# ART GALLERIES & MUSEUMS

Although the Minneapolis Institute of Art, the Walker Art Center, and the Minnesota Museum of Art are perhaps best known, many smaller museums across the state exhibit the works of regional, national, and international artists



DANCE

Several progressive Twin Cities area choreographers are gaining national attention with their contemporary dance pieces, while the over 20-year-old Minnesota Dance Theatre continues to present contemporary and classical dance under the direction of Loyce Houlton, well known in both Europe and America. The Northrop Dance Series has a long tradition of bringing the best dance companies in the world to its Minneapolis stage.



#### **MUSIC**

The broadcasts and recordings of the Minnesota Orchestra, St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, and A Prairie Home Companion have brought Minnesota music into the homes of many around the world. Visitors in other parts of the state can enjoy the orchestras of Austin, Brainerd, Duluth, Mankato, Moorhead, Rochester and St. Cloud.


#### THEATER

From the classics to the contemporary, summer theater to dinner theater, satire to musical, Minnesota has the ticket. Although the Guthrie Theater is best known internationally, a number of Twin Cities theaters are noted for their quality and creativity. Among them are theaters presenting new works of contemporary playwrights, experimental works, plays on black American life, those from women's perspectives, and children's theaters. In addition, an active calendar of summer and community theater provides entertainment to visitors throughout the state.



## HISTORIC SITES & MUSEUMS

Minnesota keeps its stories alive in a rich network of historic museums. The Ojibwa and Dakota Indians, the voyageur fur traders, loggers, pioneers, frontier soldiers, miners — the deep roots of Minnesota's past live on for today's visitor. Step into a dark sod hut of a pioneer or tread the elegant hallway of the mansion of a railroad magnate. Minnesota's time machine into the past is waiting.



#### **SCIENCE & NATURE**

Nature centers throughout the state help interpret Minnesota's woods and wildlife. Since Minnesota is at the crossroads of northern pine forests, the southern hardwood forests, and the prairies of the west, it offers varied landscapes to its explorers. Among the major stops for science and nature buffs are the Science Museum of Minnesota, the Minnesota Zoo, and the Paulucci Space Theatre.

#### **AMUSEMENT CENTERS**

For the young and the young of heart, Minnesota offers life in the fast lane — alpine slides, high stakes bingo, breathtaking rides at Valleyfair — and life at a slower pace, in deer parks and children's amusement centers.



#### **SPORTS**

The Metrodome in Minneapolis is home to the Vikings, the Minnesota Twins and the U of M Gophers football team, while the Met Center in Bloomington hosts the North Stars and the Strikers. New on the scene is Canterbury Downs in Shakopee, with pari-mutuel thoroughbred horse racing. Brainerd International Raceway and the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame are other favorites of sports enthusiasts.



#### **TOURS & EXCURSIONS**

Elegant mansions, underground caves, iron ore mines, a brewery, the Mayo Clinic — these are all featured on guided tours. Boat excursions are available on the Mississippi, Minnesota and St. Croix rivers, the Duluth harbor, at Voyageurs National Park, and to Isle Royale in Lake Superior.

# METROLAND

The lively cities of Minneapolis, St. Paul, Bloomington and surrounding communities east to Stillwater make up the Metroland region, which offers internationally acclaimed arts and a full range of other major attractions.

The Guthrie Theater, Minneapolis Institute of Art, Walker Art Center, Minnesota Orchestra and St. Paul Chamber Orchestra are widely recognized for their quality and creativity. But there is much more. A high concentration of innovative theaters in the Twin Cities fills the arts calendar year-round, along with several unique dance companies, a range of art galleries and music from Renaissance to contemporary jazz.

Also, check the calendars at Orchestra Hall, Ordway Music Theatre, Carlton Celebrity Room, the Met Center and the Orpheum (Twin City Theatre League).

Big hits with the young, and young at heart, are Valleyfair, the Minnesota Zoo, The Children's Theatre, and the Children's Museum, while the Science Museum of Minnesota intrigues those of all ages. Historic Fort Snelling, Murphy's Landing, and the James J. Hill House give a flavor of the area in its earlier life. Canterbury Downs and Minnesota's major league teams draw enthusiastic fans as well.



North Shore of Lake Superior

The Arrowhead region is formed by the Canadian border to the north and the North Shore of Lake Superior on the south. It stretches from Taylors Falls and the St. Croix wild and scenic river up to Voyageurs National Park.

Though it includes pristine wilderness areas, the Arrowhead also offers a rich heritage of arts and history. The Depot in Duluth is home to the Art Institute, Duluth Ballet, Duluth Playhouse, the Duluth-Superior Symphony, a historical museum and a transportation museum.





# HEARTLAND

Stretching through the heart of the state from the Lake of the Woods on our northernmost point to past the Mississippi River to the south, the region is noted for its woods and lakes. A wide assortment of attractions are waiting to lure visitors from these restful shores.

An active calendar of arts events in the Heartland includes the North Country Museum of Arts, the Heartland Symphony and St. Cloud Civic orchestras, Viking! epic drama and the Paul Bunyan Playhouse, the state's oldest professional theater.

The stories of two well-known sons of this region are told at the Lindbergh Interpretive Center and the Sinclair Lewis Interpretive Center. The history of earlier residents of the state, the Ojibwa and Dakota Indians, is presented at the Mille Lacs Indian Museum. More recent history is preserved at a range of county museums, including the Stearns County Heritage Center with a replica of a granite quarry.

The Paul Bunyan legends of the area live on for a new generation at the Paul Bunyan Amusement Center, with a talking, giant lumberjack Paul. This land of lakes and tall tales offers much entertainment as well.





Itasca State Park

Many believe that Minnesota's Scandinavian heritage came long before the pioneers settled its prairies when Viking explorers sailed to Minnesota in the 14th century. The Kensington Runestone Museum presents this theory with a stone alleged to record the arrival of the Vikings. The dreams and adventures of modernday explorers who sailed the replica Viking ship "Hjemkomst" across the Atlantic are presented, along with the ship, at the new Heritage-Hjemkomst Center in Moorhead.

This city in the rich Red River Valley is also the hub of arts events in the area, with the Plains Art Museum, and the Fargo-Moorhead Symphony, Community Theatre and Civic Opera Company. The historic Comstock House retells the story of a well known Moorhead family.

Blending arts and history is the Village of the Smoky Hills, a unique village with handcraft shops and demonstrations. Near the Village is Lake Itasca State Park, where the mighty Mississippi begins as a small stream in a tall pine woods.


