While crossing a ravine a recruiting party of the Civil War was ambushed by the Sioux Indians, August 18, 1862 at the noon hour. The followinf were killed or mortally wounded. John Schneider, Ernest Detrich, Julius Fenske, and Adolph Steimle.

INDIAN UPRISING--- Bronze tablet mounted on the Forester Building. Erected by the Junior Pioneer Society.

This building was one of the outposts during the Indian massacre.

CHIEF SLEEPY EYE--- Bronze tablet mounted on a granite boulder near the railway station. Erected by the Sleepy Eye Milling Company and dedicated October 1902.

Ish-tak-ha-ba, Sleepy Eye, always a friend of the whites.
Died 1860.

INDIAN UPRISING--- Bronze tablet mounted on the Eibner Building. Erected by the Junior Pioneer Society.

During the Indian Massacre this building was the refuge for women and children. Powder with fuse was stored in the basement and it was intended to blow up the building should the Sioux gain possession of the town.

NEW ULM DEFENSE--- Bronze monument, 27' high on a 7' concrete base at State and Center Streets. Erected by the State of Minnesota and dedicated in 1890.

This monument is erected by the State of Minnesota to commemorate the battles and incidents of the Sioux Indian War of 1862, which particularly relate to the town of New Ulm, 1890. Honored by the memory of the citizens of the Blue Earth, Nicollet, Le Sueur and adjacent counties who so gallantly came to the rescue of the neighbors of Brown County and by their action and bravery aided the inhabitants in defeating the enemy in the two battles of New Ulm, where by the depredations of the savages were confined to the border which would otherwise have extended into the heart of the State. The Sioux Indians located at the Red Wood and Yellow Medicine Agencies on the upper waters of the Minnesota River, broke into open rebellion on the 18th day of August, 1862. They massacred nearly all the whites in and about the agencies. Under the leadership of the Chief, Little Crow, they proceeded down the river towards New Ulm and on the 19th day of August, entered the settlement of Milford, about seven miles west of New Ulm and

many of the inhabitants. On the afternoon of the 19th day of August a force of about 100 warriors attacked the town of New Ulm, killing several of the citizens and burning a number of buildings, but did not carry the barricades, which had been hastily drawn up; while the battle was in progress the advance of Captain Charles E. Flandrau's Company from Nicollet County, about fifteen strong under the command of L. M. Boardman, entered the town and the savages withdrew. The defense up to this time was in charge of Captain Jacob Nix. At nine P.M. of the 19th of August a large force consisting of Captain Flandrau's Company from Nicollet County together with a company from Le Sueur County arrived and took possession of the town. Reinforcements to the number of several hundred subsequently arrived. On the 20th Captain Flandrau was chosen Commander in Chief and the defense was strengthened. On the 23rd the Indians, six hundred and fifty strong, again attacked New Ulm at half past nine in the morning and besieged it until noon of the 24th. The assault was vigorously executed and desperately resisted. One hundred eighty buildings were destroyed in the contest, leaving of the town such part as lay within the barricades. Of the defenders, 34 were killed and sixty wounded. Reinforcements arrived at the noon of the 24th, under Captain Cox of ~~the~~ St. Peter. On the 25th the town was ~~evacuated~~ evacuated and the inhabitants all safely conveyed to Mankato.

This was the first regiment tendered to President Lincoln at the outbreak of the Civil War; and it served three years in the Army of the Potomac, during which time it engaged in the following battles and operations: Bull Run, Ball's Bluff, Siege of Yorktown, Constitution of Grapevine Bridge across the Chickohominy River (over which McClellan moved reinforcements to support his left wing at Fair Oaks), Fair Oaks, Peach Orchard, Savage Station, White Oak Swamp, Glendale, Malvern Hill, Flint Hill, Vienna, South Mountain, Antietam, Fredericksburg, Chancellorsville, Hay Market, Gettysburg, Bristow Station, and Mine Run. At Gettysburg, the loss of the regiment on July 2nd, 1863, in it charge against the Confederate Brigade of General Braxsdale and General Wilcox, was 82 per cent of the

men engaged. General Hancock says: "I ordered those men to charge because I saw that I must gain five minutes' time. Reinforcements were coming on the run, but I knew that before they could reach the threatened point the Confederates, unless checked, would seize the position. The charge was necessary. I was glad to find such a gallant body of men at hand willing to make the terrible sacrifice." The regiment was successfully commanded by Colonel Willis A. Gorman, Colonel Napoleon, J. T. Dana, Colonel Alfred Sully, Colonel George N. Morgan, and Colonel Colvill, of whom the first three, through the valor of the regiment, were made brigadier generals during the service, and the last two were breveted brigadier generals at the close of the war. Again on July 3rd, 1863, the regiment sustained a further loss of 15 percent of the men engaged in resisting General Pickett's charge of 15,000 men against the left center of the Union line.

The enemy patrols decended through a hole in the clouds and had surrounded Lieutenant Wolds ship. In spite of the overwhelming odds, Lieutenant Wold, through exceptionsl coolness and accurate firing, succeeded in eluding the enemy, shooting one down out of control althou the enemy remained in the immediate vicinity, he recrossed the lines three times more, being, being driven out each time. Due to the courage and

tenacity of Lieutenant Wold, the Mission was finally completed and information of the greatest value obtained. Lieutenant Wold was killed in action August 1, 1918, while on a photographic mission. He was driven out several times by hostile patrols. On his fourth attempt he was attacked by five enemy planes and although wounded twice by machine gun bullets, he recrossed the lines, but his controls had been shot away, and the plane fell in a vrille.
