Monday 3rd of August 1840 Anpe-
tu waxte worked his eighth day for
which he is not yet paid 8
4th sick worked half a day $\frac{1}{2}$
5th August worked

August 7th Settled square
with Anpetu waxte gave him
a blanket coat & a Blanket

- 1 August 11th 1840 Anpetuwaite
shot black birds a rainy day
- 2 August 14th Anpetuwaite worked
we finished stacking hay
- 3 August 18 shot birds & cut corn
- 4 August 20 one third of a day sitting corn
- 5 August 21st shooting & threshing peas

July 25th 1836 Monday John got

July 18th 1837 got of Mr

Manville 91 pounds of Corn

Friday 26th went nine Miles Dr W and
his folks slept in the Tent & I and mine
in the Boat frequent Showers on the
24. 25 & 26th & 27th

Saturday 27 passed 5 Indian houses
Came 15 Miles Dr W passed on with
the Horses Mrs W. Sarah and I slept
on the Boat me and mine in the Tent
Sabbath 28 Came 14 Miles ^{slept} as the night,
before Monday 29th The Birds sang
beautifully in the Morning it sounded
just like Ohio Came 18 Miles Slept
as before Tuesday 30th foggy in the Morning
Took a Tea Kettle of hot Water in to the
Waggon body and some fresh hot corn
Bread and ate breakfast after the bread
Started of bread and butter Bacon & Tea
And about 10 or 14 O'Clock Sarah & Lydia

Journal of ^{the} ~~the~~ Fort Snelling

Left the Fort ^{Tuesday} June 23rd 1835 at

half past 3 O'Clock went 4 Miles staid

where there was 3 or 4 Indian houses

Wednesday ²⁴ went 18 Miles staid where

there was 20 Indian houses the owners

all gone and we took possession for the night

The first night all the women & children

Slept in the Waggons body on the Post Dr. W. &

myself Slept in the open air with bed & blankets

The second we all slept in an Indian house

Thursday morning 25 had to swim the

horses across the River went 18 Miles

staid where there was a traders cabin

and 2 skin wigwams Mr. W. Sonak & Oley

Friday 26 Slept on the Post me & my

family in a tent Dr. W. with the

horses about 1/2 Mile from the Post



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
