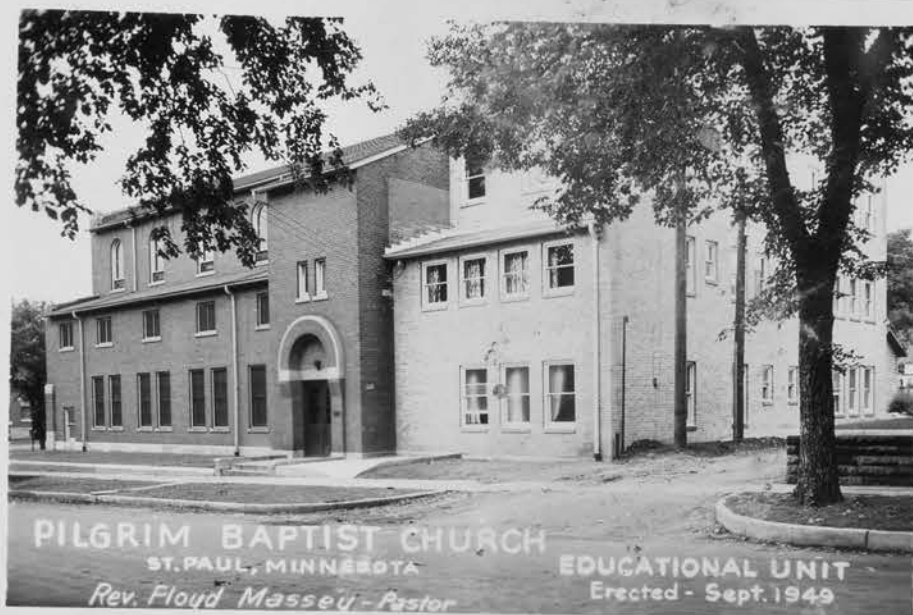

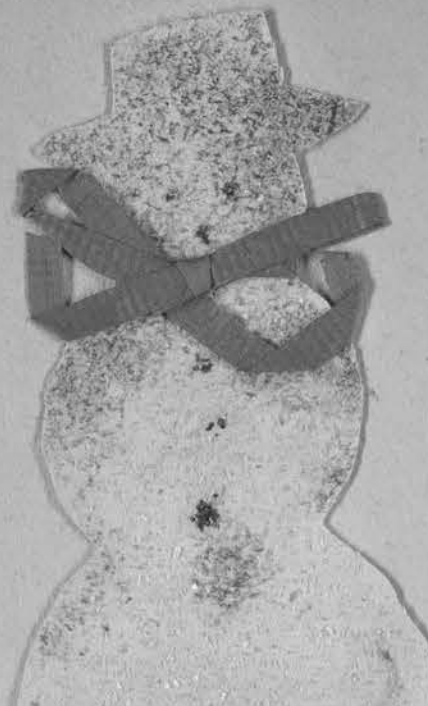

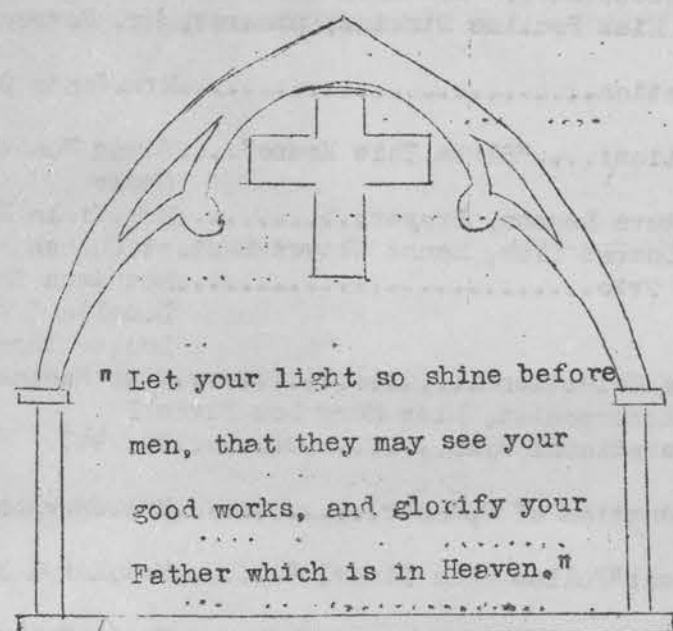

Rev. Massey, Mistress of Ceremonies, Members and Friends of Pilgrim Baptist Church,

