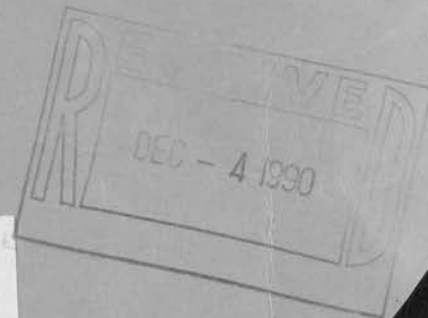
Weise finds Lowertown an exciting location.
