River & across beaver river

5th was writing a little in the

session Book prayer meeting

at the Drs after night John & his

wife was there they appeared

to be in great distress ^(of their child) at the loss

6th shelled and ground a basket of corn

7th Trees white with frost in the mor-

ning I shelled corn in the morning

And in the evening helped John to haul
a load of hay January 8 Sabbath
Sermon from John XV 8 1st Catika
& Na pey ne duta were among the hear-
ers the Church members all present
except Grand Mother Newell
9th Monday shelling corn Tuesday
10 Made a Maul & an ax handle &
cut a little oak to bottom a chair it
was cold & windy snow drifting
11th Cold & windy chopped wood in
the morning & in the evening
made splits & began to bottom a
chair feel sorry because you can
not get enough to eat & becau-
se I fear he does not hunger
for that bread which came
down from heaven

12th Clear & cold 12 below zero
sung with Mr. K's daughters

13th Clear & cold wind from south helped John
to haul two loads of hay from m^d K's

meadow the dakotas have been
making holes in Childrens ears

We bought two deer skins & I weighed
five pounds of Sugar for John

Jan 14th Clear cold in morning south
wind moderate in the evening.

I bottomed one chair for the Dr.
& put arms in Lydias chair John
got a sheep from Mr. K's a Colly

Jan 15th Sermon from John X & 11th

I am the good Shepherd Mrs.
& members all present Catra
Na pex na duta & To Kamicasta

were present warm day The
snow thawed a little

Jan 16th 1837 we hauled the
big hearth stones Mr. F. got his
coat that canage took & dated
the words I made a whipsto
ck a warm day

17th I was trying to learn da-
te words went with Mr. F. to J.
Ka wi castas John got a tin bucket
full of corn Jan 18 I
wrote a letter to Amz. C.

Huggins helped to catch
an otter nothing more

but make two pens for D.

19th helped to cut & haul some logs
for a sheep house & cut some trees in

the clearing a warm day ^{(the girls} sung with

20th helped John to cut fire wood in

the morning & ground meal in the ^{evening}
^{moderate}

Jan 21 Saturday cut a little
fine wood & wrote a few dakota
words wrote Mr. P's dakota hymn
for Gu^{kan}wi caxta 22 Sabbath ser-
mon from a part of the XXIV Psalm
Church members all present except
grand mother Penville Cat Lee
i a te mi na Ha pe x na Gu kan
wi caxta present It was plainly
held forth in the sermon that God has a
right to us & all our services &
that God would give us hearts to love
him more & serve him better.

Jan 23 built a sheep house helped
John to cut some fine wood & cut my ^{foot}
24 wrote a few dakota words

John got a bucket full of ^{Wednesday} a half of corn
(I was trying to learn dakota)
25th handled the pitch fork

January 26th 1837 Helped John to
haul one load of hay & one load
of poles to put on the sheep house
& then went to Mr. R. & got eight
bushels of corn
27th helped to haul one load of ^{hay}
Joseph killed a cow that had a calf
28th helped to daub the sheep
house 29th Sabbath preaching
from the Twentyfifth Psalm
30th Sung with some girls ^{also with boys}
John got corn to grind this has
been a happy day feel encouraged ^{about this} Mr. R.
31st cut fine wood helped to put
a pork barrel into the Dr. cellar
greatly distressed for the loss of a ^{thimble}
February 1st found the thimble
& got 2 sheep
I made a door for the sheep house

26th haul
27th haul
28th haul
29th haul

^(the last of Mr. K's stock)

8 Eighth hauled two loads of hay

9 Ninth hauled firewood across the river

10 Tenth hauled ^(I cut & John hauled) wood out of the clearing

11th ground meal

12th Sabbath Ser from ^(Things Through & C) I can do all