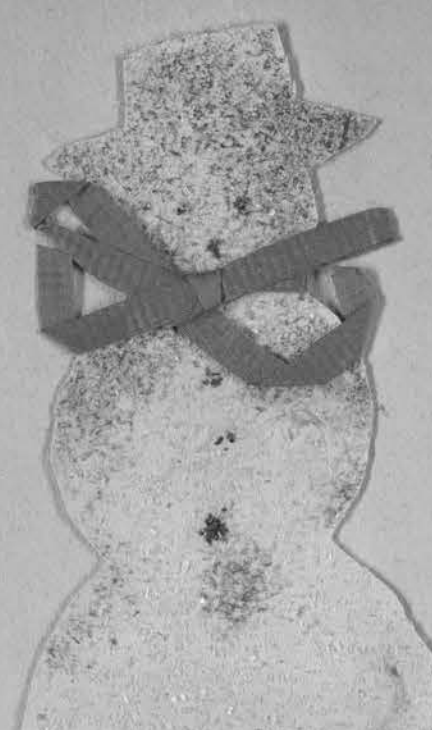

Patricia Dodd was the maid of honor. Mrs. Melvin Stone was the matron of honor. Bridesmaids were the Misses Faye Schuck

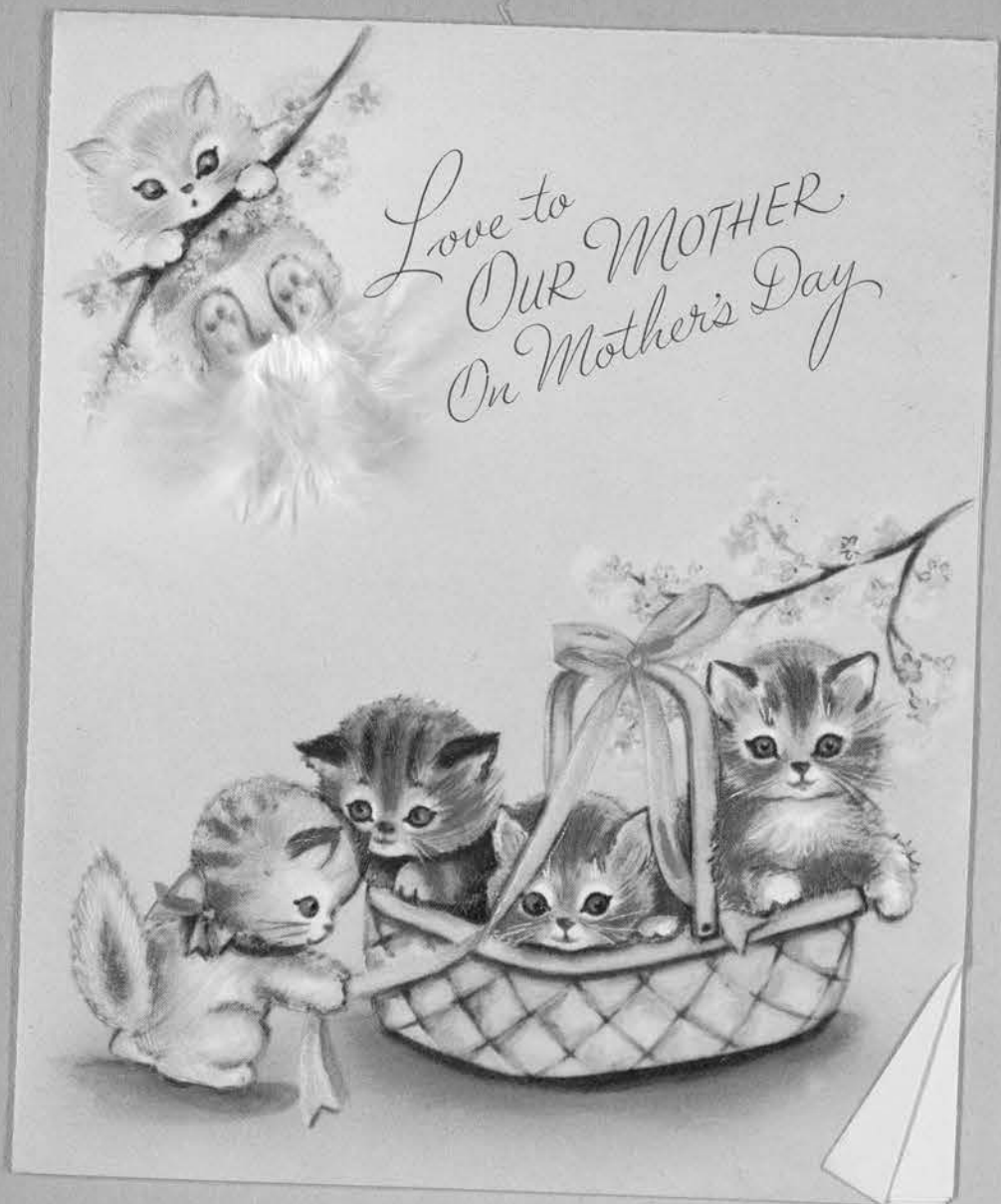
collar framing the face, with lace crepe with open lace at the neck and sleeves, a pale blue flowered hat, white nylon gloves and an orchid corsage.


The wedding motif was blue and white. The Oblate Sisters of Divine Providence decorated the altar. Palms and large floor baskets of white gladiolas and other flowers.
