GRAIN BELT SUES ANHEUSER BUSCH & SCHLITZ

In a third quarter memo issued today, Grain Belt Breweries, Inc. revealed the filing of a complaint in the U.S. Federal Court, District of Nebraska, asking for injunctive relief from the price practices of Anheuser Busch Brewing Company of St. Louis, Missouri and the Jos. Schlitz Brewing Company of Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

The complaint alleges that Anheuser Busch and Schlitz have violated the Federal antitrust laws in Nebraska and Iowa markets through marketing practices which were in restraint of trade, attempted to monopolize the sale of beer, and engaged in discriminatory pricing practices.

In addition to the injunctive relief requested, the Complaint seeks treble damages for the losses sustained by Grain Belt as provided in the antitrust laws.

Grain Belt reported lower sales volume for the third quarter and for the nine months ending September 30, 1972 (detailed sales figures are not revealed by the company excepting at year's end).

News Release

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Earnings for the third quarter in 1972 were \$20,000 or 2¢ per share compared to \$198,000 or 20¢ per share for the third quarter of 1971.

For the nine months ending September 30, 1972 earnings were \$284,000 or 30¢ per share compared to \$540,000 or 56¢ per share for the same period of 1971.

The company attributed the sharp drop in third quarter earnings to less volume, the deterioration of beer prices in its primary markets, and the impact of higher wage rates imposed by new union contracts effective as of July 1, 1972.

The report also announced the election of Charles W. Broughton as vice president and general manager of the company effective November 1, 1972.

Mr. Broughton was formerly resident manager of the Jacob Schmidt Brewing Company of St. Paul, Minnesota.

In addition it noted the appointment of Edmund B. Koller as director of marketing. Mr. Koller was formerly president of the Walter Brewing Company of Pueblo, Colorado.

MANAGER POSITION

Mr. Kiewel presented to the members of the Board the name of Charles W. Broughton, presently resident manager of the Jacob Schmidt Brewing Company, St. Paul, Minnesota, as a candidate for the position of General Manager of Grain Belt Breweries, Inc. A detailed, lengthy discussion was held relative to the qualifications of Mr. Broughton, following which

A MOTION was made by Mr. Gasser and seconded by Mr. Finkelstein authorizing Management to hire and designate Mr. Charles W. Broughton as Vice President and General Manager of Grain Belt Breweries, Inc. effective November 1, 1972; Mr. Broughton to be hired without a contract at a salary of \$3,166.66 per month. In addition Mr. Broughton is to receive a bonus in the amount of 5% of the net profits earned by the company in excess of \$500,000 for the calendar year 1973; the bonus to be computed on the basis of the company's net profit after provision for Federal and State Income Taxes as shown in the company's Annual Report to Shareholders prepared in accordance with the accepted principles of accounting; provided, that should Mr. Broughton not be employed at the end of the calendar year of 1973 the bonus, if earned, will be payable in the ratio of time Mr. Broughton was employed in the year 1973 compared to the entire year.

The motion carried unanimously upon a poll vote of the directors present.

Dear Charlie:

When we discussed your employment with Grain Belt Breweries, Inc. it was agreed that we would write you a letter in respect to the terms of employment.

The discussion resulted in an understanding that you would be working without a contract. Your title with Grain Belt will be Vice President and General Manager. You are to begin November 1, 1972.

Your salary will be \$3,166.66 per month. In addition to this salary the company will pay you a bonus in an amount equal to 5% of the net profits earned by the company in excess of \$500,000 for the calendar year of 1973. The bonus shall be computed on the basis of the company's net profit after provision for Federal and State Income Taxes, as shown in the company's annual report to shareholders prepared in accordance with accepted principles of accounting. If you should not be employed at the end of the calendar year of 1973, then the bonus, if earned, will be payable to you in the ratio of the time you are employed in 1973 compared to the entire year.

You will be entitled to an automobile allowance of \$100.00 each month. This is the maximum amount that other officers of the company receive. Also, you will participate in the company's pension plan for salaried employees and in the company's group life and hospitalization insurance in accordance with the terms of these programs. You will be entitled to reimbursement for all expenses that you incur on behalf of the company. Vacations will be as per our regular vacation schedule.

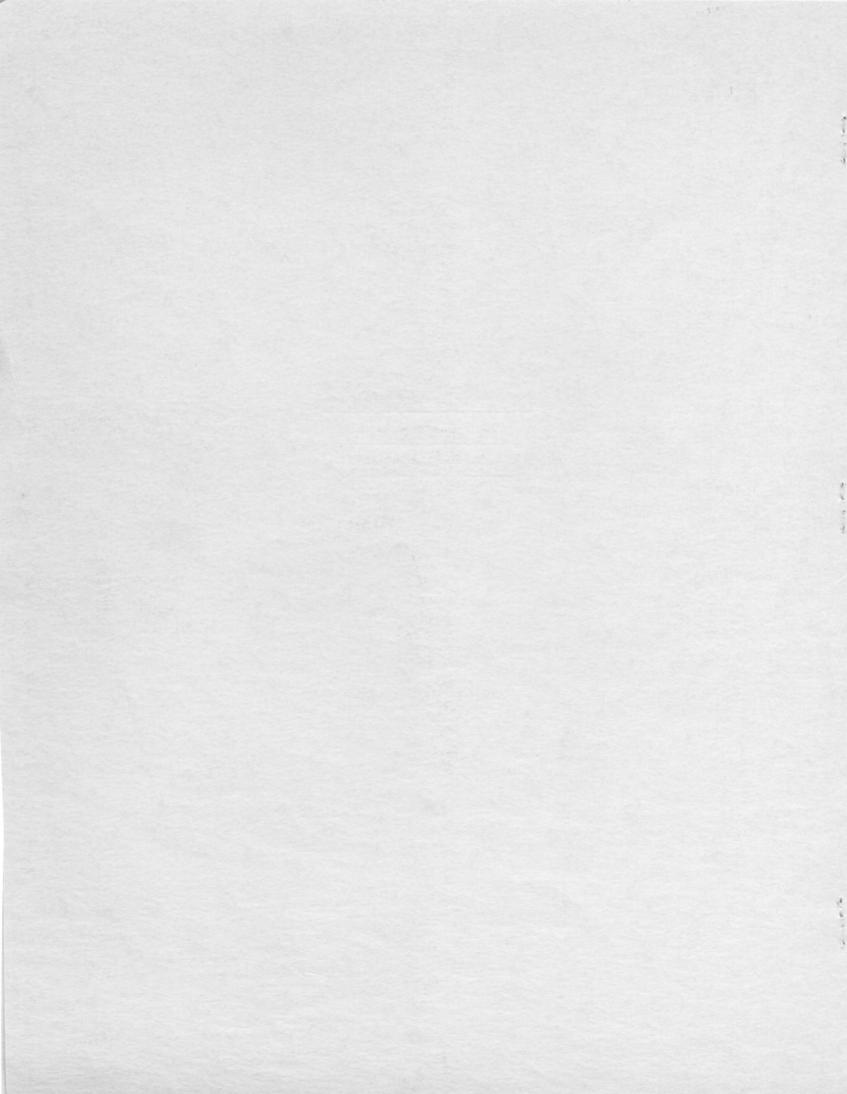
